

# The Silsden Survey 2012 Report of Residents' Survey Findings

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#### 1. Introduction

This survey was undertaken by Silsden Town Council to evaluate residents' views, concerns and ideas for making the town a better place in order to inform the development of a town plan for the future and Bradford Council's District Development Plan. A copy of the questionnaire is in Appendix A,

Questionnaires were delivered to households in January and the introduction informed potential respondents that we preferred them to complete an online version. Completed paper questionnaires could be posted into boxes at the local library, co-op and Post Office. The closing date for completed questionnaires was 30 April 2012.

#### **Statistical Reliability**

A sample of 1,102 residents participated in this survey out of an estimated Silsden 16+ population of 6,749 and when the findings are used to predict the results for the entire population these are subject to sampling tolerances.

The respondents to the questionnaire are only samples of the total "population", so we cannot be certain that the figures obtained are exactly those we would have if everybody had participated (the "true" values). We can, however, calculate the variation between the sample results and the "true" values by using the size of the samples on which the results are based and the number of times that a particular answer is given. The confidence with which we can make this prediction is usually chosen to be 95% - that is, the chances are 95 in 100 that the "true" value will fall within a specified range. The table below illustrates the predicted ranges for different percentage results at the "95% confidence interval" for a sample of 1,102 out of a population of 6,749.



For example, if the survey finding is that 70% of respondents are satisfied with something we can be 95% confident that between 87.5% and 92.5% of the entire population are satisfied.


#### 2. Responses

A total of 1,102 completed questionnaires was received comprising 428 online submissions and 674 hard copy returns.

#### 2.1. Respondent profile



Silsden's population is estimated to comprise 52% females and there is a female bias amongst respondents at 58%. There is also a bias toward older respondents as only 3% are under the age of 25 compared to 12% for the Silsden population, and 40% of respondents are over 64 compared to 25% of the population. The survey data have been weighted to adjust for this age / gender bias.




Slightly fewer than half of respondents are working full or part time and a similar proportion are retired. Just over 4 out of 10 respondents have lived in Silsden for more than 25 years.

#### **Priorities for Silsden**




Issues that residents consider should have the highest priority are crime and antisocial behaviour and clean streets and open spaces, with more than 9 out of 10 respondents considering these should be a very high or a fairly high priority. Closely following are traffic congestion and employment opportunities. Education and training, activities for young people, public transport and places for children to play are also key priorities.

# **Currently most needs improving**



Nearly half of respondents consider clean streets and open spaces and traffic congestion to be the issues most in need of improvement. Just over one third consider crime and antisocial behaviour, and three out of ten consider activities for young people to be most in need of improvement.



#### 4.1. Police coverage


Satisfaction with police coverage in Silsden



Four out of ten respondents are very or fairly satisfied with police coverage in Silsden and three out of ten are dissatisfied with one in ten very dissatisfied.

#### Levels of concern in Silsden




Dog fouling is by far the greatest concern of respondents with almost nine out of ten very or fairly concerned, including two out of three who are very concerned. One in three respondents are very concerned about under age drinking and drug misuse, closely followed by house burglary, vandalism, drunkenness and groups of teenagers on the streets.

#### How agreeable to encouraging different types of business












The vast majority of respondents consider that it is important to maintain all of the items they were asked about.

Slightly more than eight out of ten respondents are in favour of an employed litter warden / sweeper and one in two are in favour of providing more litter bins. More than four in ten are favourable toward regular spring clean days.





**Uses public transport** 




Two thirds of respondents use public transport.

Of those using public transport, the majority (83%) use it for leisure purposes. The overall proportion of respondents using public transport for travel to and from work is 19% (62% x 30%).

Times public transport used or needed




#### 7.2. Increasing the use of public transport

Safer pedestrian access and more parking facilities at the railway station, and a regular bus service to Skipton are the possibilities most likely to encourage those not currently using public transport to do so.

#### Likelihood this would cause users to use more



Those currently using public transport are most likely to make greater use of it if the Skipton bus service regularly went via Silsden, there was better coordination between bus and train times, and there was safer pedestrian access and more parking at the railway station.



#### 8.1. Numbers built in last 10 years


Number of new homes in Silsden in last 10 years

#### 8.2. Types built in last 10 years


Types of new homes in Silsden in last 10 years



Almost one half of respondents (46%) consider there was a good mix of types of new homes. Eighteen percent thought that the new housing was too expensive.


#### 8.3. Future housing development

Semi-detached homes is the most popular category for future development.





'Insufficient signs' is the greatest problem, selected by 7 out of 10 of those experiencing a problem of some description. One third mention unsafe or blocked stiles. Only 12% of problems have been reported to Bradford Council.



#### Agree with action to increase tourism





- The majority of Silsden secondary schoolchildren attend South Craven Comprehensive School thereby generating a great deal of traffic during the rush hours. - 338 pedestrain crossing on bypass to access railway
- 342 Dog Fouling
- 344 Keeping the 'village' feel to the town. Minimising large scale housing and commercial developments on green belt land.
- 347 anti-social behavour
- 349 Prosecution for dog fouling! Restriction of heavy goods/ very large vehicles cutting through Silden.
- 356 Fix roads and pavements
- To ensure that dog walkers pick up their dog mess, as around many of the streets in Silsden, there is dog mess and people do pick it up in plastic bags, but then dump then on the pavements around Silsden, it is disgraceful.

- 423 Refurbishment of Silsden health centre. keeping Fire Station open A safe place to cross over the bypass between Silsden and Steeton, currently very dangerous and a no go for parents with small children and prams!!!!
- Dog mess on the pavement is a blight on Silsden, and more needs to be done to prevent it
- 429 New school pre 11 years.
- 430 Badly need an accessible community centre.
- 433 More visible police.
- 435 Asking householders to cut back hedges/bushes that overhang pedestrian areas and pavements safety issue.
- 438 Get all the cars off the road. There is a place already for facilities for parking.

- 498 A serious lack of shopping facilities in Silsden. Too many hairdressers, takeaway outlets and not enough banking.
- 503 Police station and local policeman.
- 506 Buses to link with trains.
- 508 More variety of shops and far fewer fast food outlets.
- 514 Police station in village and fire station.
- 524 Keeping the pavements clear of dog waste.
- 529 Sort out the parking and the resultant congestion by the Post Office.
- 536 Dog direct people not picking it up.
- 548 Too much dog fouling.
- 554 Traffic lights at Clog Bridge/Elliott St. Footbridge over road at station.
- 555 Street lighting could be massively improved around the Tufton St/Hothfield Street area.

- 745 Silsden is a high transient rental place this should be maintained and long term rental encouraged thus creating a sense of community. Landlords should be responsible and made to keep their properties in good order also couldn't care less tenants be monitored.
- 746 No.
- 147 Look at Silsden as a whole not picking bits out which are vote winners. Silsden has great potential-commuter area. Take a look at the overall picture. The opportunity that was missed when the new Methodist church was planned and the police house think of the overall opportunities that were missed. flower beds could be decretive with shrubs less expensive.
- 750 Traffic calming measures in Skipton Road as cars regularly speed up and down at early morning and evening (tea time).
- 751 Dog waste bins on marked walkways and in the town.
- 752 Having more police presence in Silsden.
- 754 Providing more allotments.
- 756 Because of the amount of people who do not clear up after their dogs we should have a 24 hour dog warden who fines people on the spot. This comes from a dog owner who picks up and is sick and tired of those who do not. Also dog bins please.
- Yes, the provision of allotments. I have an allotment but am aware I am one of the lucky few. There should be additional allotments made available to help reduce the large waiting list. Our villages e.g. Addingham have done this. It's a way of looking after Silsden residents.

- The biggest base of contention not only for me but for many pedestrians is how to control dog owners, dogs from fouling on pavements pavements always littered with piles of even worse excrement in a number of smaller heaps across the pavements. - 819 Repairing the road surfaces. Gritting of dangerous roads. Provision of grit in the grit bins. Re-vamp derelict land on the approach to Silsden. Protection of surrounding green belt land.
- 331 Just had a large pot of pennies taken from front of house this week.
- 832 Traffic speeds and control on main road and Elliott Street.
- 834 Tidying up entrance to Silsden e.g. Keighley Road looks a mess with waste land and demolished site.
- 835 Policina.
- 836 Condition of some road surfaces.
- 838 No parking on main street. 20 mph in centre of town.
- Parking needs to be banned along Kirkgate. Allow free flow of traffic. No parking on pavements which is a dangerous problem now. Pavements are for walkers and not card. Plenty of car parks in Silsden. Dog dirt is also.

- Planning issues buildings and recreational. Improvement of canal towpath as a recreational facility. Motorcycle trials riding provision of ground off Lightbank Lane and Holden Lane not suppression as exhibited by Bradford Council. Improvement of the watercourses which flow through the town. They should be an asset not an embarrassment.
- 848 Swimming pool and gym would be nice like Keighley, Bingley, Shipley and Bradford.
- 849 Restrict HGV in Silsden main street should use Skipton bypass.
- 850 Cleaning up the park which is a disgrace. Silsden park should look to Sutton and Glusburn which are clean, tidy, have excellent facilities and attract families.

- All the above are high priority they are the things that keep society getting together.

- 892 Too many takeaways with bright signage, makes Silsden look tacky and also too may hairdressers.
- 896 Make the car parks larger, don't charge for parking, so people who live near the town centre can actually park outside their homes.
- 897 Residential parking on Aire View is a huge problem.
- 900 Improving shop front signage where cheap, badly designed and poorly manufactured signage ahs a dramatically negative visual effect on the area and puts off local shoppers and tourists alike.
- 902 Keeping pavements clean from dog poo. Owner's responsibility, but it's a particular problem in parts of Silsden. Could resident report particular bad roads. Extra dog poo bins on canal e.g. by bridge, Inn Bridge and by first canal bridge towards Riddlesden.
- 909 Dong bins, people still let their dogs dirt and don't pick it up which is very unpleasant. Most responsible owners use a plastic bag but there is a minority of people who leave the bag on the ground.
- 913 More dog waste bins which are emptied on a regular basis.
- 926 No parking on Main Street except blue badge holders. 3 tonne weight limit though Silsden, except for access.

- 931 Parking by the duck pond stops the flow of traffic. Able-bodied people should use other parking areas. A few parking bays by the duck pond for the disabled. Heavy goods vehicles should be banned going though the village. Access only for deliveries.
- 933 Stop parking in middle of Silsden.

Also a better car park for the train.
- 998 Improvements for elderly and disabled access/and improvements/repair of roads/lanes/paths deemed to be un-adopted. Out of date and passing the problem thinking.
- 999 Decent public toilets with baby changing facilities.
- 1002 Provision of dog waste bins. Preservation of green spaces.
- 1005 Keeping streets around Silsden from people with Dogs fouling. It is getting really bad should be cameras put up now and again to catch these people with there dogs.
- 1006 Good access to health care. Health centre, Airedale Hospital. More dental facilities.
- 1017 Being a resident of St Johns Close, the back of my property leads on to Mitchells Lane, a deplorable state of humps, craters, patched macadam here and there. No sense at all in the way maintenance has been carried out, the elderly people who frequent this lane to walk with safety find it very daunting, it doesn't give residents any encouragement to use the lane.
- 1019 Highest priority keeping the library opening hours.
- 1027 Toilets in park.
- 1028 Public swimming baths.
- 1036 Big vans parking bottom of Tifton Street in New Road and dustmen cannot get up to empty bins. YL03 YLX Fiat.
- 1042 Bin for dog poo at Craven Drive snicket. Dog dirt picked up, put in a bad then left on the road.
- 1060 A proper policeman living in the town with overall say how the town is policed.
- 1061 Regular road resurfacing including non-adopted roads e.g. Spencer Ave. Parts of this road are accidents waiting to happen with cracked depressions anything up to 6' deep in parts. Wouldn't cost a fortune to resurface with Tarmac where required instead of having opposing traffic negotiating a slalom route to avoid these holes.
- Silsden shops in general need a facelift. A general tidy up of cans, food trays etc organised by schools would improve the appearance in general. Very important clamp down (police presence) on disturbant screams, shouts, music late at night up until 2am.
- 1073 Anything that keeps people safe.

- 440 Footpath on Jackson's land which gets muddy, we thin it is Bradford Council maintained but not very well. Also the dog bags which are thrown under hedge.
- 441 Keep beck clear of rubbish, the weir clear of plant growth and clear of stones.
- 449 Pavements.
- 456 A 'wow' feature, such as a public square with fountain would be good.
- 460 Canal towpath. Derelict brown field sites. Sykes Lane area is poor. A cycle route along canal towpath... More needs to be made of the canal. It's Silsden's major asset and the muddy towpath is a big turn off. Maintain the public toilets in good order. Seating... facing the beck and along the towpath. More performances at the bandstand.
- 462 Crossing on Bolton Road to get to the park.
- 465 No
- The becks need to be litter free. The duck pond has rats living near the litter bins. There needs to be more public allotments made available.
- 467 Anything that makes the town more appealing and attractive.
- 470 Improving the canal towpath to improve surface. E.g. Silsden to Kildwick is very uneven/muddy also improve access for less able people.
- To keep existing green belt land as I feel Silsden is already over developed. Build new houses on brown belt land. So important to keep open spaces for people to breathe and enjoy. There are lots of brown belt spaces to build on in lots of areas.
- 492 Street lighting.
- I've get to see anyone using the bandstand. Is anything planed for this? Have any bands been booked? Has anyone been encouraged to use it?

- To attract and encourage tourism to the area the skip yard should be closed down and relocated. The tourist and public footpath running parallel with the yard is a disgrace. Contaminated by overspills waste and constantly blocked by a skip containing contaminated domestic waste.
- 596 Some hedges in Woodside Road area although well maintained grow too fat and protrude over the pavement. Would be difficult to walk with pushchair and child or children in hand as well.
- 597 Keeping Silsden litter free.
- 606 Who is going to pay no rise in rate precept.

- We have lovely countryside and two massive assets in the canal and river which we tend to ignore in the main but could be used to attract visitors.

- 741 Road; pothole need urgently repairing, in autumn leaved need cleaning up. Drains; never seem to be cleared.
- The beck needs cleaning out badly. I have seen rats in there which usually means disease which cannot be good for the wildlife.
- 744 Could the town council enter us for Silsden in Bloom. It would mobilise the community to take a pride and hopefully engage young people too. Dog access to the play area for small children should be very controlled.
- That developers of properties whose construction vehicles damage surrounding areas/roads are made to pay for repair. That huge farming contractors are monitored for impact on safety of pedestrians and damage and impact on environment due to heavy vehicles. That he people who use the huge chain saws on the hedgerows instead of maintaining them properly are prosecuted.
- 746 Keeping the streets free of litter especially takeaway cartons and beer cans.
- 747 Management of flower beds as cost effective and attractive as possible. Drive for the children to be more aware of litter etc. See a bin and pick it up in schools and youth groups etc. encourage respect for all from the earliest possible time. Respect and discipline please. children need to be guided into nature and value of environment. Bird watchers, walkers and looking at nature. I am disabled but would love to form groups for our young ones.
- 748 These are important as I try to walk as much as possible and sometimes take my grandchildren.
- The play areas in Silsden park. Silsden youth council helped to raise over £200,000 for activities in the park and other youth activities in Silsden, therefore it is only right and proper that Bradford Council look after these assets, as they do in Addingham and Ilkley.
- 750 Stop children/boys riding bikes on/over flower beds especially Bridge Street and main car park. A small metal fence would stop this.
- 752 Silsden cemetery is a sad and neglected area, receiving very little maintenance, and is in need of regular TLC.
- 753 Millennium walk circuit.
- We need more allotments. More play areas for children, not everyone lives near the park.
- 755 Retaining greenbelt.

- The environment of the duck pond in the middle of the village should be relandscaped to maximise the use of the adjacent public land as attractive sitting areas realign the stone walls to open up the setting. It's a marvellous asset to the village which needs some rethinking to make it the highlight of Silsden.
- 758 Need more litter bins and dog poo bins.
- 762 Sewing wild flower fields. Anything to attract birds and insects.
- 767 Maintenance of footpaths.
- 769 Prevention (and if possible, prosecution) of those who dump rubbish, including car tyres, on the verges of our lanes and anywhere else.
- Yes appreciate farmers please mills are dead and buried without food we would all be dead, half world still starving so appreciate religion too.
- 773 Keeping the Main Street clean and all surrounding streets in Silsden.
- 774 Its very important that as adults we are good role models for our children. How we look after maintain our area, learn by example.

- 790 The town hall looks grubby and uninspiring what about a clean up and good paint job. It should be a focal point on the high street. The beck on the junction of Bradley Road and Skipton Road is a mess it doesn't look as though it is ever cleaned up.
- 793 Dog fouling and chewing gum on streets.
- 798 The lane between the beck and bottom of Craven Drive badly needs retarmacing very dangerous especially for elderly people who are bad at walking.

- 900 I think it is very important to tidy up areas that have fallen into disrepair and offer support and encouragement to businesses that don't seem to understand the importance of maintaining a presentable frontage to their property.

- 927 The Beck, because the major Beck at the post office is such a unique and picturesque feather of our town, why is Silsden not better maintained? Especially when the green vegetation completely overpowers and diminishes the beauty of the Beck. Surely someone can be employed to maintain the site and the rest of the Becks flow area, which is seriously neglected. Another example of neglect is an orange cone which has been in the post office Beck area for a couple of months.
- 935 This topic is my number one priority. Creating a superb environment will attract visitors/small firms etc.
- 936 The flower displays have look impressive and the Christmas lights have been a great improvement it would be good to have some hanging baskets along the main roads and maybe trees would also add something to the town at appropriate points e.g. by the Briggate.
- 949 A police presence would sort out a lot of the problems and worries that people have got, as in other areas, it is as if they have opted out of society and all gone away.

- 998 Most people want to live in a clean environment. Litter, dog mess and chewing gum on paths outside Co-op and main street.
- 999 Public toilet in library, as lots of kids use it.
- 1002 Preservation of green field sites by using brown field sites first wherever possible.
- 1003 Listed buildings. Why is there derelict properties in Silsden?
- 1026 What about the drains?
- 1038 Improving and maintaining the condition of the roads.
- I have waited 2 years for my fence putting up and a gate. The Blind have put me a rail up. I am 9- years old reg blind, people are using my path as a right of way, with living on a corner people cut right across.
- 1057 Potholes in roads.
- 1060 Turn on seat round to face the beck.
- The flushing of leaf/debris congested gullies along our major/minor roads in Silsden. Often, re-asphalting of some streets and roads leads to surplus asphalt (through negligence by labour teams) falling into the water gullies and blocking them to rain water. These need cleaning out regularly and doesn't seem to get done anymore.
- 1068 Dog fouling.

- 1077 The canal towpath from Keighley Golf Club through Silsden is a mud bath in winter, churned up by cyclists. I would like to see this brought up to the standard of the towpath between Keighley Golf Club and Leeds.

- 225 If relevant in this section: dog fouling on Bradley Road
- 229 St.Johns St.
- 230 The approach to Silsden on the Keighley road. The tacky ugle shabby painted balls make you feel you are approaching a dump.
- 231 Litter Bins on Elliot Street
- 232 beck areas, by the canal towpath

- rocks and ramps skatreboard park, silsden beck at the bottom of the park all down to the bridge on Howden Road, the main street where the takeaways are.
- 236 The centre littred with general rubbish and the snickets littered with alcohol and pop bottles
- 241 the beck, the canal
- 242 Belton road
- 247 Woodside road and NO bins for dog mess hence it is all over the streets
- 249 Park and Memorial gardens
- around the corner from the co-op under the bushes on spencer avenue also i think the club is involved with the litter
- 251 The beck, the park, under the canal in Hainsworth Road.
- 252 Snicket by playing fields
- 253 Top of Howden Road, public foot path leading across Farmers fields down to Brunthwaite Bridge Lane
- No particular area. Just here and there makes place look tatty. Need to encourage people to be more mindful and appreciate their surroundings. Maybe start encouraging kids at school to be more aware.
- 255 The Park. The steps between Bolton Road and Stirling Street. The bottom of North Street.
- 260 everywhere!!
- 262 New Road, Hothfield Street
- 264 the park
- 266 The footpaths are littered with dog dirt.
- 267 high street and around the beck under the cancel bridge
- 269 the beck and the canal bank
- 271 Top of skipton road before turning onto woodside
- 272 dog poo down southview terrace, more fines, patrolling
- 277 near to both schools
- 279 Around the co-op, general untidyness of town center
- approach to silsden from by pass, beck with rubbish. dog dirt and rubbish in park
- 283 Silsden is reasonable clean
- 285 Canal towpath sometimes, alleyway from bottom of park to Craven Avenue/Drive, beckside through Silsden and all the way down to the Aire Valley Road.
- 286 Takeaways
- 287 canal bank dog poo!
- 288 Hainsworth Road, Brunthwaite Bridge Lane Brownbank Lane Canal Paths (sometimes) Around Town Beck (sometimes) Silsden Brow/wood above Spencer Ave last summer we reported the total devastation of this wood by youths drinking & partying. It is unbelievable-hundreds of smashed beer bottles, coke cans, pop bottles, plastic bags etc, many in the stream to flow in to our rivers & seas. - 296 In the hedgerows. If these things were looked at in aregular way the extras would not be necessary. Get the young ones motivated with a clean up and then a disco new friends would be made and new values learned look at things as a WHOLE.
- 299 Park and country roads especially dog poo. Bus stops.
- 306 Silsden Beck Recreation field
- Paths leading to the park, the beck at the bottom of the park, the park and around and in the duck pond
- 312 in the park in the morning in summer after the teenagers have spent the evening before drinking and eating takeaways and leaving their rubbish
- 315 There needs to be more dog poo bins
- 319 The litter warden should also have the facilities to clear up dog fouling and to be able to report inconsiderate dog ownres. Regular spring cleaning days need to be very well publised.

- I have placed a 'tick' in more frequent road sweeping because of the disgusting amount of dog fouling which seems to continue unchecked.
- 332 The park
- 333 Dog fouling in many areas of Silsden is totally unacceptable. Are any culprits ever fined?
- 335 Around the centre post office bridge and beck and around the takeaways
- 337 park and churchyard
- 339 Generally in the quieter areas such as the snickets and the canal
- 340 the old factory by silsden afc club
- 342 Area round the Coop and Skipton Road
- 344 Takeaways
- 345 PARK It is a great shame that we have a lovely childrens play area in the park where significant money has been spent in recent years to improve it, yet it is spoilt by the large amount of litter that always seems to be around the park. Pity that the beck also attracts a lot of dumped litter. DOG POO Seems to be a problem everywhere is Silsden and really does spoil the look of Silsden as well as being an annoyance, and health hazard for my children. An employed litter warden who could issue fines for littering & dog fouling would surely pay for itself in the money generated from the fines.

- 392 The beck close to the Skate Board park is always full of litter whihe is a pity as this is one of the main entrances to the park.
- 393 The park and centre of town beck
- 397 dog fouling on tufton street and new road is a problem
- 398 Beck
- 400 sk
- 401 throughout the town. The extra bins do not solve the problem of lazy people who do not use them: prosecute offenders
- 402 both car parks Silsden
- 403 bradley road green
- 410 Aire view, Elliott Street, Park, Beck
- The river there is always rubbish going down the slope and towards the park in the river.
- 413 Outside takeaways and pubs.

- 414 Litter bits in the right place. There is not a litter bin at the top of Mitchel Lane but this is an entrance to the park and the absence of a bin is a major cause of dog bag rubbish in this area
- 415 the back of some units that look onto to the beck
- 417 Canal banks dog poo bags, dog walkers need fining.
- 418 Main road as this is 'front door' to the town
- dont think theres litter problem at all in silsden waste of money paying someone to clean up after us. more bins maybe billboard with sign from children in local schools advertising keep our village clean n tidy place them at bus stop shelters it encourages our young to look aft our home we can also advertise the dog fouling this way.
- 423 The Becks and DOG FOULING, especially in the park where children play.
- The park, especially the area by the swings, is often covered in litter and unsafe for young children
- 427 Around parts of the park and on some streets
- The park at the top by the rugby pitch always has litter amongst the trees. The beck next to the skateboard park is always full of litter. Another thing to say is it angers me when i walk my dogs and see people not picking up their own dogs mess or throwing the bags in the hedgerows. I think there should be people occasionally patroling to name & shame them and also submit fines. I don't think its fair for children playing in the park or people picnicing. - 442 No particular place, but while most dogs owners act responsibly there is still a problem of dog dirt on may pavements.
- 443 Dog litter bins would be very useful for dog owners.
- 444 Ginnel leading from bend in Craven Drive to the main street.
- 445 Dog fouling, snicket from Bradley Road to Hillcrest back road.
- 446 The beck by the Post Office take away rubbish boxes etc.
- 447 The beck and the recycling centre.
- 449 Outside of the public houses and clubs. Drinking alcohol outside the above.
- 452 Along canal pathway. Canal underpass Hainsworth Road dog fouling. Silsden Park skate park and river.
- 456 The beck and under the canal in Hainsworth Road and in the park.

- 460 The becks. The park. Hainsworth Road... The countryside stretch. Elliott Street.
- 462 The becks, near park.
- 465 Everywhere.
- 466 Problems with litter as above the duck pond and rats, the becks not only in park area but also by/under Clog bridge particularly behind some of the restaurants.
- 467 Hainsworth Road. Dog waste bags hanging from many trees.
- 468 The beck in Silsden.
- 471 On dog routes.
- 472 Most areas where there are dog walkers/footpaths, more bins would reduce unnecessary 'bagged parcels' left and encourage less responsible dog walkers to clean up after their dogs.
- 473 The park.
- 474 Howden Road, dog fouling.
- 480 Robin Lane made mile, lots of can, cartons, bottles.
- 483 Control dog fouling.
- 488 Howden Road. Park.
- 489 Mitchell Lane, park, memorial gardens at times.
- 490 Bottom of playing fields and by beck.
- 491 Everywhere.
- 493 Country lanes as stated previous Brownbank bottom. House owners try to keep up to their perimeters. Cringles gets bottles broken. People don't sweep outside their own houses anymore probably due to cars parked on roads. Memorial gardens takeaway empties.
- 494 Mainly near shops including Aireview Stores and canal. Dog mess in general around Aireview, Hothfield Street and surrounding roads and along canal in both directions.
- Hedgerows and roadside verges. The park. Takeaway food and packages on pavements.
- 497 Becks to be kept free of dumping, river boards to be asked to do beck bed maintenance i.e. the weir at the duck pond and supporting walks.

- The park is full of litter and dog fouling. There is more than enough litter bins, it is just lazy people and kids who can't be bothered to use them. Too much dog fouling on the pavements on Ingsway, people again can't be bothered to pick it up.
- 536 Town centre, main street. The beck. Park.

- 552 Still trouble with dog mess on canal and other areas. Though not as bad as it used to be.
- 554 Kirkgate gardens. Footpaths dog dirt.

- 556 Dog poo on the streets. I will gladly volunteer to police dog walkers.
- 560 Bin men often leave waste vegetation on roads after collections are made. This is not a serious problem, however, it can be unsightly.
- 561 The passage between two houses in Craven Drive Silsden.
- 562 Park.

- Public footpaths between Middleway and Drabble House Farm is a problem areas as sign to say clean up after your dog but no bin provided, so unfortunately some people pick up their dog poo in plastic bags and stuff it in dry stone wall.

Litter is a big problem countrywide, not just in Silsden, and as it stems from a general apathy from, it seems, all ages is going to be hard to stop happening, therefore it needs more funding to clear as much up as possible. Silsden problem areas seem to be rubbish in the becks/rivers/canals and most of all the dog waste topic. Definitely need more bins to be placed at intervals along the canal. - 701 A dog patrol person on canal and streets to actually prosecute dog fouling culprits. Signs are not enough if people heard that people were actually being prosecuted it would I think be more of a deterrent.
- 702 Park. Side streets, beck, skateboard area.
- 703 Round library in memorial gardens.
- 704 Side streets around town centre. Ings Way, Waterside full of dog foul.
- 706 Nicholson's Place is very bad for rubbish and weeds.

- 717 Normally around the park. Many people who cant be bothered to find a bin throw it on the floor. Over time this litter builds up.

- 740 The park.
- 741 Silsden park particularly the skateboard area, this is a disgraceful mess. The beck is also littered with refuse around the park area and the post office and duck pond area. No surprise we have a problem with rats in these areas.
- There is a general litter problem but the memorial gardens, the beck are two areas of concern. We could use more dog poo bins. Silsden hasn't been as clean as it was when we had a regular street sweeper person.
- 743 Station.
- 744 Wesley place car park. Nab car parks.
- All the streets throughout Silsden are in decline. The new bandstand is becoming a magnet for the youth of Silsden to gather and leave their litter and dog mess, and more recently the houses backing on to the canal now throw their garden rubbish over the walls including large conifers between Clog Bridge and the first turn off by the old weigh house.

- 749 Rocks and ramps (skate/bike park). Silsden beck near rocks and ramps. Outside most takeaways.
- 750 The Yorkshire water building at the top of Skipton Road is used to dump bags of dog muck. There must be over 50 bags left there. More dog fouling signs attached to lam posts.
- 751 Problem with dog fouling especially along Ings Way shocking amounts every day all along pavements where I walk.

- 752 The park, especially around the skateboarding area. The Beck. Brown Bank Lane.
- 753 Skipton is difficult to get to by bus as service is limited.
- 754 The park.
- 755 Surrounding are, the recycling area. Canal towpath in Wesley Place.
- Not the bins, they are not the problem but we should have litter wardens 24 hours to give out fines £50 on the spot.
- 757 The beck. Where it flows through the village it should be regularly kept clean.
- 758 Hainsworth Road, Belton Road, Howden Road, Ings Way, Kirkgate, near Co-op, near library, park.
- 759 Elliott Street. Ings Way. Near Co-op. Fouling all over Silsden especially Elliott Street.
- 760 Dog dirt bins.
- 761 The beck behind businesses on the high street.
- 762 Football field.
- 763 Canal.
- 764 Centre of Silsden along many streets/roads leading from this area especially on nights when the younger generation are enjoying themselves.
- 765 The beck, church yard, park and some streets. The duck pond on beck is full of rubbish and seating area next to it full of broken glass.
- 766 Three is some litter in St Johns Street Kirkgate and the canal but the worst problem is dog fouling almost everywhere.
- 767 Belton Road especially at the junction with Keighley Road.
- The small cleaning vehicle comes round but he doesn't come round our area only just a yard or to of Ings Road. I overlook this area so I see he doesn't come into it. When I go to the health centre the litter on Elliott Street is awful, I take it it's the teenagers who are guilty its disgusting.
- 769 Outside takeaways and pubs including the Co-op.
- 770 All over as it comes down beck and river and floods my land.
- 771 Hainsworth Road, Belton Road.
- 772 Canal towpaths litter and dog muck bags. Recreation area the area around the bike ramps. The town centre area.
- 773 Park area, snicket down to beck.
- All of Silsden has a litter problem it is getting worse especially since John McNulty stopped cleaning the streets. I would do a part time job if paid to help keep our streets cleaner (part time). We also need more litter bins, especially Skipton Road area and do what North Yorks do supply poo bins. That surely would help the poo situation.
- 775 Wherever there is water. Also problem with dog bags being left, particularly Hainsworth Road. Several farms, including Drabble House, are dirty and untidy and an absolute eyesore.
- 776 Dog fouling Howden Road, Ings Way.
- 777 The beck near the skate park.
- 778 The back. The river. The park.
- Dog fouling on Bradley Road, Foster avenue and approaches to the green. Dog owners not removing faeces from the green. Takeaway cartons, bottles, cans, cigarettes butts, and wrappers from all streets. Rubbish thrown out of cars up Bradley Road towards the moor. I once picked up 30 empty cans.

- 781 Main street after weekend.
- 782 The modern problem of chewing gum dropped on the ground pervades the whole village.
- Footpath behind the pumping station Skipton Road. A litter bin is needed top priority and a clean up operation as it is now a health hazard.
- 786 I've noticed problems all over Silsden.
- 787 In general a lot of areas in Silsden look scruffy, dog mess is an unacceptable problem with ignorant dog owners leaving bags in trees.
- 788 Passage/footpath between Skipton Road and park green.
- Around the bus shelters. In the park. Outside one or two pubs and takeaways sometimes. Generally it is not a huge problem but those who drink outside from cans or bottle are the main culprits.
- 791 Recycling area (Wesley Place).
- 793 The beck under the bridge going into the park.
- 796 Outside pubs on main street.
- 798 The park named above get very untidy.
- 799 Belton Road. Silsden park. Keighley Road near football academy and roundabout.
- 800 Down by the back behind recycling centre. Near takeaways at front with pizza boxes etc.
- 803 All the side streets.
- 804 Around the Co-op with bottles, sandwich containers, sweet wrappers.
- 805 By the beck/park.
- 806 The park.
- 807 Main street. Aire View. Elliott Street.
- 809 More dog fouling problems that litter. On most of streets off main road.
- 813 Co-op and the beck/river through the middle of the town. Back streets I ask the question why do we spoil our own aspects and leisure facilities.
- 814 Park, back of library, MUGA Elliott Street.
- 815 Howden Road.
- 818 Bandstand area.
- 819 Most areas where yobs throw their takeaway wrappers/cartons out of car windows.
- The culvert under the canal at Hainsworth Road. Teenagers hang around and drop litter including glass/broken glass bottles. Also some lazy dog owners use the culvert as a dog toilet and don't pick up even though a bin has recently been provided close by.
- 822 New Road dog fouling.
- 823 Neighbours dumping rubbish in others gardens and allowing dogs to foul.
- 826 The Silsden moor roads. Bolton Road as far as Cringles.
- The only problem area we have found is the fault of certain dog owners allowing their pets to litter the pavements. How you re-educate these selfish owners is an enormous task and we couldn't suggest how to solve the problem.
- 830 Memorial gardens. Park. Main street outside various takeaways and pubs.
- The drains all over Silsden could be cleaned more as when it rains the drains often can not take the water especially after a dry spell.
- 832 Grassed area at junction of Elliott Street and Millfields.

- 834 Nab Road. Brown bank Lane. Holden Lane. Hauber Lane. Hainsworth Road. Swartha Lane.
- 835 Sometimes outside the social club on the whole the town is quite litter free.
- Around shops, not necessarily outside the shops because people buy something and eat or drink it while walking away from the shop then drop the litter.
- 839 Mainly in becks I.e. Clog Bridge (takeaway junk cartons). Increasingly the country lanes out of the centre/over the tops young people throw cans/food cartons into verges (assume at night).
- The bottom of Elliott Street never gets cleaned because of all the parking. Buses can hardly get through. Drains are blocked with rubbish. Also there should be dog bins and more rubbish bins in Silsden.
- Almost every roadside leading to and from the town is a disgrace with particular emphasis on fast food outlets. Containers many not located in Silsden. Beer and drinks cans and bottles thrown from passing vehicles. Fly tipping on Lightbank Lane, Brunthwaite Lane and Brown Bank Lane a constant and repeating problem.
- 843 From top of Hillcrest avenue up to gated access to open fields.
- 844 Recycling area. Park. Seating area, side of beck on Kirkgate.
- 845 Park.
- 846 Buck Lane.
- 847 Town centre. Bushes around the Co-op. Cats eyes steps.
- 848 the canal towpath and bags of dog muck Howden Road, Ings Way.
- 850 Park and beck. Dog fouling all over Silsden.
- 851 Kirkgate at weekends.
- The beck from the skateboard area to Clog Bridge. Around the train station.
- 855 Country roads just outside Silsden are a problem. Fly tipping, McDonalds cartons etc. thrown from car window, especially round the moor.
- 857 Dog fouling.
- We have a significant issue with dog fouling its awful especially around the schools and pavements. Please can this be an issue to address further.
- 860 Memorial gardens. Main street.
- Skateboarding area. Park especially Saturday and Sunday mornings, bottles and cans everywhere. Elliott Street near the school.
- The park. Behind the Co-op corner of Hillcrest Avenue and Spencer Avenue. Brown Bank.
- 865 Cans and bottles thrown on grass verges Skipton Road and elsewhere.
- 866 Back streets and takeaways. Drop used carton etc. on paths roads or peoples gardens. Too many takeaways.
- 867 Silsden Park.
- 870 Around park area bins are overflowing with larger cans and dog poo bags, isn't that supposed to go in a separate bin, and lack of people who do not bother to pick up their dogs poo.
- Top of Silsden Road, that leads to lower park green, runs parallel with Water Authority building, lots of dog poo bags thrown through fence and on side of path, despite signs that somebody has kindly put up, it is all still there. More dog poo bins around top of Silsden Road, Woodside Road please.
- 873 Children play areas in park, broken glass.
- 874 By the Beck, at the bridge behind Wesley Place.

- We used to have a litter warden when I moved to Silsden 13 years ago and the place was spotless.
- 878 The area around the CO-OP in particular outside Twisters.
- 879 Cat steps off Bolton Road. In the park especially around skateboard area and adjacent Back.
- 881 The Beck near the skate park.
- 883 Duck pond.
- 884 Do mess, I have to be always aware where I put my foot, I only experience this in Silsden.
- 885 Park, around swings loads of cans, bottles. Beck around skate park.
- 887 I don't think we have a big problem with litter in Silsden.
- 889 Beck, bottom of Bradley Road.
- 890 Beck.
- The back path between Bradley Avenue and the Co-op supermarket. Bradley Road between the green ant the Raikes residential home.
- The Beck as people seem to use this as a dumping ground. Also the area where the recycling skips are located.
- 894 Aire View.
- 895 Fines for dog fouling, littering.
- 897 High street is an issue after weekends.
- 900 The Beck and around the park.
- 902 The Beck, the park.
- 903 The park, especially in the summer after people have gathered together for parties, e.g. Friday and Saturday evenings. Bottles are a huge problem in the part, especially when broken.
- 905 The Beck by the park, and down the banking.
- 906 Outside takeaways, Beck.
- 909 Mitchell Lane, library area. When there was a litter warden these areas were kept clear of discarded food wrappers, cartons, tins and bottles.
- 910 Skipton Road, Kirkgate, Elliott Street.
- 913 Dog waste problem all over Silsden.
- 914 Back near Park bridge.
- 916 In the Beck playing fields litter.
- 917 Footpath Mitchell Lane to Craven Drive does not get cleaned properly or often enough. It is used by young people at night for drinking. There are bottles, cans, takeaway trays etc. Dead leaves from years ago. Also junction of Howden Road is the same.
- 920 Although I have not been in the park for a little while the area around the copse of trees above the rugby pitch and the banking at the bottom of the football field is usually quite bad.
- 921 Many back streets usually due to overflowing wheelie bins.
- 922 Outside most takeaways especially by the Beck.
- 926 Main routes though Silsden , all streets, cemetery, park, country lanes around Silsden.
- 928 Near the park, dog fouling in all Silsden.
- 929 Takeaway outlets.
- 931 Outside the library the play area in the park. The beck.

- 932 The park, the memorial tree copse has a big problem with litter, as down the skateboard area. The wardens need to show themselves more frequently and take tough action on dog owners who do not pick up after their pets.
- 934 The ramp and rocks area in the park is awful. There are plenty of bins however the children who use this area seem unable to use the bins provided and throw littler on the ground and into the beck. During spells of warm weather the park is used for picnics and barbeques and sadly large amounts of litter are left behind. If the weather is windy the litter blows into the trees and it looks awful.
- 935 The streets in town are very good it is the lanes and roads which need attention e.g. Brown Bank Lane/Holden Lane etc.
- 936 Bradley Road. Aire Road and New Road dog fouling in particular.
- 937 Beck and surrounding area.
- 939 Snicket joining Mitchell Lane with Craven Drive.
- 941 mostly park everywhere. You look in ditches, beck, streets a mess.
- 942 Canal towpath.
- 943 A service to Skipton would be important.
- 944 Dog fouling and littering should be prosecuted. Park, beck.
- 945 Outside the library. The beck.
- 946 The park in the areas by the beck.
- 947 Silsden parks and memorial gardens.
- 948 Cat steps and the park.
- The grass verges on Howden Road, close to Ings Way are always full of empty cans, bottle and other mess. The dog fouling is terrible on Ings Way and many other areas of Silsden. We need some PCSO's to patrol around the town to try and catch these anti-social people who don't give a damn about their environment.
- 950 Everywhere.
- 952 Laziness of people, canal walking. Round the Nab no bins.
- 953 Litter and dog fouling is a problem in the park and cobbled areas.
- 954 Church yard.
- 955 You can not sweep litter for parked cars.
- 956 Playing fields.
- 958 Main street over weekend through drunkenness.
- 960 Dog fouling persists in Howden Road, particularly at the higher end, despite some local residents posting notices outside their homes, asking dog walkers to clean up their pets deposits.
- 962 Brown Bank it's a mess.
- 964 Down by the cat steps.
- 967 By the bus stop. Opposite Cobbydale club.
- 968 Everywhere.
- 969 From top of Bolton Road turn right all way up to Nab End. Down footpath bottom of playing fields. Down to Mitchell Lane. Also dog fouling.
- 970 Play areas in Silsden park especially skateboard park and beck.
- 972 Litter less than concerning its dog mess that's the worst.
- 974 There is always a build up of litter on Nab Lane on the moor road. Sometimes parking to look at the beautiful view is ruined by litter and other items of litter and rubbish (the odd mattress from time to time, bottles and takeaway cartons).

- 975 Elliott Street, Belton Road.
- 976 Any road and grass verges and around the beck.
- 978 Footpath from Craven Drive to the Park. Footpath from Skipton Road onto Waterside (at the top). The park as a whole. All of these areas have too much litter and too much dog dirt. Some of it piled up in bags.
- 980 Elliott Street has no litter bins. I frequently have to ask Bradford council to clean street. I myself pick up litter and pebbles from outside my house. The street was last cleaned 6th March 2012 I organised this.
- 982 If you look closely anywhere there's littler. Employing a sweeper like John McNautly, who keep Silsden spotless and did a fantastic job, would at least lesson the problem. Employ more litter warden.
- 983 High Street.
- 984 Down Howden Road. Takeaway food boxes just get thrown on their way home.
- 986 The lane between Post office bridge and Craven Drive. I also disagree with the boards wording about dog muck. A child asked what the word sh\*\* meant.
- 987 The becks, and Kirkgate near beck.
- 988 Beck. Skip hire business area. All footpaths in built up area.
- 989 In the park.
- Around Howden Road and the canal. Behind curry house backing onto the canal. Not so much a litter problem, people who let their dogs foul on the pavements or leave poo in bags should be fined.
- 997 The becks.
- 998 Park, fields, path ways, stream, canal, outside Co-op.
- 999 Overflow at recycle bins. Park. River/beck.
- 1000 At the moment down by the blue balls near to where the travellers are.
- 1002 Near drinking establishments where broken glass is a particular problem. Need dog waste bins as using open litter bins is unhygienic.
- 1003 All over.
- Many areas in and around Silsden (particularly along the canal) are littered with plastic bags or dog muck. And beer cans and bottles litter the Banklands Lane recreation ground.
- 1006 Snicket between Mitchell Lane and Craven Drive.
- 1011 The beck near the Post Office often has rubbish thrown in e.g. road cones etc.
- 1012 The park.
- 1015 Main street and public footpaths.
- 1020 Silsden beck.
- 1024 Nowhere in general.
- 1028 Litter and doggie bags in hedges, Hainsworth Road, Silsden.
- 1032 Clog Bridge/Hainworth Road culvert.
- 1040 The park.
- 1043 Mitchell Lane (cat steps).
- 1046 Everywhere!
- 1047 Playing fields.
- 1051 The beck.
- 1055 By the park. By bins when they don't get emptied.
- 1060 Dog litter bins in the park. Make the Youth Council police themselves around the ramps. This area is a disgrace.

- 1061 Memorial garden by the library. Area around the Co-op, including the bush area on Spencer Avenue. Area around the recycling skips, rear of library.
- 1062 Kirkgate at weekends.
- 1064 Rocks and Ramps area of park. Canalside and beckside in some areas.
- 1065 Briggate and Kirkgate.
- 1067 In the park skateboard area.
- 1068 Bottom of Howden Road.
- 1071 No bins to encourage collection of dog waste.
- 1076 We badly need more salt bins. Especially North Street! Very steep!
- 1077 Underneath the Canal Aqueduct at end of Hainworth Road. In the park, especially near rugby pitch.
- 1078 Co-op.
- 1079 Everywhere, more so near takeaways. The road leading to industrial estate outside Co-op. Road opposite blue bollards has dog mess bags filled, stuffed along the hedges disgusting.
- 1080 The beck.
- 1081 The park, the beck.
- 1082 Around Co-op and Sunny Bank (British Legion) Club.
- 1084 Memorial gardens. Silsden park.
- 1085 All areas.
- 1088 Main street/beck.
- 1091 Around Co-op (Hillcrest Ave). Takeaways (Kirkgate).
- 1093 Street outside school and under Clogg Bridge are a problem with dog waste.
- 1094 Residential areas, around local shops in particular where litter is often thrown rather than put into a bin.
- 1095 Everywhere to some extent. The beck? Approx 15 years ago a well advertised and attended 'Clean up Silsden' day was organised. This brought members of the community together and hopefully set an example to the many children who attended.
- 1096 In beck, Kirkgate.
- 1101 Many of the quieter streets as these areas pay the same council tax but get neglected as regards road sweeping and general upkeep. Very unpleasant at times under the viaduct near Clog Bridge, litter and dog fouling, an area where many school children walk to school and adults into town.
- 1102 Everywhere, except main street.

- 319 My use of pulic transport is VERY occaisional because for the me the car is quicker and more convenient.
- 320 Silsden to Skipton by bus is difficult. Bus service doesn't link up with train times.
- 321 Lack of parking during the day at Steeton station. Would you train if I knew I could park
- 322 Steeton and Silsden station is a nightmare (and dangerous) to get to from Silsden for pedestrians, cyclists, and anyone carrying heavy or bulky items and not able to get to the last available weekday parking space at the station which fills at around 7.30am. Goodness knows how disabled people can cope with this station, especially if travelling Southbound. You obviously know this given the list of items below. Good transport links exist to Keighley and Ilkley and onwards travel from there. Well done for that. The moment you want to cross the county border transport falls apart. No wonder so many people from Skipton use Steeton & Silsden railway station.

And we are part of Bradford. Services to Keighley/station from the Howden Road side of Silsden are minuscule compared with those on the west side. Presumably more councillors are resident on that side of Silsden.

- The service to Waterside area and poor service to Keighley and Ilkley. A service to Skipton would be good. More coordination between trains and buses.

- 790 It is hard to get to Skipton which I would like to visit more often. Car parking there is expensive and not very central. - 140 Pickard lane onto Bolton rd, restrict parking close to end of lane, also Elliot street on to bolton rd, could do with a mini roundabout
- 144 crossing the bypass on foot and crossing the road from station to car park
- 146 Parking along Kirkgate, limit parking to Disabled only.
- 147 trying to cross at the by pass to reach station

- 1:Pedestrians crossing aire Valley Trunk road to reach railway station. 2:Speed of cars within the '30' limit on Bolton Road north of town centre.
- Many of the streets emerging onto Bolton Road are dangerous to navigate out of safely as parked cars make it difficult to see traffic coming up the hill.
- 155 The bend by the carpet shop/waterloo mills due to cobbled area and parking in front of the blue houses; parking around the schools
- 156 Kirkgate is too narrow for the number of large lorries that use it & bring the traffic to a halt
- 158 The road from Silsden to Steeton train station.
- 159 The Bypass
- 160 Tannery corner getting out can be dangerous in a car as there is a wall blocking view of traffic coming up Bolton Rd. Maybe mirrors put there to help making getting out easier.
- 161 The crossings at the bypass. It is only a matter of time before there is an accident.
- 163 Bell Square needs traffic lights or mini round-about.
- 164 More room on the bus for a powerchair
- 167 Crossing over the bypass to the station is not easy!
- 168 coming out of Dale view onto Bolton road
- Junction of Howden Road and Main Road/Elliot Street. Needs a mini roundabout. Remove the blue balls on the approach to Silsden, have two lanes of traffic, one for turning right, one straight on and a mini roundabout.
- 170 junction of howden road to main road. A one way system, way out under canal, onto belton road
- 171 the speeders down bolton road- speed camera
- 172 Roundabout leading to the station. A footbridge over the dual carraigeway would reduce the risk of being knocked over
- 173 The pedestrian crossing at Clog Bridge. There is traffic coming at it from 4 directions and in my view there is an accident waiting to happen. It should either be moved or taken away and replaced with pedestrian lights and I favour the latter.

- 193 Pavement area outside the Red Lion If the parked cars were on that side then pedestrans would be safe and there is more room on the beck side of the road to enable pedestrians to keep away from the kerb edge.

- 208 Walking to the station at steeton is very dangerous crossing the main dual carriageway is like dicing with death. It is one of the most dangerous roads to cross especially in winter. I have had a couple incidents where i was nearly run over.
- 209 Crossing the road at the roundabout to get to the train station.
- 210 Poor street lighting in general and broken and cracked road down the side of the Co-op. Difficult to cross the main street in Silsden since people don't always stop at zebra crossings. There is a bus stop at the bottom of Skipton road too near the junction to bell square.
- 211 Sharp bend at the top of Bolton road going up brown bank lane where the junction is on the bend. End of Elliot street, need a mini-roundabout or something.

- 217 The junction of Elliott Street, Krirgate and Clog Bridge. It needs traffic lights or a mini roundabout
- 218 Skipton Road cars travel too fast and there is no pedestrian crossings near Hothfield Street for the school children who seem to take their life in their own hands crossing the road. Also a pedestrian crossing would be good further up the hill. Bolton Road could also do with some form of crossing half way up it. Top of Skipton Road there are plans passed for some traffic calming outside Crossfield due to plans passed for more housing to be built why can't there be traffic calming all the way up this bit of the road until the 'd' restriction sign also a small footpath is to be built at this same section, why can't there be one all the way down to meet up with the other footpath by about 116 Skipton Road.
- 219 Exting Hillcrest Avenue in the mornign s when school buses are parled by Cobbydale Club. Cars come alongside the bsues and I am truning right up Skipton Road, I can't see them or vice versa. Also for drivers trunign right up Skipton Rd when buses arent ther the pear tree Cottage garden blockes the view.
- 221 No parking on main road through Silsden Some traffic don't obey speed limits
- 222 Section crossing the dual carriageway to the railway station. But you knew that already!
- 223 woodside road to skipton road poor visability when driving a car
- 224 Elliott Street access onto Keighley Road. Needs improvement- use of possible mini roundabout. Remove parking adjacent to beck.
- 225 Cars travel down Bradley Road far too quickly. Suggest ONE 'sleeping policeman' opposite The Green to slow traffic down
- 226 The Elliott Street/Clog bridge junction. Turning out of Bell Square onto the main road there is a blind spot to the right.
- 229 Bell Square traffic turning into Bolton Rd. Traffic lights required. Traffic turning into Kirkgate from Clog Bridge, traffic lights required.
- 230 The bottom of Howden Road, corner opposite the carpet shop. The junction of Howden Road with the main street.
- 231 Crossing to the station
- 232 Silsden/Steeton roundabout. To explore the possibility of a pedestrian walkway
- 233 The A629. Between Silsden and the railway station there are NO actual crossings for walkers, you take your life in your hands when you cross the road.

- 234 all the zebra crossings. some drivers do not seem to see pedestrians crossing the by pass there should be a proper crossing junction of Keighley Road and Belton Road needs a round a bout
- 235 The bottom of Aire View. this is used for people trying to turn right onto Kirkgate rather than at the bottom of Elliot Street and is safer and easier than trying to turn out of Elliot street. However, traffic turning into Aire View from Kirkgate causes problems, especially as there are parked cars along the length of Aire View.New Road is already one way from Kirkgate. Aire View could therefore be made one way from Prince Street.
- Pedestrians having to cross the bypass to get to the train station. Elliot Street exit onto Keighley Road, Woodside Road onto Skipton Road, Skipton Road after Woodside to the exit from Silsden, regular speeding cars in a narrow lane with no footpaths, its a miracle no one has been killed.
- 237 Clog Bridge/ Elliot Street and Bell Square/ Bolton Road blind spot at Briggate
- 240 The turn off from the main road for Howden road Elliott street is a nightmare. Could the be traffic lights? or a roundabout
- 241 The roundabout across the dual carriageway is a very dangerous spot and requires a safe pedestrian crossing. Keighley Road is also very busy and very difficult for pedestrians to cross at busy times.
- Pedestrian crossing at junction of Main St & Howden Road. Turning right out of Howden Road is a nightmare at busy times & often just when you've dashed out taking advantage of a small opportunity you find a pedestrian on the crossing I have to brake suddenly. Yes, ideally we should look out for them but it's not that clear cut & I'm surprised that there's not been a serious accident there. The whole of that junction with the staggered crossroads is a nightmare.
- 246 Crossing the Airevalley trunk road very hazardous. Bridge or subway needed.
- 247 Where woodside road joins skipton road you cannot see to pull out due to the foliage, there are numerous near misses throughout the day. The home owner needs to cut the bushes back
- 249 Silsden Main Street they are car parks empty yet cars block up the main street
- 250 the crossroads just in front of the co-op there are cars turning in every direction getting in and out of the co-op car park and down to the 2 pubs dangerous for pedestrians
- 251 Kirkgate in Silsden centre is very congested. Parking should be banned there.
- 252 Junction at Howden Road at peak times. Part time traffic lights would help
- 254 Staggered crossroads at bottom of Elliot Street a major hazard. Never use this crossroads if I can avoid it. Crossroads near Co-op and junction to main road near Kings Arms gets very congested as this is the only safe exit onto main road for people living in houses at Co-op side of road. Likewise with Clog Bridge being only way onto main road for Howden Road area housing. Not sure how to solve this need to get a highways expert on it!
- 258 Access from Millfields into Elliot Street when vehicles are parked on both sides.
- 259 The bypass is a very dangerous crossing point. A bridge would be an ideal improvement.
- 261 Crossing 6 lines of traffic at A629 to get to the train station
- Speeding on Bolton Road both up and down. How about introducing parking bays for residents to aid traffic calming and ease congestion on the side streets
- 264 a 20mph speed limit through the town
- 265 Safe pedestrian access to train station high priority

- I am surprised that no one has yet been killed on the zebra crossing out side the books the number of times I have been walk acorss and a car has just continued and i have had to stop.
- 269 there are no crossings on Keighley road it is very difficult to cross as peak times. Drivers seem to not spot pedestrians waiting to cross the zebra crossing on Kirkgate
- 271 Main road through silsden always busy therefore roads joining are offten congested
- 272 no proper crossings, often cars don't stop on the main street
- 274 Pleople dropping off passengers at train station
- 275 The bottom of Howden Road. Too many areas to watch including the pedestrian crossing.
- 277 as above
- 279 crossing the bypass on foot, and the bridge over the railway especially in the winter months, there should be a safe way to cross from the car park without having to cross the road.
- 281 The junctions of Elliot Street and Clog Bridge with Keighley Road/Kirkgate is hazardous and should have traffic lights.
- 282 howden road junction with main road. speeding.
- 283 By-pass crossing Exiting Elliot st by car onto Keighley rd Area arround infant school on Elliot St at start and finish of school. Bollards on Elliot st, cars park to close, parking lines should be moved back.
- 285 Crossing the Aire Valley Road to get to the trains or through to Steeton.
- 286 Junction by Kings Arms. Bolton Road cars speeding up the road towards Addingham
- 290 no crossings on Bolton Road
- 291 Turning off brown bank lane. Roundabout at A65
- Junction at Elliott St, Keighley Road and Clog Bridge, unfortunately poor driving skills and impatience lead to bottlenecks and possible accidents
- 293 Junction of Elliott St, Kirkgate, Clogg Bridge. Mini roundabout suggested.
- 294 The bypass is dangerous to cross. Need a bridge or underpass..this would encourage bicyle use
- 299 Bridge Stree. Bottom og Elliott Street Bottom of Aireview Bottom of Shed Side Clog Bridge
- 301 Traffic lights at the bottom of Elliott Street. The type with a sensor on.
- To change the layout from Howden Road and Elliot Street to make it safer for cars coming out of busy junctions, this could be done via 2 mini roundabouts or traffic lights at peak times.
- 304 Skipton road is very dangerous for pedestrians and cyclists as cars travel far beyond the speed limit. Police speed cameras, traffic island or narrowing of road, speed bumps etc where the road narrows to the rear of Hawkcliffe view
- 306 Traffic control measures at the juction of Elliott Street/Kirkgate/Clog Bridge.
- 307 Crossing the dual carriage way to get from silsden to the station. Bolton Rd pedestrian crossing? The cross roads at Clog bridge - traffic lights?
- 312 The roundabout to the station very dangerous to cross warning signs for drivers ideally an over pass
- 314 Regular parking on the main road outside Days of Grace gym causing danger near the bridge

- 316 Narrow road area by the Post Office due to on road parking.
- 317 opposite the petrol station there should be a crossing, near the bridge for access to canal for pedestrians and main crossing near roundabout to Steeton
- 318 parking down both sides of Skipton Road parking on pavements on North Street
- 319 Elliot Street/Keighley Road junction especially at busy times. Possibly rush hour traffic lights. Out side the schools at drop off and pick up times. More police patrols and fines for inconsiderate drivers.
- 320 Pedestrian access across roundabout
- 321 Clog bridge/Elliot Street and that mad lollipop woman who seems to step onto the crossing without any regard for anything else going on! Traffic lights?
- I cycle. The following is a list of places where I feel that I have previously been in serious danger of being run into by a car that has failed to see me (or simply ignored me) as I use the main road to travel southbound between Silsden centre and the Aire valley road: Elliot St/Clog Bridge intersection with Kirkgate Junction of Keighley Rd and Howden Road Junction of Naylor-Myers/Shell garage with Keighley Road Northbound: Elliot St/Clog Bridge intersection with Kirkgate Junction of Aire View with Kirkgate
- 323 Crossing trunk road to the station is deadly. Need a crossing point with traffic lights. Disabled or elderly or anybody slow are effectively barred from crossing. Also, since putting the traffic islands in at either end of silsden on the main road, this has turned a safe wide road into a deadly chicane for cyclists. I have written to road planners at bradford about this when they were put in place, but apparently they know best!! A solution would be a restriction from the kerb side, with a gap for cycles to go through, so the cyclist is not having to expect a car to hit them.
- 324 roundabout across to steeton major problem and the narrow areas in and out of silsden for cyclists as cars squeese through
- 326 Elliot street/howden road/ keighley road junction. no suggestion. Banklands Lane/bolton road junction. Convex mirror on lamp post oposite banklands lane junction with Bolton Road. Enabling traffic to enter Bolton road safely not blindly
- 327 The bend by the carpet shop in Howden road. children come out of hainsworth road and cross there as traffic sppeeds round that bend. Plus cars and vans park outside waterloo mill obstructing views of the bend.
- 328 Crossing trunk road. Underpass needed
- 329 roundabout on the byepass
- The zebra crossings are regularly ignored. I have personally witnessed many 'near misses. Introduce speed humps.
- 332 Dropping off on the zig zag lines outside the schools
- 333 The end of Howden Road. The lower end of Skipton Road.
- 334 The traffic island on entering silsden near football feild. A death trap for cyclists
- 335 Speeding up Howden Road and through Brunthwaite village (often Golf Club users)
- 336 Parked cars at the bottom of Skipton Road
- 337 poor condition of Hillcrest Avenue road needs adopting and resurfacing as do the surrounding roads
- 339 howden road onto the main street is a real danger spot and the system needs to be changed.

- lower end of Skipton road ,bottle neck caused by car owners who do not wish to pay parking fees. Traffic lights on junc of howden rd/main rd/elliot st.
- 342 Canal bridge area on the main road
- Zebra crossing by Elliot Street junction, frequently find that cars do not stop and speed past here. Making this a pelican crossing with lights would surely help. Also trying to turn right at the same junction emerging from Elliot Street can be hazardous at times with speeding cars emerging suddenly from over the top of the canal bridge.
- The zebra crossing outside the Betting Shop is really bad due to cars struggling to get out of Howden Road and two lanes of traffic approaching it from the bridge. Getting across the bypass if going to the train station.
- 347 car/van parking on the setts on the corner of Howden Road infront if Waterloo Mills
- 348 Parking at the foot of Bradley Rd /Skipton Rd Traffic calming through the Main St
- 349 Parking on the road junction corner Bradley road outside Butchers/Shoe repairers
- Turning right out of Elliot Street onto the Keighley/Bolton road. Likewise turning right from Howden Road onto the Keighley/Bolton Road. Drivers have to rely on the courtesy of the more considerate drivers to let the cars out. I think a roundabout would just add to the congestion in this area. So add some signage to make drivers aware that consideration should be given to other road users. The bottom of Skipton Road, at the mini crossroads near the Co-op can be very congested at busy times. An improved regard for the Highway Code would make this spot less dangerous as many drivers appear to have little understanding as to who exactly has priority.
- Outside the Football club and junction with the Industrial Estate too much on street parking, and with a narrowed road at the junction traffic is getting snarled up. also the Sykes Lane exit/entrance being single lane and on a hill causes traffic entering the main road to be a real hazard.
- 353 Traffic regularly speed up Howden Road. Perhaps spot speed checks may deter this, although some of speeding traffic is from young people on an evening.
- 356 Parking in Kirkgate and Skipton Road
- 361 the bottom of Elliot Street is a nightmare to exit. Parking should not be allowed on the main street it gets too congested at peak times, and pedestrians take their lives in their hands trying to cross the by pass toward and from Station Road
- The main road and dual carriage way by the train station, as I regularly use the trains, and the roads can become very busy and dangerous.
- 363 pedestrian crossing by Elliot Street/ Clog Bridge on main road. Cars often don't stop
- The Steeton and Silden rounderbout, Pedestrian crissing by Elliott St and the crossroad at Elliot Street/Main Street/Howden Road.
- 365 crossing the Aire Valley trunk road to/from the station
- The bridge going down towards the bypass where there is no pavement on the left hand side ,which is where you need to be to cross for the train station.
- 369 Kirkgate, CXanal Bridge

- 370 Zebras in Silsden need to be maintained both stripes on the road and lights, last year the zebras were almost invisable. People parking on the main street outside of the parking zoned areas esecially outside the fish & chip shop during peak traffic hours causing traffic queues. Pavement outside on Elliott Street outside Health Centre jutting out onto road. Parking on Clog Bridge going round onto Howden Road / John Street. Carpet Gallery vans and other cars park onto the main road which is a hazard when going round a blind corner onto Howden Road. Also parking on the cobbles or pavement here is also a hazard as coming down Howden Road makes this a blind corner. Parking on Keighley Road outside the Cricket club, although signs on walls asking people not to park people do ending with parking on both sides of road! Parking on Craven Drive / Craven Avenue. This is a residential area and it looks like a car park during the day due to Toyota and Snugpack staff parking here, white lines have been painted here to stop people parking over driveways however this is not always the case. This is also the Hopper Bus route and makes this very dangerous and cannot see when turning onto Craven Drive from Howden Road and Craven Avenue from Craven Drive, this should be made into residential are parking only. If businesses want to be in the middle of residential areas then they should provide parking or work transport. Sadly double yellow lines! More traffic wardens police to stop people parking in dangerous spots especially for repetative offendors like Carpet Gallery vans!
- 372 as above.
- 374 The crossing to steeton could really do with a footbridge, it's not safe for people to cross especially people like myself with a pram.
- The junctions of Elliot street and Howden Road. Traffic exiting Aireview into Kirkgate. Parking on Skipton Road.
- 377 Crossing the bypass to the station build a bridge or underground tunnel like the one near Victoria park in Keighley. Keighley Rd near petrol station. My mum is over 70 but very fit for her age but sometimes she can be stood there over half hour waiting to cross zebra or pelican crossing needed.
- 378 Road markings worn away in area of co-op
- 379 skipton rd outside the vets ,must have double yellows
- 380 Elliot Street/Main Road junction
- 381 The junction where the blue balls are, how about a mini roundabout?
- 386 Skipton rd short cut from bradley rd to skipton rd via purcell drive main street junction of elliot st keighley rd and howden rd
- 387 howden road junction pulling out, junction with bell square & bolton road
- 388 Crossing the dual carriageway has a high risk to pedestrians. The right hand turn coming out of elliot street is risky, particularily to cyclists, as cars tend to rush out of the junction due to limited duration of visibility. The parking areas on silsden high street should be cropped back by a car or two parking bays (heading towards the bridge) as it causes clogging within the village and a risk of damage to passing cars and a high risk to cyclists.
- Double parking on Skipton Road; parking on double yellow lines in the middle of Silsden for people making a quick visit to shops, cash machines etc; parking on Dale View which is too near the junction with Bolton Road (which is sometimes also double parking)

- 392 It seems the only way to deal with the problems of crossing the motorway to access the station is a bridge. I understand traffic lights are not allowed and an underpass would be at risk of flooding. There are problems at Clog Bridge / Elliot street accessing the main road. There is also a problem coming out of Bradley Rd, as cars parked on the road side block vision of the oncoming traffic. Yellow lines would be useful here.
- 397 junction near purple garlic is a blind spot. junction out of elliot street.
- 398 As above access to the station from Silsden i.e. crossing the dual carriageway is a safety hazard for fit adults never mind the elderly and those with young children. Its an accident waiting to happen. A safe quick solution is required i.e. subway or over-road walkway (suitable for prams and wheelchairs) is a MUST as soon as possible.
- 401 Re-paint stripes at crossings on roads and posts. Illuminate the beacons on posts. Warning sign south of canal bridge that there is a crossing after bridge.20 mph limit.
- 402 main road through Silsden heavy with large lorries both ways: prohibit very large lorries through the town
- 403 junction outside kings arms
- 405 Bell Square/Bolton Rd junction. Mini roundabout
- 409 Difficult to cross Keighley Road south of the canal bridge. The garage is the local shop for Keighley Rd and it's on the opposite side of the road to the houses. Ditto for Fish & Chip shop, bus-stop for station etc.
- 410 trying to cross the by pass to get to the railway station
- 411 End of Bolton Road, bad for turning right.
- 413 Junctions at either end of Bell Square; & Kirkgate/Elliott St./Clog Bridge. Yellow, hatched, box areas may be a solution.
- 414 1. Clog Bridge/Kirkgate/Elliot St junction there should be a double mini roundabout. 2. Bell Sq/Bolton Road junction I have witnessed several accidents at this spot, there should be a mini roundabout. 3. The Dale View / Bolton Road junction there have been several accidents here caused by vehicles overtaking cars going up the hill, there should be an electronic speed reminder for traffic going up the hill situated before the Dale View turning. (a painted traffic island and car parking restrictions would also help)
- 415 elliot street at school times would would benefit from twenty miles zone past the school or a slow down sign
- 416 I have manu suggestions which would not fit in this box
- 418 Clog bridge/elliott street junction poss mini roundabout/lights at bridge to slow traffic
- 419 Crossing the bypass to get to Steeton and Silsden station. Coming out of Elliott Street whether turning left or right there is a danger of oncoming traffic over the canal bridge.
- 421 howden rd turning needs addressing.
- 423 Crossing the bypass between Silsden and Steeton, extremely dangerous for children or parents with prams!! Needs a bridge or tunnel!! Exiting Bradley Road onto Skipton Road is difficult with Taxis parked on either side of the road, sometimes blocking it. Lower part of Skipton road is usually down to one lane with cars parked on either side. Double yellow lines needed through out the main road running through Silsden!!
- 425 skipton road cars parked both sides making crossing the road dangerous

- 427 Crossroads of Elliott Street and Howden Road perhaps suggest traffic light that can be seen when approaching the bridge coming into Silsden. Always a nightmare junction.
- the main bridge in silsden, next to old bridge pub. some speed up coming up from the bypass, when cars are pulling out of elliott street or people crossing over the road. May be some signs of speed ramps. Also, stopping heavy goods vehicles from using the main road to bypass through silsden when not dropping off in silsden. With the parked cars that slows traffic down (good idea), these HGV's cause congestion.
- 429 Silsden parking main street.
- 430 Bad exit on road to main street, i.e. Wesley Place, by Kings Arms and exit from Clog Bridge/main street/Elliott St/Kly Road is a nightmare!
- 431 Crossroads at bottom of Elliott Street, turning right over canal bridge. Public seat is in the way plus sometimes cars park alongside the kitchen shop making it difficult for buses to turn. Improvement: remove public seat/bench and widen the corner for better vision of oncoming traffic.
- Parking on Kirkgate causes congestion and limits it to one way, made worse in last few years due to HGVs use of 'Sat Nav', Silsden is now used as a short cut. This means anyone driving through who sees a clear run through will accelerate to get through making crossing at Zebras dangerous as no-one stops. I have spoken to Inspector Sanderson at Ilkley who says there is no problem, she just can't be bothered.
- 433 Main road through Silsden heavy with large lorries both ways. Prohibit very large lorries through the town.
- 434 As above. Skipton Road parking.
- Junction of Elliott Street with Howden Road roundabout needed. Traffic islands or some form of speed restriction down the length of Skipton Road where the 30mph speed limit is totally ignored in the majority of cases.
- 436 Silsden's zebra at the junction of Howden Road outside Bet Fred. As a driver and pedestrian people miss-use the zebras and jump out. When driving down the town the corner of Howden Road acts as a blind spot and people come out onto the crossing, I think a barrier there might help on a push button crossing.
- Lots of people walk to Steeton and have to cross over the by-pass, it's an accident just waiting to happen.
- 439 Can't comment excepting this, we need street lighting in the back street in [?] Terrace
- 441 Bolton Road. Pelican light crossing for people to cross safely to park. Pelican lights at Town Hall. Traffic lights at junction Howden Road and Elliott Street.
- Junction at bottom of Elliott Street. Need for traffic lights with advance warning for traffic coming over the canal bridge. Too many parked cars on Skipton Road hinder the view of other cars and could easily cause accidents. On Bradley Road I'm sure cars often exceed the speed limit. More enforcement of the law is called for
- 444 Cross roads at Elliott Street/Howden Road when driving. Traffic can come quickly over the bridge.
- Skipton Road by dentist, where taxis park on Skipton Bradley Road. Large lorry using Silsden as a short cut.

- The junction at the bottom of Howden Road and the High Street along Elliott Road and onto the High Street. As above the road crossing to the station.
- 447 Tricky road junction where Howden Road joins the main road at Clog Bridge, made worse by the adjacent pedestrian crossing. Also difficult where Elliott Street joins Keighley Road especially turning right. Suggest mini-roundabout or traffic lights.
- 448 Lack of safe pedestrian crossing of the by-pass at the roundabout at Steeton and Silsden station.
- 449 Elliott Street/Main Road. Kings Arms junction.
- 450 The by-pass. Bolton Road. Junction of Bolton Road, Dale View and Pickard Lane.
- 451 Difficultly of buses getting through Kirkgate.
- 452 Improve visibility for drivers turning right from Elliott Street into Keighley Road. Rounding corner of wall.
- 456 Silsden centre is a bottleneck and should be bypassed or stop parking down the main street and create a larger parking area.
- The main road going through the centre of Silsden and at busy times this is a danger spot with traffic travelling one way and traffic, including lorries, the other way, endeavouring to miss parked cars and the traffic travelling on the other side.
- 460 Elliott Street/Clog Bridge junction... Due to traffic coming over the canal bridge being unseen crossing at the end of Hainsworth Road due to the bend in Howden Road.
- 464 Crossing Bolton Road at any point in that road. Crossing any part of the road near Silsden Co-op and the bus shelter and stops.
- 465 Roundabout to get to Silsden train station.
- The crossing along main street Silsden cars don't stop and if van is in from of a car driver they are not always aware that there is a crossing if they don't know the road. Need to have a flashing beacon to press when want to cross the road or traffic lights. Not much room to pass (cars) main street. Parking should not be allowed along main street. Need to provide more parking spaces for those who want to shop in main street especially Post Office/First Stop etc.
- Junction of Belton Road and Keighley Road. Corner near Habisit Rossi. Traffic travels too fast after the Silsden 'bottleneck'. The junction of Keighley Road, Howden Road and Elliot Street always a bun fight of confusion.
- 468 Junction of Howden Road, Clog Bridge, and Elliot Street with Kirkgate. Traffic lights.
- 473 Lights need at the junction of Howden Road main street over the canal bridge and Elliot Street. Impossible to get out of Howden Road and Elliot Street at peak times.
- 479 Silsden crossing at bottom of Howden Road.
- 480 People speeding in Howden Road.
- 481 There are a few drivers who speed up Howden Road on a regular basis heading up towards Brunthwaite.
- 483 Parking on Howden Road. Zebra crossing by Town Hall and Howden Road. Getting out of Howden Road by car.
- 488 Bottom of Howden Road. Bottom of Elliot Street. Possible traffic lights.
- 489 Very difficult to get out of Howden Road to go up town towards llkley.

- 490 It is very unsafe crossing the bus stop in Bolton Road from Pickard Lane to Dale View. I think it needs a safe crossing place.
- 491 Zebra crossings! Cars don't stop . Aireview at school time one way street.
- Parking up Drivers Hill. Doesn't matter which way I'm going I always have to give way! Maybe one way systems should be introduced around the area. Crossing Bolton Road at peak times. Also cannot see for parked cars if is car coming out of Pickard Lane or crossing on foot.
- 494 Elliot Street/Kirkgate junction. Junction by Kings Arms public house/Co-op/ Speed of traffic on Elliott Street. Pedestrian crossings on Kirkgate especially early mornings, very few cars will stop and most speed at that time too! Large articulated lorries using Silsden as a short cut – make it a lorry free zone!
- 495 Please see above. Zebra crossings especially the one at Elliott Street/Clog Bridge. In general there are too many hazards both as a driver and pedestrian.
- 496 Bottom Howden Road into main road. Elliot Street into main street.
- 497 The island on Bolton Road approaching village from Addingham is surplus.
- Joining Bridge Street from Bradley Road. The taxis are important but it would be better if they could park away from Bridge Street with a designated area. Getting out of Clog Bridge onto Kirkgate or exiting from Elliot Street. Traffic lights!
- The junction at the bottom of Bradley Road (near butchers and hairdresser and cobblers) and Skipton Road bottom. Parked cars on most days of the week invite dangerous accident. Ban parking up the length for first 300 years. Alternate days which side can be used for parking (using signs).
- 505 Crossing the bypass.
- 507 Bottom of Bradley Road as one car parked on the bridge to the right obstructs view of road. Also pulling out of Bell Square, you seem to miss the traffic from your right.
- 508 T-junction at Clog Bridge Kirkgate mini roundabout.
- 511 Skipton Road coming from Kildwich direction, people very often don't slow down. Speed camera please.
- The pedestrian crossing to Clog Bridge cars regularly don't see people either waiting on the crossing or part way across it as they are focused on the two junctions. This would be better with lights at the crossing.
- 513 People parking on the zig zag lines at the schools and also parking on the bends of roads near to the schools.
- 515 Bypass between Silsden and Steeton makes crossing impossible. Footbridge, subway on zebra crossing needed.
- 516 Difficult emerging from Hothfield Street onto Skipton Road due to inconsiderate parking outside dentists. Double yellow lines needed. Parking next to double white lines on canal bridge.
- 517 Skipton Road (parked cars). Howden Road junction. Bell Square and Bolton Road junction.
- Parking below the Post Office!! An accident waiting to happen, the road isn't wide enough for two vehicles to pass.
- Top road (Skipton Road) from Silsden over to Kildwick is used as a rat run making it dangerous to walk as no footpath.
- People not stopping at the zebra crossing especially the one by the bookies, cars come too fast over the bridge.
- 522 Speeding cars up and down Ings Way. Suggest speed bumps on straight bit.

- The zebra crossing at the junction of Howden Road. Even with a lollipop lady on duty, cars sometimes fail to stop and I was nearly run over halfway across the crossing. There does need to be some lights!
- 525 Zebra crossing outside Town Hall is very badly lit on an evening, and cars rarely stop for you to cross.
- 526 Remove/relocate parking spaces on Kirkgate to relieve traffic congestion.
- 527 Elliott Street from to top to bottom needs traffic calming. Junction Bell Square. Parking on yellow lines outside schools.
- 528 Kirkgate zebra crossing at Clog Bridge.
- Main St change zebra crossing to pelican. Main St ban parking by Post Office (if it was road works, instead of parked cars, there would be traffic lights). Howden Road/Main Rd junction put traffic lights on this junction, incorporating the crossing, when there was major gas works with traffic lights it was far easier to get out of Howden Road/Elliot Street.
- The junction from Aire View that joins the main road by the bridge left. And also Howden Road when turning right.
- Roundabout on bypass near train station is a nightmare for cyclists and pedestrians. Needs a footbridge or at least a puffin crossing ASAP.
- Too many lorries going through the town centre, they are big and long, it is a total blockage at times, it's chaos, they shouldn't be allowed.
- Ingsway, people drive too fast. Learner drivers 3 point turns and reversing at busy times. Clog Bridge to main street need lights at busy times.
- 540 Pedestrian crossing over the bypass between Steeton/Silsden, poss footbridge?
- Junction Bell Sq and Bolton Rd needs traffic lights. Junction Howden Rd and Main Rd (Elliot St) needs traffic lights.
- 544 See Q18.
- 547 Howden Road junction/Elliot Street junction. Mini-roundabout.
- 548 Bolton Road, near to park no crossing, cars speed. Very uneven road surface up Spencer Avenue. Also the path on Spencer Avenue is uneven for pedestrians.
- Clog Bridge Elliott Street, Kirkgate why don't we make it one way under the culvert (going towards Steeton). Daisy Hill (Howden Road) make the road up one field to the top of the park, it would help all the residents this side of Silsden, it was supposed to be done a few years ago. To exit onto Bolton Road, ban lorries from Silsden Main Street.
- Zebra crossing near Clog Bridge almost hit twice by cars coming from Clog Bridge turning and not taking care of crossing.
- Lower part of Skipton Road is difficult because of parking both sides of dentists down. Should ban parking during day on one side. Other bus routes Elliott Street need attention to make it easier for buses to negotiate. Need to evaluate position of the traffic island outside the school and adjacent parking.
- Junction with Elliott St and Kirkgate. The corner should have been taken off where the boatyard is to allow better vision up canal bridge and allow room for buses and large vehicles to turn.
- Not in Silsden centre but crossing Aire Valley road is almost impossible at busy times and highly dangerous.
- 554 Clog Bridge/Elliott St junction traffic lights. Traffic in Kirkgate ban articulated truck.

- Around the new sports club its very dark; it's a busy road and people tend to park on the opposite side of the road to the facility. Had children run out in front of me before and it is very dark and sometimes difficult to see them. It could be improved.
- 556 Speed coming down Bolton Road, humps possibly. Roundabout at Elliott St and Kirkgate.
- 558 End of Dradishaw Road onto Skipton Road, cars coming up the hill need some sort of speed trap or hump to slow cars.
- 560 People ignore pedestrians at the crossings and just drive past. Maybe cameras would help at appropriate points.
- 562 Bridge over railway track. Parking on bridge for dropping off and picking up, fence should be erected along road side it's a danger parking on brow of bridge I know of 2 people knocked down on bridge.
- The 2 traffic islands on approach to Silsden, one near cricket/football club and one just past top Bolton Road/bottom of Cringles cause narrowing of road and putting cyclists at great risk from motorised traffic not giving way. Pavement jutting out into Elliott Street at access to health centre car park, would not be visible to motorists in deep snow.
- 564 Coming out of Tufton St and Hothfield St in to Skipton Road, unable to see any traffic coming up Skipton Road.
- 567 Traffic lights and a pedestrian crossing on the roundabout allowing people to access station from Silsden more safely.
- 570 Main Street too fast traffic.
- 571 Dale View junction with Main Road poor visibility and parking too near junction I.e. ban parking close to junction.
- 572 Kirkgate is congested and the on street parking causes vehicles, particularly lorry's to mount the kerb. Reduce or remove the on street parking on Kirkgate.
- 573 A footbridge over the A629.
- 574 Negotiating the Main street by car due to the parking down one side. Crossing the dual carriageway on foot. Suggest ban parking in the Main Street and provide footbridge over dual carriageway.
- 576 Zebra crossings. All of them.
- 577 Personally have a major problem getting out of Elliott Street. Traffic lights may help or a mini roundabout but the speed of traffic over the bridge would be a problem there. Coming out of other end of Silsden means getting held up in town.
- 578 The junction of Clog Bridge and Elliott Street is really bad but I don't know what would help.
- All the people crossing the road at the roundabout coming/going from Steeton especially at high use times of day but not sure how this can be helped, but it is dangerous for drivers and pedestrians.
- 580 Skipton Road needs traffic calming measures especially at the top between High Green Drive and Woodside Ride. Also mirrors for exits directly onto Skipton Road. People drive far too fast here.
- 582 Junction Main Road/Elliott St/Howden Road traffic lights at this junction.
- Main High Street; too much parking and HGV's. Possibly re-route HGV's tend to drive on pavements to get through especially when young children and elderly are walking.

- 587 Kirkgate it is dangerous walking on the pavements. Lorries sometimes mount the pavements to get past parked cars and other large vehicles. Also on Elliott Street the crossing in the middle of the road and parked cars near cause cars to swerve they are going too fast.
- 588 The main street in the centre of the town.
- Lower Skipton Road stop all the double parking at the vets and dentists. Its dangerous for the school children.
- 590 Limited vision when crossing bend on Hainsworth Road with or without pushchair.
- 591 Bottom of Bradley Road near butchers could do with double yellow lines.
- No parking on road in town centre (another car park perhaps) Traffic lights urgently needed at the Howden Road junction. Enforce speed limit more flashing warning signs at half way up North street. Restrict use of top road/Silsden to Farnhill which is becoming a rat run.
- 593 Traffic lights at Bell Square.
- 594 Howden Road and Kirkgate bad get out.
- 595 Excessive speed down Woodside Road.
- 596 Woodside Road has some very speedy drivers often 50-60 mph. Skipton road near to 30 mile limit very narrow, cars travelling to Skipton speed up before reaching the boundary/restriction. Skipton road is quite hairy to walk along but that part is in North Yorkshire.
- 597 Crossing at the roundabout between Silsden and Steeton on the bypass.
- 598 Vehicles parking at bottom end of Skipton Road obstruct view of drivers exiting Bradley Road.
- 599 Bradley Road speeding often between 60 and 70 mph. The 30 mph signs should be located above Raikes Care Home.
- 600 Zebra crossing. Pelican crossing.
- 602 Traffic speeding up Howden Road, speed warning signs or cameras. Junction at bottom of Howden Road mini roundabout.
- 603 Bridge Road by Co-op. Kirkgate, Elliott St, Clog Bridge needs traffic lights.
- 604 Traffic lights Elliott St junction with Main St and Clog Bridge.
- Bottom of Elliott St traffic coming from Clog Bridge. HGV's coming through the village.
- Remove all High Street parking. Put mini roundabout at Clog Hill/Elliott Street/Howden Road junction presently very difficult to get out of Howden Road/Elliott Street. Ensure lollypop lady waits till she has group of children before she stops traffic. Presently she stops traffic for every 1 child. She should not use facility for adults without children.
- 610 Skipton Road double parking speed of which drivers come down this road. Parking on one side one speed limit.
- 611 Restrict speed at the top of Silsden Road.
- South View cars speed up there. Trying to get out of Elliott Street on to main road. I am sure cars are not keeping to speed limit over canal bridge.
- Right turn from Elliott Street to Keighley Road make this no right turn. No impact on bus route as buses only turn into Elliott Street from Skipton Road.
- 618 Bottom of Elliott Street getting out.
- Junction at Elliott Street/Clog Bridge. Junction at bridge Street onto main road. Zebra crossing drivers don't always stop.

- Should be more 20 mph areas in built up areas. Need pedestrian access to station across bypass.
- Pedestrians crossing on the Aire Valley Trunk Road extremely dangerous as cars do not slow down and actually use roundabout as a personal chicane (as if on a race track). Someone was run down in November only a matter of time before someone is killed. We need a bridge or pedestrian crossing. Right turn out of Bell Square onto Bolton Road traffic coming both ways are speeding down.
- 625 A mini roundabout at Bell Square.
- Access to the railway station, over the dual carriageway. Cars parking on the main road through Silsden causing congestion. People should use the car parks, more car parks or rent the car parks behind the pubs. The junction at both ends of the village, should be lights. The traffic could be controlled by virtue of speed cameras on the main road.
- Bolton Road speed bumps. North Street needs to be one way for home/rent tenants only.
- 628 The speed of traffic on Bolton Road.
- The most dangerous place is trying to turn right up Silsden coming off Howden Road when traffic is coming over the bridge and off Elliott Street and down Silsden may need a small roundabout.
- Stop all parking in the main street and put in slow down bumps. Also the crossing for pedestrians, need to be traffic lights no one stops any more to let you cross. Getting very dangerous to cross the road.
- The junction at the bottom of Elliott Street and Keighley Road needs traffic lights installing. The junction from Bell square into Bolton Road.
- 669 Crossing Bolton Road below Bell Square junction. Crossing the bypass to the station
- 670 Junction Howden Road/Main Road and Elliott Street traffic lights.
- 671 By-pass and crossing near Purple Garlic.
- 672 Kings Arms junction.
- Bypass for people trying to get to station. Hothfield by dentist cant see to get onto Skipton Road.
- 675 Hillcrest Avenue, from Bridge Street to Co-op pavement uneven and dangerous. Bus stop (towards Keighley) on Bridge Street drain regularly overflows and cars try to avoid resulting lake.
- 676 Main road through Silsden nearly always congested even at quite times.
- 677 Clog Bridge and the whole of Kirkgate is an ordeal.
- 678 Bottom of Elliott Street to main road and coming from Howden Road. Traffic lights would be useful.
- 679 Crossing at Kings Arms to visit Co-op. Clog Bridge pedestrian crossing dangerous. Nightmare speeding on Ings Way.
- 680 It is difficult to come out of Tufton Street and the main road, when there are a lot of cars parked on the main road.
- 681 Crossing bypass to get to railway station for other member of family. Zebra crossings, especially one at bottom of Howden Road, are danger spots due to bad drivers.
- 682 Elliott Street/Kirkgate/Howden Road junction is very busy at certain times of the day. People using the zebra crossing are sometimes ignored (tea time).
- 683 Skipton Road is terrible for crossing as all the cars that park there make it

- difficult to see.
- 684 Traffic lights at the bottom of Elliott Street. The type with a sensor on.
- 687 Definite road junction at the King pub/Purple Garlic area. Poor line of view when pulling out into main road, but not sure what can be done apart form pull buildings down.
- 688 Crossing over dual carriageway to get to station pedestrian bridge.
- 689 Danger areas are Kirkgate by the pond. To improve stop the parking.
- 690 Kirkgate/Elliott Street/Howden Road junction and crossing cars do not see the crossing traffic lights. Skipton Road parked cars. Parking on road and pavement on both sides of Belton Road making driving dangerous especially on bend and at junction double yellow lines needed for full length of Belton Road.
- For many years Silsden has been rumoured to be getting a bypass which would benefit the whole area. Huge heavy goods vehicles should not be allowed through Silsden. This problem became worse since the Aire Valley Trunk Road was opened. Other villages have weight restrictions, why not Silsden?
- 695 Traffic lights Bells Square Bolton Road.
- 700 Howden Road is an accident waiting to happen. A 20 mph speed limit or speed bumps.
- 702 Elliott Street needs traffic calming. Junction Bell Square. Junction Howden Road.
- 704 Corner of Ings Way, where a pick up truck is parked. Its an obstruction for anyone trying to get in or out of Ings Way. There should be a longer yellow line places there.
- Zebra crossings. Warning signs for motorist they are approaching a zebra crossing a lot of motorists do not stop when a pedestrian is crossing (accident waiting to happen). A no parking in Skipton Road outside vets and dentist (accident waiting to happen).
- 706 The zebra crossing at Howden Road/Elliott Street junction is far too near the junction. Pedestrians walk out of Howden Road immediately on to the crossing. It should be 15/20 yards nearer town centre.
- 710 Dradishaw Road/Skipton Road junction/Elliott Street/Main Road/Howden Road junction speeding traffic at top of Skipton Road where road narrows speed humps, reduce 30 mph restriction, more police speed traps.
- Junction of Skipton Road and Woodside Road. Junction of Elliott Street to Kirkgate. Junction of Bell Square to Bolton road.
- 715 Clog Bridge onto the main street, traffic lights at this crossroads.
- 716 Kirkgate because of cars parking by duck pond. Disabled only required.
- 717 Down the main street when a lorry drives through its very hard for cars to carry on driving through the tight spaces.
- 718 Parked cars with wing mirrors, making one in danger of driving too wide going through the village at busy times.
- 719 Turning right at the top of North Street onto Bolton Road. Crossing Bolton Road near park.
- 720 No parking on main street. Vehicles have to mount the kerb on the opposite side. Silsden has some people with sight difficulties and it must be hard for them.

- 722 Car parking on the bend by the post office, Kirkgate makes passing big wagons/buses virtually impossible and should be removed. People should use the car park. Also dangerous for pedestrians crossing through standing traffic.
- 723 Junction of Clog Bridge, Main Street and Elliott Street. Build pedestrian crossing and roundabout.
- The crossing of Kirkgate from Howden Road into Elliott Street. We could do with a mini roundabout to help steer traffic to required road. Exit from Bolton Road towards Co-op in Bell Square, mini roundabout please.
- 725 Slow down transit through the town is the main point. Re route heavy lorries etc.
- 726 Skipton Road. Encourage parking one side of road from Bridge Street to Elm Grove. Exit from Howden Road and Elliott Street to Keighley Road. Exit from Bell Square to Bolton Road. Kirkgate reduce parking space, put double yellow lines from post office to Howden Road.
- 727 Junction of Bell Square and Bolton Road. Junction of Elliott Street and Howden Road with Kirkgate. All these have too much traffic trying to enter main through road.
- 728 Turning right onto Kirkgate from the bottom of Howden Road. Traffic lights urgently needed.
- 731 In the question of traffic congestion a 20mph zone from the 30mph sign on Bolton Road to the 40mph sign at the other end of the village, and the reverse, is in my opinion needed. Not that the need for the use of the narrowing of the road where the Blue Balls in the pavement is obsolete as the mill it was intended for is now defunct, the traffic from the factory units and on Bolton Road, has great difficulty getting out of Bolton Road. Better parking is needed for the football club the parking on the main road, and Belton Road is dangerous.
- 732 Steeton Silsden bypass roundabout.
- 733 The junction of Howden Road, Elliott Street and the main road. Perhaps relocate the zebra crossing/mini roundabout?
- 735 The clog Bridge area; access from Howden Road onto the main road. The layout at the bottom of St. John street made worse by bad parking. Some sort of safe access to the station for pedestrians walking from Silsden.
- 736 Clog Bridge. Pedestrian crossing. Through traffic ignores speed limit. Badly needs traffic lights. A629-A6038 badly needs well lit underpass or flyover.
- 737 Crossing the Aire Valley bypass at the roundabout. Bottom of Bolton Road.
- When descending Howden Road, turning right on a bicycle into John Street is very dangerous. The extreme bends outside the carpet shop prevent vehicles being seen early enough, particularly for pedestrians and cyclists. Cars go too fast round these bends.
- 739 Very unsafe corner coming over Clog Bridge onto Howden Road at junction with Hainworth Road blind corner. Also crossing road from Toyota Garage to opposite side visibility is poor, fast cars slow pedestrians too many blind corners. Scary
- 743 Bottom at Bradley Road where people park right on the junction/corner. Speeding down Woodside Road/Elliott Street.
- Junction of Howden Road and Kirkgate and Elliott street need lights. Vehicles coming over canal bridge are a constant danger to turning vehicles and pedestrians. Kirkgate opposite chip shop. Reducing limited car parking by 1 or 2 spaces would stop blocking traffic flow and the frequency of minor bangs/loss of mirrors. Visibility on zebra crossing is dangerous in these hold ups.

- 745 The pedestrian pavements through Silsden are becoming increasingly dangerous due to very heavy vehicles mounting pavements to get passed other traffic. A small toddler holding hands with a parent inches away from huge wheels horrendous. Restrict heavy vehicles passing through Silsden. Now the volume of traffic is far too high for a narrow village road. Please find a way to decrease this before someone is killed.
- 746 Main Street due to parking. Skipton Road.
- 748 Bridge Street. Bottom of Elliott Street. Bottom of Aire View. Bottom of Shed Side. Clog Bridge.
- 749 All the zebra crossings some drivers do not seem to see them. Crossing the bypass this needs a proper crossing. Junction of Belton Road and Keighley Road needs a roundabout.
- Access into Bolton Road at certain times of day, car parking should be stopped in the parking line opposite the Red Lion as this is where the congestion is caused.
- 751 The road past the cemetery top of Howden Road. Cars speed along there constantly.
- The junction at Bolton Road/Dale View would be improved by lowering garden walls to increase visibility and double yellow lines to prevent parking up to the junction. The junction/cross roads at Elliott Street, Clog Bridge which is immediately over the blind hump of the canal bridge. suggest mini roundabout and warning signs before bridge. speeding cars are a big problem both up and down Bolton Road suggest flashing 30 sign. Also on uphill side and restrictions to parking especially near junction.
- 755 Howden Road, Kirkgate, Elliott Street junction, traffic lights. Bolton road, Dale View, Pickard Lance junction. Reduction in speed limit through like Silsden to top of Bolton Road to 20mph.
- 756 The corner of Howden Road, when coming out from Mill fold at the bottom because of all the cars parking you cannot see what is coming down Howden Road.
- 758 Clog Bridge junction traffic lights. Pedestrian crossing no one stops for zebra. Bell Square lights poor visibility. Maybe a one way system.
- 759 Area around Tufton Street. Cobbled area has already been improved. Stop parking in this immediate area/vicinity.
- 760 Bypass crossing.
- 761 No parking on the high street. Increases traffic congestion, buses slowed down.
- Getting out of Howden Road to turn right it's a nightmare. It can take you 20 minutes, cars just don't let you out and having a zebra crossing right by it. Parking cars in Main street and to stop large vehicles like a bypass.
- The main danger spots are volume of heavy goods vehicles and tractors (these often way above the speed limit) travelling through Silsden. The tremendously outrageous speed of vehicles (not all) as they leave home to reach Clog Bridge and then Kirkgate (where they have to be more sensible and safer for those on foot).
- Accident waiting to happen the right turn from Howden Road onto Kirkgate. Cars come round at speed. Pedestrian crossing too near to bend. Witnessed many near accidents to pedestrians. Starting on crossing as cars swing round on to Kirkgate. Needs traffic lights.

- 766 Roundabout on Aire Valley Road possible pedestrian bridge. In Silsden junction of Elliot Street and Kirkgate traffic lights.
- 767 Crossing the dual carriageway. Traffic lights needed at the junction of Keighley Road/Howden Road and Elliott Street short sight distance from hump back canal bridge.
- 769 Problems at junctions Bell Square/Bolton Road Bell Square/Hillcrest Avenue/Bridge Street Kirkgate/Elliott Street/Clog Bridge. Mostly down to bad driving, including poor vehicle positioning, and impatience. Hatched yellow boxes could be a solution. People ignoring double yellow lines and parking especially outside the Co-op Hillcrest Avenue. Large commercial and/or poorly parked vehicles blocking traffic flow along Kirkgate.
- 770 Not my job to do this.
- 771 The bypass, crossing this is dangerous especially at peak times. A footbridge would assist especially when waling to the limited bus service.
- 772 The main street.
- 773 Elliott Street, Tufton Street, Hothfield Street make Tufton and Hothfield one way. Double yellow line out of Tufton street. Hothfield Street dentist parking is terrible can not see traffic coming up Skipton Road leaving Hothfield street.
- The top of Skipton Road onto Kildwick is very dangerous. Dare I say lady drivers, I've seen a lot talking on phones while driving. Also delivery vans and wagons same problem. They actually don't see pedestrians. Very scary. Most drivers too fast, need to reduce speed. Most local drivers aware of this.
- 775 Black spot by the dentists at Hothfield Street especially at school closing time. Accident waiting to happen. Clog Bridge into Kirkgate traffic lights.
- 776 junction Ings Way to Howden Road just above the Toyota garage. Restrict parking so near to the junction along Ings Way. A lazy resident leaves his truck there most nights.
- A the junction of Bradley Road, with Skipton Road, it is very hard to cross due to parked cars (taxi usually) on Skipton Road causing huge visibility obstruction. This should have double yellow lines. As it is, you have to look left, right, straight on and far left to cross its really dangerous.
- 779 Cars zooming up narrow Bradley Road. No cars should be parked on Kirkgate because of congestion. Lorries, buses and juggernauts cannot pass each other and mount the kerbs causing cracks on the pavement. My leg has been grazed by a car mounting the kerb by the post office as it was trying to park. Walking along Kirkgate with vehicles mounting the kerb.
- 780 the crossing at the station roundabout would benefit from a footbridge.
- 781 Bypass no over bridge. It is dangerous crossing bypass.
- 783 Uneven road on Skipton Road.
- 784 Elliott Street junction. Traffic lights.
- 785 The top of Skipton Road as it narrows it is very difficult for the cars to pass each other.
- 787 Elliott Street joining the main road, Howden Road joining the main road, Bridge Street joining the main road.
- 788 Turning right from Elliott Street into Keighley Road. Turning right from Howden Road into Kirkgate.

- 790 The junction of Elliott Street/main Road/Clog Bridge mini roundabout or traffic lights. Parking on both sides of Elliott Street for about 75 yards would help large vehicles turning. Lack of sightline at top of Woodside Road. Have to commit oneself no matter how one bends forward. Turning out from Briggate into Skipton Road/Bradley Road/Bridge Street. Bottom of Bradley Road generally as so many parked cars obscure the view up Skipton Road.
- 791 Congestion at the bottom of Skipton Road caused by cars parked on both sides of the road. Accessing Skipton Road from the top of Woodside Road some drivers do not slow down the worst offenders appear to be those travelling towards Silsden.
- 794 Main Street parking should be abandoned as it is an accident waiting to happen.
- 795 Parking on main street should not be allowed.
- 796 Crossing road for bus at petrol station as the traffic in and out going too fast.
- 798 Clog Bridge/Howden Road a dangerous bend in the road.
- 799 Corner by mill at Clog Bridge. Junction of Elliott Street and Kirkgate with vehicles over bridge.
- 800 Zebra crossings in Silsden people often ignore these I have been on the crossing many times when cars continue to drive straight on pelican crossing. Roundabout at end of Belton Road would improve congestion of traffic.
- 801 Crossing the bypass to get to the station.
- 803 Tracking up Skipton Road to Kildwick is always difficult because of volume of traffic and lack of passing points.
- 304 Junction of Bell Square and Bolton Road, traffic speeding down Bolton Road and Skipton Road.
- 805 Cross bypass from train station. Really bad up Howden Road police need to put in a speed camera or start doing checks.
- The Aire Valley trunk road above. Its very dangerous to cross the road there as the cars don't really seem to slow down. Many people have to cross it to get to the train station. Somebody I know was recently knocked over and seriously injured while trying to cross.
- 807 Silsden/Steeton roundabout.
- 808 Pedestrian crossing over the bypass to get to the station.
- 809 By both schools, due to lots of people dropping off or parking at school. Also main street is bad due to parking on road, especially if a bus or wagon is going through which is often. Should ban parking on main street.
- Town centre as it's a through road and parking creates blockages and I've occasionally witnessed silly manoeuvre through impatience due to poor parking mounting pavements and blocking view pedestrian crossing. Speeding up and down Skipton Road.
- 815 Bottom of Howden Road from Co-op across to Bells Square.
- 816 Exit to Kirkgate from Howden Road. Exit from Belton Road to main road towards river. Both require mini roundabouts as soon as possible.
- 817 Turn out of Elliott Street.
- 819 Hawkcliffe View in snow and ice. 2 road traffic accident this year alone solely because road not gritted as it used to be and grit bins empty.
- Zebra crossing in Silsden need changing to pelican crossing particularly the one near bottom of Howden Road outside betting shop. Seen quite a number of near misses where pedestrians are on the crossing and traffic has not stopped.

- 821 Both my children need to cross Howden Road (Clog Bridge area) to catch the bus to South Craven each morning. I worry about how busy with traffic on this road is, and the speed that cars come around the bend down Howden Road.
- When driving from Kildwick, on the approach to Silsden the road narrows and many drivers approach at high speed or are inconsiderate. Could be improved with clearer warning signs possibly widening of road.
- Turning right from Howden Road. Tuning right from Elliott Street. Potential blind spot from Bell Square on to Bolton Road when turning right.
- 826 Cringles park entrance bus stop.
- 828 Cars should not be allowed to park in Kirkgate, they narrow the road and cause traffic congestion especially at busy times of day.
- 830 Main street/Elliott Street/Howden junction. Parking on canal bridge double yellow lines both sides. Main Street parking outside Post Office etc. causes too much congestion, speed bumps, no parking.
- 831 Skipton Road is often used by cars and motor bikes as a race track.
- There is difficulty I crossing toad at top of Briggate. Is there a possibility of a zebra crossing being made there.
- 833 Elliott Street.
- 834 Bolton Road can be hard to cross at busy times. More traffic calming up Howden Road/Bolton Road/Skipton Road.
- Silsden high street can sometimes be a bottle neck and access from side turning tricky. Is it necessary to have parking in the main street when the car park is so near? One large petrol tanker or livestock lorry and you are held up.
- 837 Suggest traffic lights at junction of Elliott Street. Keighley Road and Howden Road. Also at junction of Bridge Street and Bolton Road. Both of these probably just at peak traffic times Monday to Friday.
- 838 Main street.
- 839 The crossing at Clog Bridge badly sighted, too many road junctions/cars/lorries fight for position/turning and not seeing people crossing. Bottom end of Howden Road corner by carpet shop and speeding young drivers coming up Howden Road.
- Parking is causing a great problem in Silsden centre as buses, lorries and cars are mounting the pavements and I have nearly been knocked down on loads of occasions. Big vans park on Bolton Road with no room to get past with pram and dogs. There should be no parking outside Aire View school at school times. Dangerous.
- Pedestrian crossing facility to access railway station bridge or subway. Don't wait for someone to die crossing the dual carriageway. Regular parking of vehicles on the double white lines areas on both the canal and river bridges especially the canal bridge. Police enforcement is the only answer.
- 843 Crossroads at North Street (Bell Square/Hillcrest Avenue) mini roundabout might help. Junction Clog Bridge/the main road/Elliott Street traffic controlled lights as at junction Victoria Avenue and Skipton Road Ilkley.
- 844 Howden Road, canal bridge and Elliott Street junction.
- Spencer Avenue is extremely dangerous. There have been a number of issue and accidents for young and old and damage to cars. I personally would be happy to contribute to the repair of the road. Please give this some attention.

- Parking in the main street outside the Post Office. The condition of the road outside the Co-op is shocking.
- The bridge over the railway, especially in winter. People stopping their cars to drop people off and people crossing from the car park, as they all seem to wear dark clothing for work.
- Crossing the bypass on foot. Ings Way on the bend where parked cars push you onto the wrong side. Double yellow lines are needed. Main road cars parked right around the bend. Parking should be restricted to just in front of shops nothing after the post box (after all parking on a bend is in violation of the highway code).
- 849 Limit weight of wagons. Traffic lights at junction of Elliott Street and Howden Road.
- Pedestrian access across bypass covered footbridge. Pelican crossing instead of zebra crossing. Restrictions on HGV's.
- The pedestrian crossing at junction of Howden Road and Kirkgate. Move crossing we do not need 3 in Kirkgate. Silsden should be a 20mph zone.
- The bottom of Howden road into the main Keighley Road, particularly turning right to Ilkley.
- 854 20mph restriction on Elliott Street/Woodside and Waterside estate.
- 855 20 mph areas on all Waterside and other estates.
- 856 Not good for pedestrians to cross the bypass.
- 857 Main street parking.
- The constant congestion in and through the main street due to HGV going through. Could they be stopped and stop using Silsden as a short cut.
- Post Office side it's a wonder there has not been an accident, double yellow line would help.
- Junction of Howden Road and Kirkgate. Imagine this has been discussed at length already. It is a difficult one to solve.
- There is no pavement on the right hand side of Bolton Road above the allotments. Trying to cross Bolton Road to and from Brown Bank/North street is difficult. A pavement would enable pedestrians to cross away from the corner.
- 865 Car movement (and buses) access Bell Square/Kirkgate/Bolton Road not good suggest traffic lights. Improved drainage near bus stop shelter Bridge Street gets flooded on a regular basis (kerb side).
- Crossing Bolton Road any time of day from the memorial/library garden to the top, cars are too many too fast. It's a great danger surprised there aren't more accidents plus dangerous overtaking and mobile phone car divers use. Also another nightmare cars parked on kerbs/paths, paths are for people walking safely without having to dodge cars.
- 867 Outside town hall zebra crossing. Outside schools. Junction of Bell Square.
- Out of Howden Road and turning right onto main road with zebra crossing encountered immediately, lights? Coming out of Elliott Street and turning right to canal bridge, lights?
- 870 Bottom of Elliott Street trying to turn right is a nightmare as cars fly over bridge, should be a flashing sign showing motorists the speed they are doing to slow them down.

- Getting out at the top of Hothfield Street into Skipton Road is very dangerous, cars park right on the junction and you have to pull out into the middle of road to be able to see what is coming. The problem is mostly during day and appears to be people that are visiting the dentist and working at the dentist are parking without any thought for people that are pulling out onto Skipton Road, I always thought the highway code stated you had to park so many feet away from a junction. Some traffic coming over canal bridge into Silsden do so far too fast, I know of many people myself included that have had to move very quickly off the zebra crossing because they have no knowledge it is there. Perhaps more signs saying there is a zebra crossing before bridge or some form of traffic calming, the digital sign up Bolton Roads works very well at slowing traffic down. Perhaps that could be considered for the canal bridge area.
- 876 Junction at end of Elliott Street needs traffic lights.
- 878 The crossroads at Bridge Street and all up Skipton Road. Marking on the crossroads and better use of the indicators at Bridge Street, make one side of the bottom end of Skipton Road double yellow lines.
- 879 Bolton road, there is no crossing and many cars and motorbikes speed down this road. I live on this road and I am fed up of cars, lorries and vans pulling onto the pavement outside my house constantly on a daily basis. Leaving only a gap of 2.3 feet from my door to the vehicle.
- 880 Crossing the roundabout to train station, both directions.
- 881 Road by the CO-OP outside Sunny Bank, it is crumbling away. Clog Bridge, Kirkgate, Elliott Street needs traffic lights, badly.
- Parking cars on main street. Lorries trying to get down main street but have trouble because of parked cars.
- 884 Speed humps, big ones.
- 885 Exiting Clog Bridge. Station access.
- The main road through Silsden should bar all large vehicles. The road is not wide enough for large lorries, trucks etc. These can be seen on a daily basis mounting the pavements.
- 888 Coming out of Howden Road end out to main road nightmare.
- 890 Coming out of Elliott Street and turning right.
- 891 The Kirkgate and Briggate areas. Elliott Street, difficult access to Keighley Road and Kirkgate because of cross roads and bridge. Howden Road, difficult access.
- 892 The main road through Silsden, particularly on a Saturday morning. Cars parked at the end of Dale View make it impossible for cars to get out safely and also driving in.
- The by-pass going to the train station, maybe a bridge or underpass. Howden Road by the laundrette could do with a crossing.
- Aire view, cobbles at the top, crazy at school times. Parking on Main Street should be stopped, people drive on pavements to park, avoid traffic.
- 896 Elliott Street pulling out onto Keighley Road put traffic lights.
- 897 New road, no use as one way, very dangerous. Suggestion, traffic to be one way on Aire View and new road, down Aire View and up new road, with resident parking only as I got a ticket due to not being able to park at own property.
- 900 The bypass crossing, the bottom of Elliot Street and the bend in the road near the post office.

- 901 Crossing by-pass very dangerous. Parking around schools, on corners, end of roads, blocking viewing points to cross, to cross for pedestrians.
- 902 Parking along High Street in Silsden, by post office. Cars often get bumped there and increases congestion. I think Silsden is well provided by parking and do not think these bays are essential, especially between 7.30-9.00 am and 4.6pm.
- 903 The junction of Kirkgate, Keighley Road, canal bridge, Howden Road, Elliott Street. Traffic lights necessary.
- 904 Lack of footpath on route to Steeton, Silsden station at river bridge area. Left and road side from Silsden.
- 905 At the bottom of Elliott Street and Howden Road that is a really bad junction, install traffic lights. The speed at which traffic goes up and down Bolton Road, speed cameras would stop this.
- 906 Bell Square cross roads, needs better lines or signs. Junctions at the bottom, zebra, Elliott Street, Howden Road. Bell Square Kings Arms junction to Bolton Road. Speeding traffic up and down Bolton Road needs calming. Silsden main street stop parking but cal traffic speed.
- 909 Main Street, Clog Bridge zebra crossing is difficult to see and need re painting. Motorists often do not stop. To get to the main street of Clog Bridge, Elliott Street and Bridge Street can take ages. Traffic lights may help or mini roundabout.
- 910 Exit from Belton Road, traffic lights or mini roundabout.
- 913 Howden Road, Elliott Street junction.
- 914 Crossing road to reach station, a bridge would be best solution.
- 915 Getting out at the bottom of Elliott Street.
- 916 Stop parking for the Main Street.
- 918 Where I live here at Cringles Park, exiting the park in both directions the speed of vehicles coming round the top bend, 2 to 3 seconds is all we have to either cross the road on foot or pull away in our cars, remember that the ages of residents here vary from 60ish to 90 years.
- 920 The main problem seems to be bottom of Howden Road, Clog Bridge, onto main road, also Elliott Street junction with main road. The three pedestrian crossings on the main street are useful but motorists not familiar with the town do not seem to see them especially if traffic backed up.
- 921 Crossing the bypass to get to the station.
- 922 Some cars and lorries still do not take a lot of notice of speed limits. Main areas up Howden Road and area of bypass, I also thought that only lorries that were delivering in Silsden area were supposed to go through the centre. It seems that it is being used as a short cut rather than using the min routs. Therefore more control is required if I am correct.
- 924 Difficulty getting out of Howden Road to turn right can be quite dangerous as people get very impatient. Traffic lights? Mini roundabout?
- Junction of Howden Road, Main Street and Elliott Street. A double mini roundabout, give way to traffic to you right, 20 mph speed throughout Silsden. Give pedestrians right of way on Main Street. Blue badge parking only. Traffic does not give way and blocks the junction when stopped.
- 927 All street in Silsden should have 20 mph limit i.e. Howden Road, Ings Way, Elliott Street, Skipton Road.
- 929 Kirkgate speed limit 20?

- 931 Outside Cringles Park, you take your life in your hands, the speed they come round the bend. It should be 40 near Cringles and longer double yellow lines, there is 68 houses at Cringles and over 100 elderly people, if these houses were all down Bolton Road the speed limit would have to be 30. I have lost count the number of cars that crash into the stone wall coming up Bolton Road on the bend, a lot do not get reported. At Cringles Park we all live in bungalows not caravans.
- 932 A mini roundabout at the junction by the Kings Arms and at the junction of Howden Road and Main Street. Also a pelican crossing is needed across the main road to the park entrance at the cat steps.
- 933 Stop cars parking right up to road junction.
- 935 The roundabout near the rail station crossing from the station is a nightmare.
- 936 Footpath by Silsden Football Club needs widening. Crossing the bypass to get to the station. Street lighting from the roundabout up to Silsden.
- 937 The beck, when people feed the ducks, the ducks come onto the road which is usually busy.
- 938 Traffic coming over canal bridge too fast as pedestrians crossing is close. I have personally been almost knocked down on the crossing.
- 939 Silsden main street.
- 940 Yes in main street in Silsden with too much street parking on both sides of the road.
- 944 Walking to the station is difficult because of the bypass. A safe crossing would be appreciated.
- 947 Access from Banklands Lane into Bolton Road. Access across bypass to station.
- 948 Bolton Road traffic too fast.
- 949 The centre of town is very congested nearly all the time because the parked cars limit the road to one-way traffic. We need a parking ban all along the main road and then unrestricted parking in the side streets. The main car park is a bit too small and always full but the pricing is reasonable.
- 950 Pedestrian crossing of A629 at Steeton and Silsden roundabout making pedestrians access to railway station difficult. This would be greatly improved by the installation of a footbridge. Very poor road markings at Ings Road roundabout Keighley A629 making lane discipline difficult.
- 952 Coming into Silsden over canal bridge, Elliott Street, zebra crossing and Howden Road.
- 953 Silsden main street. Gloucester Avenue cars speeding. Silsden/Steeton bypass (crossing).
- 954 Main street Silsden. Drop off point at station.
- 958 Silsden main street on weekends, revellers running across road in front of cars for dares. Usually young and inebriated young people congregating outside pubs spilling out onto the road.
- 962 Through the centre of Silsden we need yellow lines to stop parking its like a bottle neck.
- The parking of cars near the post office and near the beck causes danger when large lorries, buses etc. are trying to get past.
- 965 Road junction at Keighley Road and Elliott Street with Howden Road. Bell Square with Bolton Road. Possible traffic lights needed.
- 968 Speeding on Elliott Street.
- 969 Most junctions through Silsden are dangerous. Right up to Tannery Corner then

- its good.
- 970 Hothfield Street vehicles travel up and down too fast opposite a school. All times of day, but mostly in the evenings speed bumps please.
- 972 Bridge Street Bolton Road junction lower wall around Purple Garlic to allow sight line.
- 973 Howden Road speeding. Taxi drivers should watch their speeds.
- 974 The junction at which Howden road merges into the main road through the village. Along with the access to Elliott Street many potential accidents are waiting to happen. Is it not possibly for some safety scheme to be, light? Mini roundabout?
- 975 Lower end of Skipton Road due to parking on both sides of road. Consider parking restrictions.
- 976 Traffic lights needed at Clog Bridge/main road entrance.
- 978 Danger spot turning right out of Daisy Hill at the bottom. It's a blind spot. Toyota garage on Craven Drive so much parking and moving of cars. Zebra crossing outside betting shop. People turning right out of Howden Road often don't look for pedestrians crossing.
- 980 the main road at post office. I have witnessed car mirrors being broken off. Parking on bridge by canal.
- 981 A footpath bridge over the road to get to the station.
- Oars coming over the canal bridge into Silsden sometimes quite fast. If your crossing the zebra crossing at bottom of Howden Road sometimes a bit scary. Bell Square cars can shoot out in front of you when your going up Bolton Road and there has been accidents there.
- Obviously Kirkgate is the major problem. Parking is essential for access to shops, but that narrows the road for HGV's etc. Access from Elliott Street would be improved by the placing of a mini roundabout on main road at that point. Speed on Skipton Road is also a hazard.
- 988 Station drop off very silly.
- 989 The main Road through Silsden. I don't know why cars have to park on it, you struggle to get vehicles past each other. Vehicles sometimes have to mount the pavement. Cars shouldn't park on the main road, especially when there is a car park there (which is free for 30 minutes).
- 990 Entry onto Skipton Road from Park Green and ash tree sticking into the road towards Silsden.
- 991 Bolton Road the cars etc. go far too fast. The crossings cars don't stop and because they can park on the main street that means some cars mount the pavement because when larger vehicles are there that means no room.
- 994 I think you should stop parking on the main road in Silsden, maybe just have disabled parking. Just getting through Silsden at peck times is chaos. Maybe traffic lights at Howden Road for people getting out of there in a morning is hard.
- 996 A6034 through Kirkgate very narrow due to parking. Difficult for large vehicles such as buses and emergency services to pass. Lower end of Skipton Road is the same. Suggest removing parking facility on Kirkgate.
- 997 Pedestrians having to cross the bypass.
- 998 Main road. Bradley Road. Cringles Road. Hillcrest by Co-op. Main Road in and out of Silsden.

- 999 Crossing Pickard Lane/Bolton Road could do with traffic lights there. Speed limit on Bolton Road is 30mph some do 100moh. Could do with speed cameras. Also crossing bypass roundabout could be done like Cross Hills.
- 1000 Zebra crossing. Should be pelican crossing stop lights.
- 1001 Pedestrian access to station with underpass or bridge. Parking in town centre. Suggest slightly widening road in conjunction with improving area adjacent to the beck I.e. by the Post Office. Elliott street situation.
- 1002 Roundabout on the bypass. Pedestrian/cycle flyover or underpass.
- 1003 Bell Square junction lights. Silsden, Steeton roundabout.
- 1004 Crossing dual carriageway from Silsden to the station.
- Parking through high street in Silsden Kirkgate and by the fish shop. By Post Office should be stopped. We have a car park just at the top of Silsden.
- 1006 Access from Howden Road to go up Kirkgate always difficult impossible at times. Traffic lights would help. We really need a bypass before any more development. One road through Silsden is a bad situation especially in an emergency.
- 1008 Kirkgate.
- 1010 Congested main street.
- 1011 The junction with Clog Bridge/Elliot Street feel a mini roundabout may be helpful, also pedestrian crossing is too near Clog Bridge junction. Speeding cars on Howden Road maybe 30mph signs on road.
- 1013 Crossing the main road to the station. Bridge or traffic lights.
- 1015 Bus usage of narrow road at top of Skipton Road near pump house (water). Make area 20mph limit.
- 1016 Junction of Clog Bridge and Kirkgate needs lights.
- 1018 None only the dual carriage way.
- 1019 Kirkgate/Elliot Street/Clog Bridge junction. It needs a mini roundabout at the least better still traffic lights activated by vehicles needing to exit Clog Bridge and Elliot Street.
- The main problem is mainly the roundabout at Steeton and Silsden station between Silsden and Steeton, being a pedestrian.
- 1023 Main street parking. Parking inconsiderately on both sides of roads especially by the football field.
- 1024 Main road past Cringles Park. Residents are mainly elderly and despite signs drivers disregard them. This problem has been raised many times.
- 1026 I think we have enough houses in Silsden. What about schools when there are more children, cannot build on them much more. Should have been a new school years ago.
- 1028 Pedestrian tunnel or footbridge across Aire Valley trunk road by Steeton and Silsden roundabout.
- 1029 Crossroads, Silsden to Keighley. Howden Road across to Elliot Street (before canal bridge).
- 1031 Parking on residential streets creates many hazards especially for very young and old.
- 1034 Elliot Street Clog Bridge main road. Traffic lights would improve this junction.
- 1035 Bolton Road by outside Cringles park.
- 1037 Howden Road, dangerous corner at Waterloo Hill Apartments. Since the alteration of road.

- 1038 The exit from Howden Road onto Kirkgate.
- 1039 Steeton Silsden roundabout.
- 1045 Bell Square when crossing to the supermarket.
- 1046 The congestion in Kirkgate caused by parking and the number of HGVs using us as a short cut to A1 etc.
- 1050 Parking in Skipton Road. Car owners parking within 10 meters (32ft) of road junctions. Particularly the corners of Tufton Street and Hathfield Street. This makes exiting these streets very dangerous as one cannot see traffic travelling either way.
- 1051 Junction of Airedale Factors to Brownbank Lane.
- 1052 The main road through Silsden.
- 1054 Never go out alone.
- 1057 Spencer Avenue full of holes. The crossing at Steeton bypass.
- 1060 Bell Square Bolton Road. Howden Road main street. Traffic lights at both would slow traffic through the town.
- 1061 Spencer Avenue. Road surface crack and depressions upto 6' deep in parts where vehicles slalom their journey to avoid the troughs. Need to, at least, cover salient area with spot tarmacing before accidents occur.
- 1062 Put double yellow lines from Post Office to the flower shop so articulated lorries can get through and introduce parking from Twigs to cafe instead!
- 1064 Bell Sq unction and state of road outside Co-op. Motorists failure to stop at crossing outside Town Hall. Clog Bridge junction.
- 1066 Volume of traffic using Kirkgate and parked cars, junction of Elliot Street, Keighley Road and Clog Bridge.
- 1067 Kirkgate is far too narrow for cars to be parked on both sides.
- 1068 Crossing near roundabout on bypass.
- 1073 Speed is the worst thing in Silsden.
- 1074 Too much speed through Silsden.
- 1077 The end of Bolton Road on to Keighley Road and Howden Road into the village.
- 1078 Bolton Road/Bell Square junction. Elliot Street junction. Parking in Kirkgate.
- 1079 Bolton Road. Bell Square, Hillcrest Avenue as taxi use this like a bus depot to park, turn or park on double yellow lines at Co-op door.
- 1080 Exit from Elliot Street onto main road. Maybe traffic lights (part time).
- 1081 Zebra crossing by Howden Road.
- 1084 Crossing on foot the bypass to get to the station highly dangerous.
- 1086 Road end where Howden Road joins the main street (Briggate), congestion very bad in the morning and tea time, especially when turning across oncoming traffic. However, traffic lights, similar to those at the junction of the 'The Flappitt' public house on Halifax Road.
- 1088 Main street (parking issue!). Clog Bridge junction. Cobbled area (refurbished mill) very dangerous to cars passing both ways.
- 1089 Silsden main street.
- 1091 Bell Square. Kings Arms junction. Kirkgate.
- 1092 Zebra crossing by Town Hall. Cannot always see people waiting there if there is queuing traffic (pelican crossing).
- 1093 Turning right at the end of Elliot Street onto main Keighley road due to speed they come over the canal bridge.

- 1094 Crossing to and from the railway station/Steeton some form of overpass as underpasses appear unsafe during quieter times.
- Parking within 20 yards of Dale View, Pickland Lane, Bolton road (yellow lines). Prevent parking around the bend near duck pond, this area is a constant danger especially when cars exit opp Post Office.
- 1096 Getting out of Bradley Road into Skipton Road too many parked cars blocking view. Also quite a few unadopted roads are seriously dangerous to walk on and motor.
- 1098 The centre of Silsden is becoming a rat run because of the use of sat navs by having lorry drivers trying to save fuel and time. It could be possible to restrict by weight, except for deliveries, why not!
- The Silsden bypass, I cannot understand why they were allowed to not include an underpass or footbridge over it. I put my life at risk twice a day crossing this road, the traffic will not stop for you! The traffic in front of you stops but the other lanes keep going, it's an accident waiting to happen!
- 1101 Elliot Street/Howden Road junction, very busy at school times. Also it's very difficult to cross Howden Road near Clog Bridge safely because of lack of visibility from both directions plus it's made worse by frequent parking on the cobbled area reducing vision even more.
- 1102 Getting out of Howden Road and the Co-op.

- 16 a good mix of houses brings in a mix of people to maintain a healthy balance.
- 20 any houses built must have 2 off road parking spaces
- 23 some infill building but nothing out of present boundaries
- There is not adequate public amenities for the number of dwellings in Silsden at the moment. ie no public toilets; limited off road parking; Hard standing play areas; Road/Street/pavement maintenance poor at the moment.
- 30 Silsden is a village community and any more houses would mean we would lose this as well as losing important green areas
- 32 There is sufficient rotation of property to meet needs and small/ cheap enough property if the government assisted first-time buyers.
- 36 Green spaces and fields should not be used for building, brown field sites are plentiful.
- 38 No new houses
- 40 Above all we need affordable (but not built on the cheap)homes for local young people to be able to buy their own first house. If Bradford approve a load of family homes, They must improve public transport, sewerage and drainage systems, schools, the town hall, and the general appearance of Silsden main road before they start not forgetting Spencer Avenue. They have been benefitting for far too long from Council Tax on new homes without spending a penny to improve the superstructure of the town
- 41 there are plenty of unused propertys in silsden, by all means build some more in the gaps and on old industrial space, but lay off the green bits
- 52 The present housing mix is just about right.
- There should be no new housing until they have upgraded the roads, schools, parks, shops, sewers, medical care, dental care AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT.
- Build only on Brownfield sites. Make sure all infrastructure improvements are made before any new housing developments are started. These include a bypass to relieve the traffic jams on Kirkgate, main sewerage improvements, schools (both primary and secondary),policing, fire station health services etc. There is no evidence to support the idea that Silsden needs new houses anyway!
- 57 I don't feel that anymore housing should be built here until the facilities which we have at the moment have been improved
- 62 Silsden's infrastructure such as schools, doctors, roads, water and sewerage systems are totally overstretched with the present capacity and could not cope with any extra housing/residents

- 75 Lack of infrastuctures and finance to support additional housing without putting residents and services to current housing at risk.
- 76 Local kids can't afford to buy homes in Silsden.
- 81 There are too many three story houses with only two people living in them.
- 82 Vitally important that town infrastructure is not swamped by new houses to satisfy government targets. This will ruin the feel of the town and it's countryside position. The countryside is a major reason people like the town, additional housing would destroy it.
- 101 Affordable housing but not cheap. Cheap will attract the wrong people to Silsden. We need to stop people who buy up cheap housing placing anyone they can in them for rent. People who own their house are much prouder and keep the standards of the area up.
- Housing in Silsden is too expensive for most residents who hav lives in Silsden all their lives. Ie. Moving out of the family home and wishing to purchase in the area.
- 108 Please don't build on our countryside it's what makes Silsden special
- 109 If more housing is needed, I don't think it should be large estates. Small groups of houses in a few different sites would be more easily absorbed, particularly on brown field sites.
- 114 Before any new builds in Silsden a BYPASS should be in place. Silsden main street is not fit to take the traffic already using it.
- its hard to buy a house in a good price range with a good amount of storage or space inside them, if or example cannot access my attic its too small an opening and the bedrooms are small too, my babys room has the boiler in there.
- Homes should NOT!!! be constructed simply to allow over spill from Keighley and Bradford's non working ellite somewhere to live on housing benefit. The homes should be for people like myself that don't want to move away from the family just yet but are forced to live with parents because house prices are SO expensive in the area.

- 143 More affordable housing for first time buyers with potential to work on a scheme for local people to buy one
- 144 enough houses doctors cant cope now and sewers and main street traffic
- under the present climate, housing should be on hold, there are plenty of houses here unsold.

- 174 The infrastructure can't really support much new housing.
- 182 we have more houses than the drains can cope with now
- 188 Replace some of the 'council house' style housing
- 191 More control over houses/buildings left empty for long periods of time
- 196 Silsden has a great stock of good quality terraced housing, much of it stone built. I would like to see some assistance given to home owners living in such properties and areas to improve the external environment in terms of hard and soft landscape and planting, traffic calming or traffic control and provision of more off street, safe and secure parking. All to generally improve the external quality of life for those living there.
- 197 The development of housing has already outstripped the facilities. Water supply is very much reduced. Access to estates is minimal. Schools, libraries are inadequate for a larger population. Local shops are closing, traffic and antisocial behaviour is increasing. Only police presence is a community support officer. Sometimes.
- 199 Please do not allow developers (Barrats, Wimpey etc) to install their poorly planned housing estates that do not foster a sense of community. Hundreds of little boxes with no thought for green spaces, childrens play areas and well thought out planning priciples are not what Silsden needs. If new housing is to be built, we need a fresh, modern approach of which there are many good examples across the country. Please do some research!!!
- 201 if more housing is to be developed in Silsden, we need to be seriously think about improving the towns facilitys structure i.e. our own secondary school, lesuire complex better town erigation and upgrading of sewage and local econompy and wellfare faciltys(new health centre instead of the 70's throw back that is and child and youth programs)

- This was once a nice small community. Too overcrowded now, schools are packed, too many cars on the side roads.
- 211 We should have lower tax rates for people who look after their homes and add value to the village.
- 213 We need a bypass before more houses are built
- 216 Too many new houses in Silsden will ruin the community spirit which is why we moved here. The schools are full to capacity & the sewers are already overloaded.
- Any housing development will incur huge infrstructure costs that could nt be met in the current financial situation or the forseeable future. A cost/ benefit analysis needs to be done by an unbiased agency rather than relying on information provided by the builders' federation.
- 218 Silsden is big enough now and to me doesn't have 'the community' spirit, small town/large village feeling we moved here because of this and Silsden has grown so much it's too busy.
- 219 The town needs to encourage more families to move in but the infrastricture needs to be in place first.
- 222 Councils allow developers to build houses (particularly affordable housing) due to the government incentives but make the mistake of not improving infrastructure and supporting community so you end up with overcrowding based on the facilities. You build a bunch of houses in Silsden and you need more parking (esp at train station), you get even more traffic and so forth. Everything gets worse and people like me move elsewhere to quieter villages. And don't even get me started on affordable housing and the erosion of society!
- Detached and semi-detached housing encourages different age groups...but overall I would not want to see any more housing as the village is big enough already
- 230 Silsden is big enough. It does not need any more big housing estates. Make better use of the derelict sites.
- 234 Existing buildings that are unused could be either converted into new homes or the materials used in the demolishing of these buildings could be re used to make new homes on the site rather than new builds in currently open spaces
- 236 Silsden is over housed, the road network is congested and many of the plans being accepted are ridiculous causing added congestion and dangers
- 240 Please please stop bradford council building more homes in silsden. This is green belt and they are determined to ruin this amazing village by filling it with low cost housing. No more homes in silsden.
- 245 I'm concerned about the nature of Silsden being changed by too much housing particularly if it encroaches on green belt. There are also issues about access, traffic, congestion & infrastructure
- 251 Silsden's roads are already too congested. If more housing is built this would mean more traffic and even more congestion.
- 253 Feel quite strongly above the number of homes that are vacant in the town at present...Why would we want to invest and take away green areas of our town in order to over populate the Town. There are sufficent houses available. No need for any more
- 254 Would need roads improving to service any new housing.

- A pedestrian walkway over the bypass to the railway station. A new access road from the bypass across the river to the cemetery area of Silsden. A sports and leisure centre, similar to Keighleys but with a larger swimming pool. Any new houses should be in keeping with the MAJORITY of the houses in the same area.
- 261 Do need more housing but not as much as proposed in the LDF due to infrastructure and educational constraints
- The town does not have enough facilities eg schools to support an increased population. Also drainage/flooding problems would only get worse.
- they should respect the vernacular architecture and the traditional use of space, people need gardens and yards and allotments.
- No point building anymore homes until the following getting sorted Doctors, school and better road structure as it is nearly as bad as the M25
- 269 I feel that Silsden does not have the infrastructure for the number of houses here currently so no more should be built until this is adressed taking into account any furter population increases
- 279 The town is big enough as it is.
- 283 Houses should no loner be built in Silsden above 2 stories. buildings looking like 18th century wharehouse should not be allowed, because:- They look like industrial buildings. Cause tunnel effects on streets and paths cutting out light. Are only built to increase number of houses per acre have no regard to surroundings and appearance which we have to live with for many years.
- The infrastructure in Silsden simply cannot take many more new houses! I 288 understand that there is a proposal to build 1700 houses over the coming years. This brings tears to my eyes. Silsden is an absolute bottleneck, I queue everyday to get out on to the main road. The increased number of vehicles as a consequence of such a proposal would be catastrophic, let alone the increased volume of people wanting to park to use the village centre services. The pressures on an already over stretched health centre, dentist surgery, Post Office, the Aire Valley Trunk Sewer, parking at Steeton Station (never managed to get a parking space there yet!) would simply be too much for the services to cope. Also to cope with such demand, the previously proposed eastern by-pass would completely destroy the surrounding countryside which so many villagers enjoy on a daily basis, this is the reason why so many of us have stayed here so long. Let alone the damage to nature & it's wildlife. There just isn't enough employment in this area to offer work to so many, they would have to commute & our roads & station cannot support this. I accept that some disused land scattered around the centre of the village could be used for new homes but not the beautiful countryside. Bradford Met should look to Brown belt areas first, there are hundreds in the Keighley & Bradford area!
- Silsden cannot take the strain of many more new houses. The infrastructure cannot suport it. There is very little work here, houses should be built where the work is our roads & train station cannot cope with such demand, neither can the doctors, dentists, town services & sewers. Will bradford not stop until they destroy our village until is turns in to chaos & destroy our countryside. Build in built up areas that can cope & have the work available, ie Leeds, Bradford, even keighley

- 296 Gloucester Ave caters well for the older person but the properties are in need of looking at for the future although they were refurbished it is not the answer to an ageing population. Look again at the overall picture. The land area would provide for fround floor accomodation. The stair cases are not fit for aged people. If these sheltered accomodation were demolished the whole area would provide bungalows ground level accomodation looking to the future. I am fortunate to live on ground level. The bed sits are too small. If someone needs care at home at nights they are not adequate.
- 299 More accomodation for older people.
- 300 Need more bungalows for older people. There are too many flats and appartments but no council owned and run bungalows. Not everyone can adapt to life in flats.
- 303 As a recent home buyer the housing in Silsden is cheap compared to places like Skipton however they are still expensive. The new builds are to jam packed in and it needs to be better housing at a cheaper price, a large amount of housing could be created in lower Silsden and onto the hills near the reservoir
- 304 There are already many houses for sale the only barrier to house sales is lack of deposit monies due to high prices and lack of employment for young people
- 307 We have deep concerns about the sheer scale of the proposed housing developments in such a small town as Silsden. Any developments must be preceded by major improvements in infra-structure i.e. schools, roads etc. The mass development planned would completely ruin the nature of Silsden and it's surrounding countryside.
- 310 Silsden will lose its small town/village feel if it is developed further. Traffic congestion is already a big issue.
- 319 Silsden is already losing it's community feel. I don't want it to loose any more. I want to live in a place that people care about and feel proud to belong to.
- Silsden seems to have a good range of housing. It has a plentiful stock of cheap 322 and mid-priced terraced housing offering good value and good-sized accommodation suitable for young couples. It also has a good stock of both established and more recently built semi-detached housing suitable for growing families. It has had more recent flat and apartment style housing built that suits singles or occasionally coupled individuals. It has established bungalow style stock for older residents. Silsden already requires better and expanded infrastructure, especially: access and connecting road transport and its satellite requirements; schools at all levels - primary, secondary, FE; retail outlets; light industry and service sector for employment; sewage, electric, communications; entertainment venues. It cannot survive on a diet of dilapidated and unadopted roads, two-room pubs, hair-dressers, take-aways and butcher's shops. Building more housing without planning and building the necessary infrastructure will not attract people. There is a serious risk of simply producing a lot of empty housing stock and reducing the value of the existing stock. The town might also benefit from a greater provision of housing stock to fill the gap between semiand bungalow style housing, ie. housing that could attract more affluent individuals to the area who are best placed to support greater value-added in local retail and entertainment venues and potentially offer the entrepreneurship that could develop local employment. Why should the bosses not also live in Silsden? Given the geographical location, surrounding countryside and good rail transport links, as the likes of Ilkey and Skipton (or their smaller counterparts like

Addingham and Cononley) become financially further out of reach for aspiring professionals, perhaps Silsden would be better placed positioning itself to attract this 'aspirational' market, rather than the already very competitive market that is catered for by local towns such as Keighley, Bingley, Crosshills, Eastburn etc., I see this as a rather unique opportunity and given the medium terms economic outlook (i.e. growth taking over from recession), could be well timed.

- 337 Silsden needs to retain its character as a mixed small town. There is a danger of it becoming a suburb for well off commuters to Bradford and Leeds if only large detached houses are built.
- 338 Survey required to determine types of housing needed to meet local housing need. more housing will help support local shops services and public tansport.
- Would hate to see the proposed 1700 houses built in Silsden, although I can understand there is a need for some new houses but certainly not on this scale and without adequate provision of other facilities.
- 348 Infrastructure will not stand any more housing
- Houses built should blend in with neighbouring properties and be affordable to a cross section of the public. Empty properties/old buildings industrial or otherwise should be adapted/ utilised where possible and surroundings sympathetically landscaped.NO dwellings should be built unless absolutely necessary.
- I think there is insufficient infrastructure to substantiate any type of additional housing in Silsden. The local schools are nearly at full capacity, the sewerage system can't cope with any further housing. The local health centre can't cope with the number of patients it has now and certainly can't cope with any additional residents.
- The village has no capacity in its infrastructure to take more housing: schools and roads are already full. The Roads are in a very bad state of repair. Traffic is already jammed through the village main street and is effectively single file and dangerous to pedestrians. The Health centre is tired and has had its redevelopment plans stopped, so is already inadequate.
- 353 Affordable housing to buy is becoming an issue for young people in the area. The cost of rents prohibits young people from being able to save for deposits and mortgages.
- 356 ONly if Facilities grow to match

- 361 hrumph!
- 364 I worry about how my teenage son and daughter will be able to afford housing anywhere
- 366 No more houses should be built in silsden ,just update the ones which are here .Keep it a good small community!
- 368 More homes for elderly and mobility impaired needs
- 369 Better Quality of New Houses needed

- We need to keep any future building in line with some of the original buildings in Silsden like the original terrace houses. NOT build 3 storey houses which do not fit into the surrounding areas like the houses build on Bradley Road and the houses on Howden Road. Please dont let them build any more Lego type houses like we ahve at the bottom of Waterside.
- 374 The price of renting in Silsden is too high we need more low cost housing for families such as myself who have to struggle along paying £600 per month for a 3 bedroom terrace house
- 376 Too many locals have been priced out of town. Silsden is now just a commuter town.
- I would not support building on greenbelt land or greenfield sites there are a lot of properties for sale in Silsden and brown field sites that could be used for development. If to many houses are built in Silsden it would change the Area and lose the Village feel.
- 387 silsden dosent need any more houses, the existing infarstructure can not support extra homes, drains, roads etc
- 401 Local credit union to help first-time buyers obtain mortgages.
- 405 Obviously some new houses need to be built but only if services are sustainable
- 410 Housing should be in keeping with the village and should not be allowed to sprawl out into the countryside
- 413 Silsden should NOT expand any further outside it's current perimeters. Any new housing or developments should be strictly limited to brown field and derelict land.
- The industrial area should be developed and 'real jobs' (not warehousing or retail) should be created before building new houses. A large development of housing without new jobs in Silsden will only create a dormatory town.
- 416 Anu future developments should not detract from the 'village' feel of Silsden. Particular attention must be placed upon this!!!!!
- 417 Don't need more houses. There are plenty up for sale lets sell them first.
- 423 Very few bungalows for people downsizing or retiring. Very few affordable 4 bed houses!!
- 429 Cheap 1st buyers for locals. Better drainage sewers. New school.
- 430 Use as many brown field sites as possible.
- 431 None.
- 432 Silsden is as big as it needs to be. We don't have the infrastructure to cope with more people. Bradford Met as no interest in Silsden, everything is done by locals, cleaning the beck, putting up Christmas decorations etc.
- 436 More housing or people or cars is not of concern personally but the roads are congested. Access out of Belton Road and Howden Road is difficult about 4.30 6pm. It as shame the by-pass road has been stalled for now.
- 437 Silsden has expanded enough.
- 443 No more houses to be built in Silsden especially on green fields.
- I feel strongly that the main road through Silsden could not cope with any more vehicles passing through, particularly as parking is allowed on one side, which it is very difficult for wagons to come through. I also feel there is a surplus of houses already, many of which are for sale or to let.
- The character of Silsden needs to be maintained. Green field sites need to be preserved. Development of the brown field sites is necessary. New housing

needs to be of stone.

- 467 Until better infrastructure is in place, creating more and more houses is unnecessary. Many houses are for sale but not selling if we continue to have a mentality of building for jobs we will end up like Southern Ireland where brand new housing estates are now being torn down. There has been quite enough housing built in Silsden over the years.
- 477 No more housing.
- 483 Not enough new detached houses being built. Don't want low cost houses except for the young local people.
- 489 As stated before I think there are sufficient houses in Silsden.
- Whatever is built parking areas should be necessary for homes and spaces for visitors. Parking has made a lot of areas in Silsden very tight because a lot of older housed which where built obviously when no vehicles owned.
- There is enough housing already for Silsden with Bradford MDC insisting that we should have more. There are not enough school places for children in the local schools and with Ilkley Grammar over subscribed already, older children have to travel miles to get to school.
- The room sizes on new houses are an issue for me and so although I feel there is more need for smaller starter homes these need to have fewer rooms of better proportions.
- 497 Too little knowledge to comment.
- There are many, many houses for sale in Silsden, why do we need more housing. We don't have room in the schools, traffic congestion at peak times is a problem and we don't have enough useful shopping.
- As the population increases Silsden has to accept the need for new houses but the infrastructure has to be improved in readiness sewage disposal, roads and schools.
- The more houses, the more people. The more people, the more work for our tradesmen and trades people.
- 509 Low cost housing for local people.
- 517 There isn't any need for any more homes being built in Silsden. The roads are too crowded anyway. Schools would have to be made bigger. Sewers couldn't cope. NO MORE BUILDING IN SILSDEN.
- New housing provision should be limited to a maximum pro rata with increase in population and not used by Bradford as an easy option to satisfy the building industry. It should be sustainable growth!
- 531 Silsden has got big enough. To expand more would spoil the village.
- 537 Silsden property generally more expensive than other local areas, we need to have affordable housing to allow young people (families) onto the housing ladder. Also decent accommodation for single people of any age.
- I do not want houses built on fields with rights of way as I use these to gain access to open country.
- The infrastructure at Silsden is stretched to its limits, therefore more housing would put more strain on the facilities and cause even more traffic congestion.
- In and around Silsden there are always houses for sale. Some inexpensive, others not so, but all reasonably priced. The problem is not that there are not enough houses but that mortgages are scarce and require a large deposit.

Some houses are on the market for 2+ years.

- 542 Housing should be restricted to infill sites only.
- 548 If they build anymore houses they should be affordable terraced houses.
- We have enough houses, the Main St is very congested, also by the Co-Op junction, the schools cant take any more children. Bradford built council houses East Dene (etc.) Sackville Road, all the houses used Hillcrest Ave and Spencer Ave all these years and now wont make the road up (its a disgrace) the council also receive rates from two more estates up there, Kilsney Fold, Hunters Glen etc. they all use the road. When the council houses were built the council made half a road on Sackville Road nothing has ever been done to the road, it has virtually disappeared (its like a Beck bottom) disgraceful.
- Too many houses now and no new schools, also more children in the village with not enough for them to do.
- 552 There has been too many, too quickly. The town is loosing its character.
- Not in agreement with new development in living accommodation but conversion of any derelict property, warehouse, mills etc. helps maintain a pleasant environment.
- Pavements in areas of Silsden (residential areas) very poor. Patched, weeds, collapsing edge stones, look scruffy.
- 563 No comment.
- No further building required especially using green belt land.
- 567 More local authority property.
- 568 Please think about water supply and local facilities.
- 571 Large housing developments are totally inappropriate without improved sewage infrastructure, schools, medical facilities and parking. Also Silsden is a total Bottleneck at rush hours at the moment. If there are road works or vehicle breakdown, there are delays of half an hour or more just to get through the town. Ambulances/fire services are frequently struggling to get through.
- 572 Too many new houses has changed the character of the village already more new houses will make it worse.
- 573 Encourage house builders to come to the town but control what materials they use with a mix of one to 5 bedroom houses. No housing associations in any development.
- 578 I think there is a good mix, though I am looking for a bungalow and there are few on the market.
- There is already a traffic problem in Silsden, more housing only aggravates this. Silsden's charm is its rural village/town atmosphere, which is shattered by this heavy traffic flow (especially lorries and other large, noisy vehicles). Just stand on the High Street on any day and try to hold a conversation, impossible to hear for the traffic and that vibration must have some impact on buildings etc.
- 580 Silsden cannot cope with more people it will lose its community feel. The road, schools, drains cannot cope.
- Low cost housing should only be available to residents already living in Silsden. It is not acceptable to treat Silsden as an overflow for Keighley.
- 587 Lave our open space alone.
- 588 Plenty of houses for sale in Silsden. No more required unless business

- development is increased.
- 592 Silsden infrastructure (roads, education etc.) cannot support more housing as it stands.
- 594 Silsden has plenty of houses. Please don't build more.
- 596 I do not feel sufficiently qualified to answer the above questions on housing.
- 597 Not enough spaces in schools for the amount of new families in Silsden.
- Feel Silsden has enough houses and more would be problematic because of the roads, not enough schools and general infrastructure.
- 603 No more houses. No room in schools. Too many cars already.
- 608 New build should only be available when say less than 10% of existing houses are for sale. This ensures present housing stock is sold and not left unsold with new houses of wrong price being built. More council houses should be available 2/3 bed.
- 609 Until the main infrastructure I.e. roads, sewages, police, schools, health centres are improved to there should be no more building in Silsden. Leave the fields green.
- Anymore building would mean losing our countryside. I can remember leaving the main street in Silsden you could be in fields etc. straight away. Now for a pleasant stroll you have quite a way to go to get past built up areas. We become less like a village every year. Dead against anymore development.
- If more new houses are to be built then the infrastructure needs to be vastly improved. Silsden could already support a secondary school of its own and more houses would mean that this would be desperately needed. Local employment would also need to be improved.
- There are plenty of vacant properties in Silsden without building more.
- 619 There is no new houses being built than first time buyers could afford.
- Because of the traffic on the road through the village more housing would add to the congestion, pollution and general safety of the population.
- Would be concerned that local schools could cope with additional numbers.
- The proposed massive influx of properties to be built in and around this area is ridiculous, the towns and cities in the area are fast becoming dead due to poor planning. More use of land in the towns and cities should be developed before moving into the surrounding areas, and causing long travel times and congestion in certain spots such as Keighley centre, Shipley and Saltire, all of these places need sorting out before adding to the congestion.
- Too expensive housing at the moment. Not enough facilities to cope with current housing. Doctors cannot cope. School need high school, more nurseries.
- 668 If many more houses are built the roads will be even more congested than they are at certain times of the day. The schools would need to expand which wouldn't be an option as there is no space. I feel Silsden is big enough as it is.
- Too little attention is paid to the impact of new housing locations on road, traffic and school provision.
- 670 Silsden is big enough. Sewerage/schools/roads/jobs more housing means more people which overloads the already full all of the above. Also more people could lead to more crime, vandalism, fly tipping, litter, drug and alcohol related problems and possible violent muggings etc.
- 672 If we have more houses, we need to make sure the school has enough places for local children.
- No point building new houses if town infrastructure cannot cope.

- There are already problems with the sewer at Steeton, being fed by Silsden and Steeton. Are schools going to be big enough. There would be more cars, making roads more congested.
- Far too much. Its killing the character of the town and the infrastructure simply cannot cope with the increasing volume of traffic. We need a school improvement for primary.
- 679 Recent developments begin squashed together way too much. New developments always cause parking problems.
- No more green space should be used for building.
- Need more bungalows for older people. There are many flats and apartments but no council owned and run bungalows. Not everyone can adapt to life in flats.
- Would not like to see large scale building of houses. I do not think the infrastructure or the present basic layout would accommodate any massive changes and would spoil the character of the place.
- 688 Use brown sites only to build upon.
- 697 The infrastructure is not available in Silsden to support any more new houses.
- 714 All future housing development within the current housing extent, no green field sites. Use of brown field sites only.
- 722 With all the extensive terrace housing in Silsden (low cost housing is not required) but extra 3-4 bed housing would help Silsden develop a better range of housing stock.
- The more expensive new builds seem to sell well but brings new people in rather then helping local people.
- 725 Cant answer this. Suspect there is a need for affordable, decent homes.
- 726 Judging by number of houses for sale there is no need for further building from sheltered housing.
- Any large increase in number of dwellings must be regulated by existing facilities e.g. local roads all already very crowded especially at peak times. I understand that the Aire Valley drain sewer is operating at almost full capacity. Are there enough schools to cope with large increase in population?
- The infrastructure would not be able to support any significant increase of housing (and resulting population) in Silsden. Water/sewerage system would be unable to cope without massive expenditure to improve them. Extra traffic resulting from a housing increase would lead to traffic congestion, plus additional wear and tear on roads which at present are far from satisfactorily maintained. Where would the additional local jobs come from? The last thing we need is for Silsden to become even more of a feeder town to towns/cities in the WR. The local school would be quite unable to cater for any sizable increase of junior pupils.
- 732 No more housing.
- 733 Have lived in Silsden all my life (52 years) and seen it go from a lovely village to a town that has expanded into beautiful countryside while maintaining it would seem amenities only suitable for a village.
- 734 If lots more houses built, Silsden will be linking up with other villages and lose what we have, not Silsden anymore.
- 735 The temptation is for all of us to say not in my back yard. But, Silsden should bear its share and maybe more. We need to encourage younger families they will benefit the town as a whole.

- The town houses near the top of Banklands Lane (on right) have spoilt this rural area which was originally all bungalows (detached).
- 739 Bungalows close to town centre/transport to shops adaptable for old people if necessary, by owners themselves. Like Briardene bungalows, with some nice outlook and outside space. To rent or buy. Suggest Bolton Road area.
- 743 All houses are too expensive.
- 744 To help get the housing market going in Silsden, young people/couples need affordable homes. Recently we've just had in fill small development of quite pricey homes.
- A lot of new build houses in Silsden are only suitable for short term buyers and buy to let. This detracts from community feeling. Refurbish old houses and existing properties into permanent family homes. Phase out the existing planning that allows 3 or 4 apartments in a family size space. A lot of permanent home buyers are avoiding Silsden due to the general deterioration and a very high buy to let and couldn't care about community landlords.
- 746 There's no more room for housing without taking up more green belt land.
- 747 Gloucester Avenue caters well for the older person but the properties are in need of looking at for the future although they were refurbished it is not the answer to an ageing population. Look again at the overall picture. The land area would provide far ground floor accommodation. The stair cases are not fit for aged people. If these sheltered accommodation were demolished the whole area would provide bungalows and ground level accommodation. I am fortunate to live on ground level, the bed sits are too small. If someone needs care at home at night they are not adequate.
- 748 More accommodation for older people.
- 750 Can the schools/roads/sewer cope with an increase in housing.
- 751 Not long moved to this area so cant really comment much yet on this topic.
- Any more housing in Silsden area would require the appropriate improvements to the sewage system which seems to be at full capacity, if not inadequate now. Also required would be a secondary school for the town. South Craven School is already extremely large and is not easily reached by public transport from Silsden.
- More small units are needed 1 or 2 bed for the elderly and young people starting out. Not 3 storey, 4 bed that people cannot afford. But this housing should be on a small scale/Brownfield sites or infill to retain the open spaces surrounding Silsden.
- Recent developments seem to have been restricted to brown field sites and developing ex mill accommodation, this is fine, any encroachment into greenbelt is wrong, Silsden is big enough.
- 758 There are a lot of older people in Silsden and hardly any sheltered housing. Also not many bungalows. No houses should be built without 2 off road parking spaces, too many cars and nowhere to park.
- 760 Silsden cant cope with more houses roads, doctors, schools etc.
- 761 Would be against any large housing/social housing development.
- 762 Most houses are boringly similar.
- The current infrastructure would put current residents at risk. There is not the finance available to rectify this. The risks and detrimental effects of any more housing would be overuse of water supply and sewers, lack of sufficient education and health provision and policing, traffic congestion.

- 766 If the population in Silsden is increasing them the need for new development cannot be ignored. As a new resident in Silsden I cannot comment on what types of housing are required but I believe it should be in character and serve the needs of the existing population as well as newcomers. the needs of young local people should not be left out and there should be some provision for social housing.
- 769 Silsden has reached its limit and should not expand any further. Any limited new housing should only be built on brown field or derelict land.
- 770 I do not live in one being a lorry driver.
- 771 Enough housing currently.
- 774 We don't cater enough for the elderly and disabled people, they need bungalows not 2 story flats e.g. Gloucester Avenue. How does an elderly person walk down steep flight of stairs to put their washing out or go to their bins.
- 775 Low cost and specialist housing on Brown field sites and existing building conversions.
- 776 Sykes Lane site should be the last development in Silsden. No more building on green field sites. Use the 1000 acres of brown field sites already available to Bradford council. There is a huge empty site in the middle of Bradford start there.
- 777 If any building small houses built on brown site land.
- 778 Silsden roads are really congested the last thing we need is more houses.
- There are enough housed for sale without building any more. No way should the green belt be encroached upon. It should be preserved.
- 781 no more houses. Silsden already has too many homes. Lots for sale and plenty for rent.
- 787 Silsden will not be able to cope with more houses unless parking, road conditions, sewage system, schools, doctors surgery are improved first.
- Many of the houses built recently, attractive as they are, have very small token gardens, not suitable for families with young children. Many do not have garages either, which again tends to restrict them to a certain section of society. If we have family homes built, i.e. 3 bedrooms or so, I'm sure these would be very popular. However, it would mean putting in other new infrastructure such as a new junior/infant school, as the existing ones seem busting at the seems. Already, neither school has any green land to expand. This could be on one of those empty sites opposite the garage.
- 799 Silsden has already been over developed and existing green spaces should be preserved for the future. Understanding a need for more housing the council should concentrate on low level developments of brown field sites, regenerating derelict land where possible.
- There is new enough housing in Silsden, considering the limited local facilities. There is certainly no need to build houses on green field sites.
- The Silsden roads are not adequate enough at the moment for even the current rate/amount of traffic.
- 807 Local people out priced.
- 808 I don't feel that Silsden can cope with any more housing. The infrastructure cant cope with the village feel to the town will be lost.
- 812 Not lived in Silsden a long time so cannot pass comments.
- 813 It would be nice to think that young people who want to remain in the community

- are not forced out.
- There are plenty of houses for sale in Silsden ranging from inexpensive to stupidly expensive. There can not be any need to develop the surrounding fields (except for the profit of a small number of individuals).
- 826 We need a Morrison's supermarket.
- 830 There are enough houses up for sale in Silsden for people to purchase.
- 834 Fight all plans to build on Greenfield sites/bypass etc. Silsden must not grow.
- 836 The roads wouldn't cope with an increase in housing. Silsden is the right size as it is now.
- I think it is a complicated issue and links very strongly with employment, but a good balance of value/styles is important. Perhaps we have too many bungalows already? Preserve old property by upgrading where possible to keep hold of history and maintain a good mix of architecture.
- There are plenty of housing and office blocks in Silsden that are empty so no need for any more. When houses or office blocks are built they are never finished properly.
- Development of brown field sites only. Bo further development on the flood plains. No encroachment to green belt surrounding town. Upgrade of sewer system before any major development inclusion of provision of leisure infrastructure by developers in any future substantial development leisure centre, cinema etc.
- Any future housing should be only considered alongside future school provision, employment opportunities and available retail provision.
- Although housing is needed, the infrastructure of Silsden will not cope with more housing. More cars etc. The roads, drainage system, schools are all already working to capacity.
- 847 There is enough already we should build a comprehensive school or a sports hall.
- 38 years ago Silsden was a fantastic place to work and live most people who lived in Silsden worked in Silsden. Silsden is large enough it has already lost its identity as a village and is not a small town. The infrastructure cant cope with more houses and we wouldn't want industrial units not for Silsden.
- Housing should be balanced and not targeted to specific types but designed with families in mind and affordable. Major building programme on green belt should be avoided. A balanced building programme across the whole of Silsden is possible.
- Not happy about developers cramming detached houses on land that would accommodate more small houses and taking into account that a lot of households have two cars.
- 855 Room for housing development on land to left of canal bridge, as you approach Silsden I.e. from old Weavestyle mill onwards.
- 860 There should be low cost housing for young families.
- Any housing development should take into consideration of back up facilities schools, shops. The closing of Barclays bank in Silsden doesn't help.

- Housing is important but should suit needs of the towns people and not making tow into a commuter place to live. It is a small town and should remain so. We are already experiencing an array of foreigners who are not born in this country so where are they working and why didn't a Silsdener get the job. The type of housing should suit our youngsters who are starting out and then progress to small family housing. Larger housing not as important because this means commuter who work out of the area and we have to think of the environment.
- Where else to build other than green land. Housing increase would need development of town infrastructure e.g. health and school development.
- 878 There should be no more housing without increasing the schools in the area. A secondary school is needed with a larger primary school, infant school.
- 879 Before any new housed are built, a bypass needs building, as the traffic congestion needs relieving. Also the sewerage system needs upgrading to cope with more housing. A new school will need building as Silsden children have to go South Craven. We do not want new houses on greenbelt land. If we have new houses it should be affordable housing for local people not for wealthy commuters who put nothing into Silsden.
- We have too many houses, the roads can't cope Bradford Council do not keep up the footpaths. We need roads making up to houses round to Laithe Close, awful when it rains. Breakmoor Avenue, Sackville Road never been surfaced since the houses were built.
- 882 We need a new health centre.
- Is Silsden a smokeless area? As I can smell bad fumes, worse in winter because of that I feel very tired walking, carbon monoxide. Bed sits are only for people without much interest in life. I like to live not to be restricted.
- 885 Council needs to push for small houses for first time buyers.
- We disagree with any more homes being built in Silsden it is big enough now.
- 888 Don't want anymore housing of any sort.
- 891 There are plenty of houses, more would mean more traffic problems.
- 894 I think it is very important that we keep Silsden a respectable, ice, safe place to live and do not let it go the same way as Keighley, Bradford and other run down areas that are now ruined by letting the wrong type of people move in.
- 896 If more houses are built the main road cannot cope with the capacity of traffic coming though the town as there is too much now, especially HGVS, the schools would need to be bigger, health centre also we would also need a larger supermarket.
- 897 Limited rental properties and very expensive. Affordable family homes are needed to buy/let and possibly retail purchases, why not bring that back?
- 902 Again, need to consider infrastructure to support more houses, residents e.g. in principle, specially adapted homes is positive but Silsden not easily accessible generally to wheelchair users.
- 903 Like many other Silsden residents, I feel that Silsden is probably as large as local facilities, drainage, sewerage etc can support. I am particularly against new building being undertaken on green space.
- 904 More opportunities for young people to gain access to housing market.

- 909 Silsden has grown dramatically over the past few years and has become a dormitory town for commuters to Bradford and Leeds. Silsden cannot support the number of houses planned for the future. The infrastructure currently available cannot support very much further growth. The schools are full. The doctors cannot cope, the road system is badly congested and the drainage system in inadequate as is public transport. A large part of the green fi3eld area is flood plain and not suitable for housing.
- Other facilities i.e. Schools, leisure provision will be needed if substantial house building goes ahead.
- 920 I would question whether the towns infrastructure would cope with the influx of more housing. The roads and side roads are already badly congested with traffic. There would be extra pressure on schools, health services and sewerage which were not meant to deal with so many extra families, vehicles etc.
- 922 Too many new houses would mean more traffic, congested parking in town and station.
- 926 Help for local young and fist time buyers.
- 934 Silsden is unable to take anymore houses. The infrastructure is unable to support more building. Traffic is a large problem. More houses means more cars. The town centre is extremely busy already. We don't want more houses/traffic.
- 935 We should fight all plans to build on our green fields.
- 937 That too many new houses have been built in the last 10 years. We don't have the resources e.g. schooling, water and sewage provision. This will also increase the amount of traffic to an unacceptable level. Therefore, pollution will increase, noise, risk of accidents, more difficulty parking.
- 939 Silsden housing position at the moment is quite adequate.
- 940 We do need more low rented homes in Silsden for local people that live in Silsden as we had put in for a 2 bed flat and the housing association told us that we could not have a 2 bed flats as there is not so many flats in Silsden and they like to give them to outsiders.
- Three story development at back of Methodist is out of keeping with rest of village.
- 947 Being a Mill town there's lots of terrace properties for starter homes. Future building should enhance the town. Definitely not 3 story.
- 948 There appears to be quite a large number of houses currently for sale for months at a time in Silsden. Do we really need more developing?
- The brown sites alongside the canal which are unsightly should be developed on and any other industrial land could be used for housing. The green fields and the barrier between Silsden and Steeton should be left as they are. There are plenty of eyesores which could be improved on first.
- 952 Silsden is big enough. There is no more room for 1700 new homes. New, larger schools, are needed. What about sewers and drains, traffic congestion if anymore are built?
- 953 More rent to buy housing. Enable and encourage more young families to the area and also opportunities to buy/own their own home.
- 960 The present infrastructure of Silsden does not easily lend itself for much future development I.e. a poor through road system, tight parking in the town centre areas and few loading and unloading facilities for local shops. Hold ups frequently during business hours because of severe overcrowding on the roads

and streets.

- Too many houses not enough amenities. Its too busy now. We need better schools and better supermarkets for more houses. What we have now is good for what we have.
- 965 Stop Bradford placing immigrants into vacant council properties.
- 971 If building more houses what about sewers and rains. These will need replacing and more built. Also don't we need schools? Possibly 4 estate agents all with window full of houses for sale and let why do we need more.
- 974 If a few more developments are to be our young people who find it almost a no to be able to pay large deposits on a new first time home might be glad of small selection of terrace houses or cottages at more affordable rates for purchase or rent. For Silsden to support all the housing suggested in proposal by Bradford etc. we need seriously to revive the capacity of the infrastructure or we are in trouble.
- 978 Houses built will only make traffic worse. The get out at Dale View is dangerous. The get out at Daisy Hill is dangerous. The wait to get out at Clog Bridge from Howden road is lengthy at the best of times. The schools are already full without any extra housing. Empty houses should be filled before other are built.
- 979 I have only been a resident for a short time and am unaware of housing developments in Silsden so do not feel able to answer the above.
- 982 The houses in Silsden are not selling as it is, we do not need to disrupt any more green sites. If we keep building and expanding Silsden it will loose its heritage. We need to keep Silsden as it is and stop it becoming a large unsightly mess.
- 984 More houses means more facilities which we wont get e.g. bigger and better health centre, schools, post office, more banks, better parking. The houses that are for sale now don't seem to be selling so why build more.
- 987 The burgeoning of new build/commercial conversion in last 20 years, with loss of some local facilities has led to greater pressure on roads and rail service.
- 988 Very poor planning controls. Still have brown field sites to develop. Get rid of eyesores first. Much better landscaping many more trees.
- 989 Silsden is over crowded as it is. More houses means more people. Silsden facilities are not good enough doctors, dentists, schools, roads etc.
- 993 If more houses are built more school places/another school would be needed.
- 999 Nothing too modern please.
- 1001 An appropriate mix.
- Need to ensure that the infrastructure e.g. transport/drainage/education can support any new housing requirements. Use of brown field sites where possible. Developers to produce community resources e.g. play area/gardens open to all residents as part of agreement for them to build on land and make profit. Need to preserve green spaces on Aire Valley corridor to keep Silsden separate.
- 1003 If we have to have more houses, lets have some of the corporate services we pay for. Swimming pool at Hothfield Street is for infants up to 6/7 year old. No good for adults and older children.
- 1006 Plenty of houses for same many empty. The main road, schools and other services are always overloaded.

- 1015 Encouragement to update and improve existing housing.
- 1028 We in Silsden need a good mix of all types of new housing.
- 1059 Don't need any more housing. The infrastructure we have can't cope with what we've got now. Numerous drains blocked up as soon as we get a substantial downpour floods!!
- 1062 Totally against it.
- No thank you to massive estates and thousands of people. At the moment, the drainage, schools, shops, police, crime containment and traffic just could not take any more building. Nor could we. Silsden was and still is a nice place to live. Why would you be so intent on spoiling it completely along with every other village in Yorkshire.
- 1066 Before any new development in Silsden, traffic problems, schools, drainage, and the protection of green belt must be given priority.
- 1069 The canal towpath through Silsden needs upgrading to a better surface but with provision to slow down cyclists.
- 1076 The sewers aren't big enough to accommodate all these houses! It's bubbling up in some gardens! My brother-in-law commented on this 14 years ago, he was a heating engineer!
- 1078 No houses until roads etc improved and bypass built.
- 1079 Bradford Council are unable to provide services that local people pay for at Silsden's present size e.g. dustbins, gritting, street sweeping, lighting, toilets. We don't need any more building, except possibly on derelict brown field sites. BUT not green field sites.
- 1080 At the moment the road through Silsden is very busy, also would the doctors be able to cope with a large influx of people.
- 1081 Services, nature of environment i.e. flood plain, should prohibit further development. Too much ribbon development in Aire Valley.
- 1083 Think there is enough housing development in Silsden.
- 1094 Whilst housing is very important a balance against the area needs to be considered. Existing housing stock needs to be better used before new builds are allowed.
- 1095 Severe lack of housing for anyone wishing to move away from terraced housing. All new properties that have been built instantly create parking issues. Typical examples 4 bed canalside properties with parking for 1 car and garages which are far too small or narrow.
- 1096 Would move from Silsden if a great deal more houses of any kind were built on the hills around Silsden, one of the reasons I moved here was for the views and that Silsden wasn't too big in 1999. It is getting too big now.
- 1097 None, road through Silsden too busy now.
- 1098 Any homes built should show priority to local residents.
- 1101 It's no good just building homes if people have to leave to go to other places for shopping in earnest and other facilities, like a jig-saw, all the pieces need to be there.

- while i like living in silsden, it does have its draw backs,no bus transport to skipton, and also it just lacks something special, skipton has a castle and high street with market stalls, and they have special markets through the year, this all draws in tourists and there fore creates jobs, i know you cant just build a castle, but silsdens biggest asset has been there years and is not used to its full potential, the canal, skipton holds aboat festival every year and the town is buzzing with activity over the bank holiday weekend, drawing in thousands of tourists, and why not hold a street market on briggate, on a thursday, or any day that skipton doesnt, obviously selecting traders that dont take business off local shops, this would bring local people into town, who normally have to travel to kieghley or skipton, is this called thinking outside the box?? thanks for reading
- 28 I couldn't fill in some of the spaces because it blocked me therefore I find this census unusable.
- 30 I would like to see more swimming pool provision in silsden as the Stanley bell pool is a little small with limited facilities for the size of silsden.
- 32 Greater use can be made of the park area following the sucess of the bike/skateboard area. The picnic site needs to be more obvious and the land beside it needs to be developed as a nature site. The canalside is ripe for tourist development in association with the Canal and River trust. If Snugpack ever left their mill it would be a good site for flats/small hotel/canalside reataurant. Boaters need more canalside information of available attractions- cycle route, Millenium way, restaurants, cafes, pubs, churches, local events. (Signs such as those on the Dales Way in Addingham.)
- I really do feel the dog mess left around the area lets Silsden down. I am always struggling to avoid with my baby slung or in a pram. The pavements along Skipton Road and towards Aire View Infants are very bad. I feel more fines should be enforced, but more bins should be provided too.
- Anti social behaviour and a lack of permanent policing is a problem. Dog fowling and litter is an embarrassment. Sports facilites such as a decent swimming pool and gym/sports hall and dedicated coordination of community activities would improve the community. Check out the Geelong web-site (Australia) for an amazing community effort and Burley in Wharfedale's adult education centre and other community activities.
- 41 no thank you, if i was aware of this last year and years before i would have got involved, as i said before if i can be of use i will help i have little spear time but silsden is worth it, sam ive evamis66@gmail.com
- 42 Too many drugs in silsden
- I really think Silsden should be kept as a 'local' town, small businesses should be encouraged and large companies like Tesco discouraged. Part of what makes Silsden unique is that it has retained a lot of originality and while I think it's a shame a lot of the variety in local shopping has dwindled, I think Silsden has a very good chance of becoming an excellent self sufficient community.

- 49 Some farms in the Silsden area are untidy and do not encourage return visits from walkers of the Millenium way.
- 52 I would be available for a public inquiry
- Just to say once again that until the infrastructure is vastly improved that there should be NO new house building. The village is already past its limit.
- 57 There shouldn't be any expansion of the village until the infrastructure has been overalled. Don't feel that the village needs expanding especially building on green field sites. What about the nature and the wildlife?
- 61 Less takeaways and more restaurants would benefit silsden!!
- 64 If the housing stock in the area is to be increased it is essential that the infrastructure is improved first. Schools, Medical Centre, Police Presence, Emergency Services Response. Capacity of sewage & water services.
- 69 Before the infra structure of schools, health centre and condition of roads are improved more housing will only encourage more problems for Silsden than already exist. The town has already out grown it's potential of the services provided. By taking away the police station and the inevitability of the closure of the fire station. Silsden is not and will not be a safe place to live. It is difficult now to get an appointment to see a doctor when one is required; with more housing it will be impossible as the health centre can only hold so many people at once. As it is now the condition of the health centre is poor and needs improving or rebuilding. The empty stores and little employment, Silsden is not conducive to people wanting to stay in Silsden and it will become more of a Dormitory town rather than a community. Involving young people to take a pride in their community through projects via Scouts, the Churches or Community Centre Silsden could once agai in become a place to be proud of not to trash or want to get out of it as quickly as possible. Once the young leave for South Craves High School or other schools they rarely return to be part of where they grew up.
- 71 Silsden, like all other places, needs more houses
- 72 Before any real development of Silsden is undertaken infrastructure MUST be improved: road congestion, sewerage, schools, transport and facilities for the retired.
- 15 I am concerned about the proposed building plans for new housing because the infrastructure and finances required would be unable to support increased drainage, sewage, water supply, adequate provision of education and health services. There would be increased traffic which would have an impact on road safety. All these points would increase the risk factors for current residents and be detrimental to the current community.
- 76 It wouldn't let me complete the problem footpath answer. Jackson's farm woodside rd is a problem.

- 177 If the proposal to build 1700 new homes was carried out it would change for ever the character of the village of Silsden. Before any development took place the infrastructure; roads, sewage, education, employment etc would all need to be improved at Local Authority cost and in this present economic climate where would the money come from certainly not from the builders. The increase in population would require a new bypass because although the traffic through Silsden at present can be heavy with up to 1700 new houses (and this could be increased with higher densities) it is unreasonable to expect the existing roads to cope with the increased traffic. I understand that parts of the Silsden sewage system are almost up to capacity, again a major problem. Similarly new schools would be required or 'bussing' to larger schools. New employment oportunities would also be required or it would become another dormatory town losing its identity. In conclusion it is inevitable that some development will take place from time to time but it should be at a pace that the local community can cope with.
- If there is a need for more housing due to the increase in population then more bungalows and sheltered housing should be built. Then when we all get older we can move out of our three and four bed homes into the new smaller ones insted of going into care homes, which would free up the larger homes for young familys.
- 84 driving through Silsden is a nightmare due to cars parking in the main street, there is perfectly adequate parking nearby. when two large lorries meet its a traffic jam and sometimes involves them driving on the pavement

- 100 More Police walking around and a manned police station is needed The Zebra crossing outside the Town Hall needs lights as it is rather dangerous children and elderly as cars do not always stop and some speed past it. A footbridge or some form of public access to allow people to cross the bypass to get to the train station.
- 101 early bus to Bradford please, they don't have to be frequent. More pub foody type places, this will attract more local tourists. I live in Silsden because it's as far away from Bradford city as I can be and I'd like to keep it that way. I'm not against any type of immigration but I am against vast immigration that we have seen in Bradford. It hasn't improved the place at all and has created numerous micro communities. Silsden is a nice example of what a town or community should be.
- The roads and footpaths in Silsden are terrible. They are full of cracks and holes. Especially outside Hothfield and Aire View schools. ALSO The speed limit in Hothfield Street MUST BE ADDRESSED! As there is a school directly opposite my home, cars, motorcycles and vans, very, very regularly exceed the speed limit by a GREAT DEAL. Speed bumps should be applied!
- Love living in Silsden but would hate to see the countryside ruined by developments either housing / businesses. Waste land on lefthand side coming from Steeton to Silsden needs tidying up because it's one of the first things people see on their journey to Silsden.

- 106 Silsden has become too large and is losing its identity. There is no longer a sense of community. People who have lived here all their lives (ie born and bred in Silsden) are priced out of the property market by people moving in from affluent areas.
- Silsden has had a very interesting past history, this along with the old buildings should be kept as original as possible whilst still providing for modern living. Silsden can grow so long as the facilities are provided to ensure that it never becomes a dormitory town feeding the bigger cities around it.
- 117 do some think about parking round the schools.
- 135 Silsden is a very nice place to live better than anywhere else locally. Don't spoil it
- 137 I'd like to hope there will be adequate youth facilities provided in the coming years as it makes sense to provide kids growing up with a chance to be involved in things that will help inspire them and help them flourish instead of losing them to boredom and all that can come with it. Better for everyone in the long term. Also, I have a young child and have used the Children's Centre facility a lot, so would like to see the facilities they have to continue.
- 139 THERE IS YET ANOTHER PROPOSAL FOR A DISPROPORTIONATE INCREASE IN HOUSING FOR SILSDEN.BRADFORD COUNCIL BLATANTLY SEE SILSDEN AS A MILCH COW TO PROVIDE FOR IT'S HOUSING 'NEEDS' TO GENERATE COUNCIL TAX REVENUE.
- 140 Silsden seems to have a high proportion of its dog owners that don't pick up dog poo, this is particularly a problem on pavements and send most days trying to get my children to school without getting covered in dog poo, highly unpleasant and unhealthy.
- 142 no more new houses and maintain the roads in the countryside
- The Town Hall, could be used for meetings, recreational more a 'hub'of the community- as far as I'm aware it was the cost of hire then no-one uses it.I cannot see the point of paying to park it dfeatrcts from using the shops in Silsden and then motorists are using side streets, residents cannot park, and causes blackspots for motorists, bottom of Skipton Road also added to by taxi's parking. Since the banks have closed or on reduced openings, Silsden has become a place you drive through, as the shops (we cannot dictate what we have) are mainly hairdressers and food outlets. It doesn't help having over zealous council employees therefore go to Post Office, Newsagents and groceries elsewhere. With reagrd to this survey, this was passed on to me by a resident in Silsden, those of us who live on the outskirts are omitted from receiving any literature from the Council, we are like second class citizens
- earlier question wouldn't accept text: Location of poor lighting on the path between Craven Drive and the park towards Wardle's motors
- 156 My bug bear is dog fouling, particularly on Elliott Street, Aire View & Hothfield Street all roads used by children to go to school. It is disgusting & I think the people who don't pick up after their dogs should be made to work in RSPA kennels, or similar.
- Dog fouling is a constant issue and most streets in Silsden seem to have a problem with it. More bins need to be provided and also wardens to monitor those who don't clean up after their dogs and fine them.

- 161 Silsden is at a perfect balance. Any bigger is going to put too much strain on the facilities, roads and community. Jobs, bringing in businesses, and tourism need to be the main focus for the town in the future, as is looking at renewable energy.
- 162 Dog fouling is a large problem in silsden especially round the schools
- 171 a bypass might ease congestion and speeding through the town
- Police patrols are very rare. last year saw an influx of of driveway 'layers/tarmacking'. These people were a constant nuisance and appeared to be on a cash only basis. It is intimidating, to young and old alike, to have these people targeting areas.
- 181 I think that Silsden should have a warden targeting people who don't pick up dog mess. The majority of Silsden is a disgrace and if we are to attract tourists to the town we need to act on this and fine owners.
- 183 Dog dirt is a bad problem with it on the streets and in the park.
- 184 I have mentioned it already, but Silsden is a great place and has so many great features and brilliant people but is absolutely blighted by the massive amount of dog dirt that is everywhere. Take a look at Silsden.net and you will see that it is mentioned time and time again and so many people, including the mayor I understand, who posts on there that it's terrible, dont ever pick it up (not literally...)
- Something seriously needs doing about dog fouling in Silsden. I walk both my children to school and the amount of dog fouling is horrendous. it is literally everywhere. My children and always coming home with it all over their shoes, its disgusting.
- 190 Dog fouling in Silsden is rife. I have friends who visit from Liverpool who call Silsden 'Dog sh\*\* city'. It's an embarrassment. There's dog sh\*\* everywhere. Pavements, the park, even my garden and I don't have a dog. I also think parking on pavements should be stopped. It seems to have become acceptable for people to park cars on pavements as traffic wardens and community support officers turn a blind eye. If you want Silsden to be on the map then clean up the dog sh\*\*, clean up the beck, and stop illegal parking. Instill some discipline. Silsden has much natural beauty and with a little bit of effort could feature on the map.
- I have only lived in Silsden for a short time, having previously lived in suburban Leeds. I find the transport links to Ilkley and Keighley good, the leeds and Bradford train service very useful. Access to lovely countryside locally and to the wider dales great. Shopping for quality food is good for a small place. Overall a very pleasant friendly and convenient place to live.
- 200 Making more land available for allotments would be beneficial to the village
- When asked the question re which areas of bridle/footpath I had a problem with it wouldn't let me complete the box My answer would be the canal side. It is very over grown, covered in dog mess and generally not well kept.
- 207 Perhaps it would be beneficial to encourage community support/involvement to improve and maitain Silsden Park. It is a large park for the council to maintain, however it has a lot of potential. A lot of money has been put into the children's facilities, flowerbeds and other planting would enhance it further.
- Overall Silsden is a nice community but we don't want it spoilt with the wrong type of developments and immigration of new people. We want it to be a safe village and a community to be proud of.

- 212 In answer to the footpaths difficulties: The footpath that leaves Swartha Lane (heading in the direction of Brown Bank Lane) to the right, next to a farm and just round the corner after a small row of houses, which takes you through a small wood and past an old aqueduct, has inadequate signing on leaving the wood over a stile, such that it's totally unclear what is the legal route towards the craggy hilltop.
- 217 There is a special history and character to Silsden which would be in danger of being swamped, diluted, or lost entirely if it was turned in a massive domitory area.
- 219 More dog bag bins would be useful e.g.top of Skipton Rd, with free bags avaiable in certain areas (like on entrances to Ilkley Moor). Purpose built parking for Horse trailers would encourage more riders (like at Bingley St Ives lower car park).
- 225 One of the best recent developments in Silsden is the bandstand a real focal point and has improved that area of the village
- Our move to Silsden (6 years ago) has been a very happy one. It is a lovely town with a friendly supportive community.
- 234 More thought and consideration should of been taken for residents of Hainsworth Road when allowing the businesses to move into Ryefield Road Industrial Estate as there have been several complaints about noise from workers until 11.45pm. This is outside their working hours ande is causing much distress to us as residents and home owners.
- We like Silsden, however it is already in my opinion as developed as it can support, the road network is dangerous to want to develop any further which would only lead to more problems. Green fields and large gardens don't seem to be valued, because although the parish council may reject planning proposals Bradford Council invariably over-rules and allows unsympathetic developments. If silsden continues its expansion it wont be too long before it is used to connect Keighley to Skipton and we will just be living in the centre of a metropolis.. what next another supermarket already on the cards I believe, maybe we'll have a Tesco as well, this wont be the Silsden I love, then we'll leave.....long with many more, then you'll have another Bradford or Burnely with rows of derelict housing...
- I feel very strongly that a safe pedestrian crossing is required at the roundabout on the dual carriageway. At present the crossing is only suitable for people that can sprint. I think it puts people off walking to the railway station or Steeton which further compounds the problem of traffic congestion. I think there should be a lower speed limit for the roundabout and its approach. Speeding through the village particularly at night is a problem.
- 245 Silsden environs are richly endowed with footpaths which would facilitate more walking. Off road bike riding won't work as not so much in way of suitable rights of way. concerns that too much housing will adversely affect green belt & associated facilities
- 247 More dog mess bins, look at speed of cars coming into silsden from top of skipton road from kildwick, please consider gritting some of the cul de sacs on the estates as they are inaccessable when it freezes and there is not room from sixty plus cars to park on woodside road, its dangerous

- I think it has been a big mistake to allow the newsagents in the centre of Silsden to be an off licence. Surprised Silsden council did not intervene. Do we really want Silsden to go back to the days with large groups of teenagers drunk and causing damage to property.
- 251 I think the main problem in Silsden is dog fouling.
- 253 Survey is an excellent idea, which I welcome. I do hope that the feedback information is acted upon and the results and published for the people of Silsden...But please no more new builds
- Silsden is in a great location for rail links and other towns (Ilkley, Skipton, Keighley) and great countryside on all sides. A stone's throw from Wharfedale and Bolton Abbey. Housing is still fairly reasonable compared with Ilkley/Skipton. With a bit of careful planning it could fantastic. Suppose then though house prices would go up and we wouldn't be able to afford to live here!
- I have tried to answer for the whole family ie my husband commutes by train and 2 of my children go to school by bus. I would like to complain about the recent consultation re planning issues. I never knew about the meeting at the Town Hall and only found out about submitting comments on-line at the 11th hour from a friend. My husband and I then spoke to all our friends and neighbours in the town and they hadn't known about it either.
- I would like to see some land set aside for allotments please. The dog fouling in the park is the worst I have ever seen and I have lived in some major cities, the people who do it are regular and open offenders, I even have photographs of them.
- I feel that Silsden is getting more like a sub of Keighley and has lost its town/village appeal due to lack of small shops in Silsden and pubs and eating places.
- Over the years I have heard all of the arguments why Hillcrest Avenue and Spencer Avenue have not been adopted. However, this does not help the vehicle driver or the pedestrian; both the roads and pavements are an absolute disgrace and it is only a matter of time before someone is seriously injured. Queue writs, summons and insurance claims! Because it appears that nobody cares about the roads and pavements on Hillcrest Avenue and Spencer Avenue dog owners do not care either. Could I please challenge the reader of this survey to go right now to Spencer Avenue and to see just how serious and disgraceful the dog foul is, particularly on Spencer Avenue behind the Co-op Supermarket.
- 272 needs toilets in the park and someone patrolling to ensure youths who have not much to do in the area aren't wrecking the parks facilities,
- 273 DOG MUCK..... it is horrible that people either dont pick it up or just let there dogs out at night to muck wearever they want , its bad up aireview , southview terrece ,and all around the schools ,we need more poo bins .
- i strongly think bradford council should have a serious think about the DOG POO !!!!!! issue around the streets of silsden ,name and shame them by fines and put thier pictures in the keighley news,and how about some dog wardens maybe??
- 279 More anti drug action, we all know where they are, but its not PC to go there, more patrols up past the Nab the dealers seem to be back up there.

- 283 I'am not against housing development I think the number proposed is too great, the percentages accross Bradford area should be the same (new houses per head of population) also more effort should be made to force developers to use brown field sites in the Bradford area of which there are plenty. The types of houses mentioned earlier should be strictly adhered too. The infrastructure ie sewers, schools, roads in Silsden should be upgraded, sized to suit the new building plans first before any building is allowed. The by-pass talked about should be brought forward to relieve the congestion on Silsden Main st which becomes evermore dangerous for predestrians.
- 285 My answer to Q28, asking where I experienced problems with footpaths, was not accepted. My answer was that access to the footpath leading out of Silsden Green is an eyesore, with a dreadful gate, old building materials and rubble alongside the path and dog pens further up very offputting. Not going to help encourage tourism.
- I have heard that the council have propsed a new build 'Community Centre'. I personally feel strongly that this proposal is poposterous! We have a wonderful historic Town Hall in the very eart of the vllage ( with parking facilities very nearby). Admittedly some improvements do need to be made A new stage & disabled facilities. This building took local villagers 30 years of pulling together to put in place, we should be very proud of it & start to make better use of it. Also, I propose a 'Clean Up' event is held. A campaign along the lines of 'THE LOVE WHERE YOU LIVE' campaign with Keep Britain Tidy could be a fun way to get the public involved. www.lovewhereyoulive.org.
- The existing Town Hall should be upgraded with a stage & disabled facilities to offer the village a perfect community centre. Certainly NOT build a new one! Organise a town clean up operation.
- 292 Brunthwaite Bridge Lane is the narrow lane that cars/vans use instead of the main roads
- Too much congestion on Main Road due to allowing cars to park, when there is a perfectly good car park nearby. People are just lazy. Need safer access to Station for pedestrians and cyclists. Need traffic calming measures on Howden Road. we have already lost a cat, how long before it is a person?
- I think that the main thing that Silsden requires is a leisure facility i.e. pool and and a cheap but well equipped gym. This would encourage people from Steeton/Silsden/Crosshills to join. Currently i am a member of Craven swimming pool however it is inconvenient to travel there from Silsden when i am not at work. Speaking to many people who live in the area it would be great for a local pool and gym with a cost of £30 per month which you do not have to travel into Keighley for as it can take 30 minutes to get to some of the good gyms in Keighley. It is also extremely important to encourage regeneration and don't just let shops close as having rented a place in wallsend previously it was horrible watching shops close and set empty for 6 months then turning into a takeaway. Looking at silsden high street 50% must now be takeaways or cafes which will not encourage people to come and sped money in the area.
- 312 I live on Bolton Road and the speed of traffic is dangerous 20 mile an hour restriction should be applied - like Addingham Overnight visitors won't be attracted whilst all Silsden offers is fast food outlets and streets covered in dog muck

- Hard to see the tourist thing really working and justifying investment unless there was a more major attraction in the area. If you had a time machine and could site Skipton castle in Silsden, or convince some rellay famous artist to set up a gallery here, then perhaps this would work. The leisure facilities that Silsden offers are similar to those in many surrounding towns and villages and I just don't see how it can be develop a USP.
- really important to keep green fields around silsden, no more building on them. The town flower beds do look colourful but i would suggest to save money we could develope a volunteer group to maintain gardens and try planting with perenial shrubs etc and more butterfly friendly flowers to encourage nature in the village. A safe cycle / walking route across th roundabout is such high priority-anyone with a disability would be totally unable to cross the road to the station . need a crossing or a bridge urgently.
- Really worried about the litter situation especially in the park after the weekend. There are plenty of bins but we need to educate people to use them. Maybe enforce litter laws more readily.
- Visit other towns and villages and see how much more attractive they are compared to Silsden. We visit many and Silsden does not compare well. Ensure that the exterior of businesses reach the standard set by 'Beehive' and 'Ava Rose'. Tourists will not visit/stay in Silsden looking the way it presently does. Get rid of 'Bet Fred'.
- No suppermarkets sould be built in or around Silsden or Steeton as this will kill of local small traders and the high street. It is dying fast enough already!!
- 338 more land required for allotments
- 340 get something for the old factory by silsden afc
- Objection to 'Not Employed' option on previous section I am a full time Mum and don't consider myself 'Not Employed'!!! Would be helpful to have a somewhere to change a babies nappy whilst in Silsden. The toilet block is unpleasent at best I would rather take my son in the park to wee under a tree than use them. It would be good to see these improved and refurbished and baby change facility included.
- 347 THINK THAT THE TOWN HALL SHOULD BE UPDATED TO MAKE IT FULLY USEABLE UPSTAIRS eg. STAIRLIFT ETC. DOWNSTAIRS RE-FURBISHED BUT CERTAINLY NOT USED TO FULL POTENTIAL WITH GROUPS ETC.
- 351 Further to my comments regarding Silsden's infrastructure not been able to substantiate any further housing, there are also major problems with flooding for the town. We cannot afford to be building on the Silsden's flood plains and if large developments are built on the town's green areas there will be no field left to soak up the rain causing more flooding problems for the lower areas in Silsden.
- There is quite a good sense of community in Silsden, but I believe this could be built upon with more community events and involvement. There is also a need to encourage use of local businesses, in order to keep shops and facilities open. Perhaps better advertising and use of Silsden.net could help with all of these things.
- 356 Private signs entering Silsden are a disgrace.

- We feel the main priority for silsden is to make silsden as nice as it can be for local people. Litter is a really big concern as it quickly brings down an area and employing a litter warden is a great idea.
- With the likely-hood of an alternative route being made between Keighley and likley being next to zero, I think parking in the high street should be banned.
- 366 It would be a good idea if Silsden got some Tarmac on the roads ,they are disgusting and dangerous .
- 368 Spencer Avenue and Hillcrest Avenue are two old concrete roads and the council deny any responsibility for them, however as these are access roads to what was a council estate they should be able to find funds to repair them. - 370 Should be a speed limit throung Silsden like in Crosshills & Sutton of 20mph. Lorries over 7 ton should not be allowed through Silsden, they should be made to use the bypass round Silsden / Skipton. The river and canal bridge cannot continue to take this weight. Parking at Silsden already in adequate, need better / regular public transport to station. The Town Council needs to make things like the questionnaire and recent Housing meetings more visible to the people of Silsden. e.g. putting posters up around Silsden in the Post Office, Co-op, Doctors surgery, newsagents, outside the Town Hall even on lamp-posts on the main street. - 387 1)the home recycling service is very poor & I have had to complain to the council several times because the bins were not emptied, my enquiries were always met with lame excuses. 2) we dont need any more fast food takeaways in silsden we have too many as it is. 3) recently noticed a problem with dog muck, a lot of it isnt getting picked up off the footpaths by dog owners

- 388 I would love to see the main street developed more, however bolton road is far too busy for such development. I think that pedestrianizing the area would encourage more tourism and the growth in the number of cafes and gift shops
- 389 How about encouraging an 'Incredible Edible' community growing scheme like they have in Todmorden?
- I have been concerned about drug use/dealing amongst young people in the park, particularly when young children are close by. My other major concern is the waste management site on Bradley Green which is very inappropriately positioned in the middle of a residential area. Heavy lorries are continually crossing Bradly Green, where people walk dogs and children play. They are noisy and cause damage to the roads, which are in a very poor state leading from the site and towards Skipton Rd. Furthermore there is a great deal of noise coming from the use of cranes moving waste material and there is no buffer between the site and the houses adjoining it. The site is an eyesore and a public footpath leading through it does not provide a good introduction to the beauties of Silsden. The provision of an alternative site would be ideal. If not the activities and waste materials should be enclosed in a soundproofed building. An alternative use for this site would be a housing development, to go towards meeting the requirements of the LDF.
- 393 Believe the town council needs to be a little more 'for the town' rather than for the greater good of the councilers!!
- 401 Silsden needs more active police personnel and wardens. The only way to deal with dog-fouling is for officials with the appropriate powers to be on patrol outside their current working hours and catch offenders and levy fines/instigate prosecutions.
- 402 joint survey by husband and wife
- 403 wonderful place to live good sense of community silsden is unique.
- We really need to vacate Bradford Metropolitan Council as soon as possible to join either Craven Council or a Keighley/Ilkley Council.
- Over the last 3-4 years Silsden has started to lose its identity. Shops are closing and being replaced with tacky takeaways, who put nothing back into the village. Houses are being turned into flats or cheap lets and people are moving into the village from away and are not interested in the long term interests of our village. Extra houses and supermarkets, poor planning i.e; units and housing will only make things worse.
- 413 If tourism is to be promoted, then first impressions are important. The initial view of Silsden, when approaching from the direction of the A629 junction, needs improving. Disused land, and the commercial/industrial units off Belton Road, are not attractive. Disused land can be landscaped (or built on). Commercial units can be disguised, and hidden with more tree or hedge planting.
- 416 i have given my views to local ward councillors and will forward suggestions and comments through this medium
- 421 Silsdens lovely place to live i think we look after our home i think our streets are very clean and tidy except dog mess.its so frustrating should face penaltys.should be named and shamed.I work in the local communitywe ae very close community and care nice that we have our Gala but think we should bring out the elderly to watch the prossesion seat them in methodist garden just a idea the eldey in local care homes who made Silsden Gala years ago.I do feel the xmas lights are not that nice we could maybe light up 1 area of silsden Silsden

christmas garden next to the libary.

- Just to reiterate the dangers of crossing Silsden and Steeton bypass. Safety for babies and toddlers comes first!! Refurb of Silsden health centre, always have buckets out catching leaks from the roof!! Credit where it is due aswell: congrats to Silsden councilers for organising Silsdens new xmas market, tree and lights over the last two years. The new tree is amazing and a real centre piece for the town.
- I feel that the amount of dog fouling on the pavements and footpaths is unacceptable. I cannot understand why irresponsible dog owners are allowed to do this without enforcement of penalties. As a new parent I would also like to see a secondary school that would serve the area rather than the limited option of Keighley. Surely the catchment area of Silsden, Steeton etc warrants something for our local children. Leisure facilities would also be welcome rather than just the small gym available to the village. Silsden is a lovely place to live but further improvements would make the place even better.
- We have needed a new 8 to 11 school for years. Please Silsden is stretched to breaking point and needs it urgently and a bigger doctors surgery with parking.
- 435 Quality above quantity.
- 439 Until Christmas we had a brilliant team empting the bins, the ones we have now make it more difficult for people like me who can't pull bins up out of the back street. I have so much appreciated the respect and help the previous team have given me.
- The main road in Silsden from the bottom of canal bridge to the bottom Bolton Road is very unsafe for pedestrians. This is due to parking cars on the narrowest part of the road. Footpaths that are too narrow in area of weir and public house on the other side of road...for vehicle to pass in this area they have to mount pavements which is dangerous for pedestrians. Bottom of Bolton Road, Bell Square exit fast traffic approaching both up and down Bolton Road are a big danger. Residents living on Bolton Road suffer from traffic fumes, vibration from all vehicles, heavy goods to private cars and buses. Fumes such as diesel and braking fumes from hot brakes.
- In many places other than Silsden, so often when there is a grassy path near houses where children could get some much needed outdoor plat and exercise, there are notices saying 'No ball games'. I hope this never happens in Silsden. As over 80, I'm quite happy to see children kicking a ball about in the road outside my house, but just wish there were more traffic free places and green spaces close to where children live. Unless affordable housing is need for those who live and work locally, further building of houses should be restricted.
- 444 I teach piano for 1 1/2 hours per week only.
- 451 Please date communications 'the end of this month' useless when away from home. I expect you mean 'end of March' in which case this is useless for me.
- 453 Thank you for doing the questionnaire great idea.
- 456 I think Silsden should leave Bradford Met and go back to being an Urban District Council and then perhaps these things will get done as they used to be.

- Traffic congestion is a significant issue due to the parked cars on Kirkgate. The beck needs better looking after... The traffic cone has been stuck on the weir for weeks! Selling point of the canal is a missed opportunity. The derelict land opposite Habisat Rossi is an eyesore. Signed walking routes might attract visitors, especially if supported by leaflets. Signpost the park! It isn't viewable from the main road.
- 466 Dog fouling is a real problem need more prosecutions. Litter is a real problem beck and pond rats. The building in the park very run down and the garden. The crossings are unsafe.
- 474 Tree roots are causing obstructions on Howden Road making it difficult for the elderly, disabled and people with pushchairs etc. Lots of cars etc exceed the speed limit on Howden Road.
- 491 Silsden is going downhill, if I could afford to move I would get away. Silsden is starting to become like Keighley and Bradford.
- 494 Silsden appeared to be a tidier place when there was a dedicated street sweeper who used to walk around. The machine that replaced him makes things worse not better. Refuse collection operatives (bin men) don't pick up any rubbish that drops from bins and they do not leave the bins in the same place they picked up from. The area around the beck by the Post Office needs a general spruce up. Litter and overgrown plants on the weir is a particular problem. Bradford MDC dog fouling officer only appears interested if someone actually names the person whose dog is making the mess. They need to visit the area early in the morning 6am 8am and 6.30 11.30pm to catch the culprits themselves. Until people get fined, nothing is going to improve! Contact the local farmers/land owners to turn some fields, especially by river into proper wetland meadows rather than sterile grasslands which are only good for silage.
- Small independent, high quality shops and cafes that will attract people from outside the village. New Xmas lights so that commuters will drive through and think that they would like to stop and visit the town. I think the main road has huge potential for attracting visitors. Often if I mention Silsden to people they comment on the duck pond. The owners of the cottages at the pond always have beautiful flowers and their contribution to the beauty of the village should be rewarded and applauded.
- 496 I would like to see 1 hour free parking in the car parks. Would like to have cars banned from parking down main street, a danger for buses. Introduce traffic lights on Howden Road and Elliot Street and main street.
- 497 I live on Spencer Avenue this road is breaking up and sometime someone is going to be badly hurt. Private or public owned seems to be in limbo if private it should be stopped off at the north end with bollards allowing only we who live on it to have access. If it is access to the estates above it should be maintained by Bradford Council and action should taken place now to do the repairs for safety's sake. The blight of the roads not adopted should be put on the to do list before any further projects are done it would cost but more people would have their living conditions improved than by any other means.
- 498 Unless more schools are built, better access to town, more leisure activities built we can't afford anymore houses to be built.
- 499 There should be receptacles in all areas for disposal of dog dirt. As you can see my main preoccupation is cleanliness of Silsden. Thank you. My older grandchildren play football in the park my younger ones play on the swings and

roundabouts. And I live up Skipton Road. All areas of concern.

- The tree canopy at the lower end of Bradley Road has always presented an attractive and welcoming avenue leading people to some of Silsden's beautiful countryside. In recent years some of the trees have been vigorously pruned or felled. Could steps be taken to preserve this cover? Having said that, it looks like the first tree on the left hand side of Bradley Road, juts above where the lane crosses the green may have been attacked by honey fungus. If that is so it would need felling otherwise the fungus will spread up the hill killing the remainder of the trees. it would be appreciated if an arboricultivist could examine the base of the tree from which the fungus is emanating. Tesco very concerned that it might increase employment at the expense of our local butchers, bakers, pharmacist and general stores who make Silsden such a nice place to live. Silsden does seem to have plenty of venues for community events so can't really see the need for anymore. Thank you for the opportunity to comment.
- 501 Silsden is on the very periphery of Bradford's thinking zone. Development in whatever area will require money. The council cannot afford investment not now any where within its boundary unless we can present a very strong case.
- Dog fouling is a huge problem. Patrols needed at evening time to combat dog fouling on dark nights where owners don't clean up due to the likelihood of being seen. Parents parking on zig zag lines outside schools, no warning, just prosecute, they know the rules.
- Silsden is an extremely pretty place and under rated. I have noticed since I have lived here for the past 2 years that in the Cringles area there is a large lake i.e. reservoir. Could this be developed as a tourist attraction. I.e. fishing, cafes, as restaurant, a fast food, a playground, boating?
- 522 Dog fouling a major concern on Ings Way.
- I am an ex-HGV driver. Try taking a HGV or bus along the main street towards Kly, overtaking parked cars, not able to see what is coming towards you round the bend by the Post Office. This road is an 'A' road. Sort this road out, or build a bypass. Land was put aside for a bypass, why was it built on?
- 536 Get rid of the old factories/areas where gypsies move in. The crime rate foes up then. The factory is run down, there is broken glass etc and it's an eyesore. Can it be knocked down and houses built there, it would be a nice little housing estate.
- 541 Silsden is big enough. There is already congestion on the bypass at peak times. The trains are jammed full. The schools are full. The roads in and out of Silsden cannot cope with the volume of traffic. It would be sad for Silsden to lose its character and become just another dormitory town at the risk to flooding because the fields have been concreted over.
- Why were Bradford allowed to take the stone flags from Silsden streets. Where are the stones from the footpaths in the park, they should have been reset. Have they been sold, if so where did the money go? Silsden Park belongs to the people of Silsden. Lets have the stones back. Maybe a mini roundabout at the junction of Kirkgate Elliott St, Clog Bridge traffic lights. No more industrial units taking green field, no houses taking green field.
- I regret being made to answer many questions as I do not have the necessary information. Its no good asking me about facilities for children ask them.

- I love living in Silsden, but it needs more activities for all the community to join in rather than just Gala Day and Christmas market. Dog poo is a major problem, I am a dog owner, I pick all mine up but have often seen others that do not, I have contacted council about this and they said they would send me a book to log it, well in my opinion this isn't good enough the police or wardens should do spot checks to catch offenders because even though the signs say people will be prosecuted nobody will ever get caught as it is now and as I have already said we need proper bins for it please.
- Any future developments should be made on brown area. Roads are now congested. Doctors surgery appointments are difficult to get. Parking at station is inadequate already. Silsden infrastructure is unable to deal with further population demand.
- Wagons over 7 tons should not be allowed to come through Silsden Main Street, on safety grounds. Suggest a 20 mph speed limit through town centre, as operated in Cross Hills.
- I feel I am unable to comment on the issues listed because I am 90 years old and due to a number of serious health problems am largely confined to my bungalow where a live alone. A friend usually takes me shopping to Tesco once a week, and also to medical appointments where possible. I have no experience of most of the issues raised the only comment I would like to make would be regarding police. They seem so remote from Silsden these days with no resident bobby around that it seems we are a 2nd class area.
- A shop local scheme would be fun and good for Silsden. How is it there is little community spirit these days? What about a jubilee event?
- 573 What about the town council looking after the memorial plaque to the Ukrainian workers, situated between Dobson Wharf and Ings Way Silsden or better still moving it into the centre of Silsden.
- 575 Bells Square from before to well after Christmas Bells Square was subject to standing water immediately in front of the bus stop for something like 8-10 weeks. Rather a problem for people hoping to catch a bus there and keep their feet dry. I took it upon myself to ring the council officers in Bradford on three occasions. The first occasion I felt the officer appeared to accept my comments reassuring me the problem would receive attention. The second call made appeared the officer couldn't care less and there was still no attention to the problem. The third call I made I was attended to by a lady and I explained the problem once more, she assured me it would receive some attention and with in 3 days the problem was solved.
- 579 Litter/dog waste problems need attention urgently. Heavy traffic in general a problem. Local police presence is needed, not only if phoning for them to come quickly but good old fashioned visible policing on the beat as it was, prevention is the key to crime and it is cheaper on the country to prevent rather than prosecute with all it entails. Never seen any law enforcement presence on the streets.
- I feel very strongly that most of the towns retail facilities are being taken over by Asian restaurants and takeaways. This does not show visitors or people driving through a true reflection of the community spirit in Silsden. To be blunt it looks like Keighley overflow. I am also concerned about the number of pubs that are closing down, is this connected?
- Dog fouling is a big problem all over Silsden and something should be done to stop this.

- 588 It is important for the people of Silsden that they are represented by a council who will take responsibility for their actions. The Mayor is in direct conflict with the purpose of this survey. We are of course referring to the skip yard off Bradley Road. This establishment is a disgrace in this location and is not only a blight on the landscape but a source of constant nuisance to the residents of the surrounding residential area. It is also a danger to the health and well being of the greater community of Silsden by the amount of pollution generated by this site as noted below. Incineration of toxic waste on site and on public land. Ring of scorched earth from (fly tipping) bonfire - contaminated where children and animals frequent. Incinerated contamination from this yard consists of treated timber, old furniture, melamine kitchen units, etc. during heavy rain contamination runs off into the beck. Contaminated dust, littler and plastic waste blown off this site onto the surrounding area, roads and footpaths. Unregulated noise in excess of public nuisance noise levels and excessive diesel exhausts pollution from on site machinery. Uncontrolled processing and distribution of contaminated builders waste to farmland possibly containing asbestos, polyesters and polyurethane all of which are carcinogenic substances. General contamination on the site running into the beck and public drainage system. We have noted on your website pictures taken of Silsden and the surrounding countryside showing some of the wonderful things we have in Silsden, the people, the countryside, and a statement saying we cannot take the environment for granted however Mayor certainly takes it for granted.
- 595 As an elderly person 80 I am not able to answer questions I know nothing about.
- I saw council wardens walking the neighbourhood a week or two ago, that seemed a good idea. When will there be information on the proposed refuse site at the bottom of the town.
- 597 Filled in with the views of two people from same address.
- Additional housing on a large scale would have a detrimental effect on the quality of life for Silsden residents, as the whole area would be unable to cope with the problems that a significant rise in population would create. As mentioned earlier in the survey some of the problems being lack of schools, the roads, in particular the main road through Silsden, which already carries a lot of through traffic.
- No more houses. Ban lorries from Main Street. Traffic lights Kirkgate, Clog Bridge, Elliott Street.
- New supermarket needed. All old seats in lanes round Silsden in poor state. They need repairing.
- 608 Surrey done by H/W together.
- The road by the bus stop on Bridge Street regularly floods. This has gone on for years. Additional drainage or better maintenance needed.
- We have plenty of facilities in Silsden which are underused. The chapel is open every day for various activities and in the evenings, as is the church. Plenty of groups i.e. civic society, football and cricket for younger people and this going on at the school. I live in a village because I don't want the likes of a cinema, bingo and lots of noisy amenities. Silsden is a great place to live. Town band, Cubs, Scouts, Guides etc.
- Road sweepers come around in early autumn as leaves are just beginning to fall but no more. The vast majority of fallen leaves remain on the ground, mushy and slippery for many months. This is rather unsightly. Gritters never see them on side streets.

- The main problems with Silsden are the parking allowed on the main road through the village and the junction just before the bridge over the canal and the junction between the two pubs at the top of the village. The speed of traffic through the village could be controlled with the use of two speed cameras one at each end of the village. If nothing is done about the parking on the main road someone will end up being run over because of people dodging through stationary vehicles. The bottom end of the village after the canal does need a car park and some shops and outlets through to bring that end of the village to life.
- 675 Sick of charity bags.
- Stop green field building. Look to brown field sites only for housing. We don't need any more industrial units. There are all those massive sheds on Keighley Road and we see very few people going in and out of them so there doesn't seem to be a great employment benefit. Something for the teenagers might be good, the ones who are between the playground and the pub. They frequently use the park as a social club and leave their empty beer cans and bottles strewn all over. I think there are about 15 litter bins in Silsden park so maybe the youngsters need a couple of instruction signs to show them how they work.
- We could encourage campsites for groups such as Scouts/Guides to use. Can we keep reminding dog owners about picking up after their dogs please.
- 688 Need more bins for dog poo especially at bus stops and snicket between park green and Skipton Road. I feel this would encourage more dog owners to do the correct thing.
- I have complained at council (Silsden) meetings regarding the dangerous state of footpaths to the side of the Co-op and some improvement has been made. It is time the council concentrated on health and safety and did something about this un-adopted policy that Bradford seem to favour.
- I think people who rent houses should have it written into a contract and enforced that the properties are kept clean and tidy. The back streets in Tufton and Hothfield Street are a disgrace and mainly in rented houses. West View is another example people seem to have no pride in their properties.
- 698 Is it not time there was a ban on vehicles parking on Silsden main street, before a major accident occurs. Mobile phones on buses should be banned, the noise they make for other passengers is not acceptable.
- 703 Unclog drains down North Street to Co-op. Make North Street one way below Breakmoor Avenue as it is too narrow (with parked cars) for 2 cars to pass without difficulty.
- 707 Any development needs to be regulated in the schools and amenities as pupil/teacher ratio will drop and more children will need additional recreation areas.
- 719 It would be great to extend the canal cycle path to Skipton we would use it a lot and this would bring tourists. The council should really focus on keeping the town clean and litter free.
- 721 More policemen on foot, regular patrols. Please could the new cemetery have more attention I.e. grass cutting, blackberry bushes etc. cleaning between gravestones.

- We are not making the most of the attraction of the canal walk from the bridge pub towards Bingley Five Rise Locks and Saltaire. The first mile is often muddy and bumpy as it's just a grass canal sidetrack. However, towards Riddlesdale it has a good base and this allows pleasant cycling, walking with pushchairs, wheelchairs and walking for the elderly to be undertaken. For just a little effort this final link could be improved and bring tourism benefits to the town.
- Silsden is a pleasant place to live and has extensive footpaths. We have a community bus which services each side of the main road but doesn't cover needs to travel from one side to the other i.e. from Howden Road area to Doctors surgery and main shopping area. We could do with restricted parking area on Kirkgate to cut down on traffic congestion.
- 728 The questionnaire reflects the view of myself and my wife.
- A comprehensive school for children 5 to 18 years old. Location, for new school top of the playing fields. Land owner BFD MET. Aire View, Hothfield school sites re sold money acquired from sale used for rebuild comprehensive school. Old school sites used for low cost houses. Hothfield School site could be underground car park with health centre on top etc. Any assets, land, buildings owned by BFD MET, Silsden council that can be sold sell. Money acquired invest in Silsden comprehensive school. Come on Grayham/Keith, lads and lasses get a grip on BFD MET.
- 735 Until a bypass is built, some sort of weight restriction could be placed on the main road through Silsden
- Polish memorial on Ings Way often vandalised. There are far too many vehicles parked on the roads and pavements in Silsden overnight. Silsden street sign look very shabby.
- 739 Shipping in low income families from areas like Manchester doesn't work. Affordable housing has ruined Farnhill. Please avoid a mass migration into Silsden my husband has lived in Silsden for 78 years. It's a really nice town. Don't spoil it with big new developments.
- 740 I would oppose any large-scale developments in Silsden for the following reasons. The main sewer down the valley to Keighley is already overloaded. There are not enough schools; the older children already have to travel out of town. There are not enough employment opportunities in the town. Facilities for the elderly are inadequate.
- 745 Silsden was a lovely place to live but not any more it has deteriorated drastically over the last few years. The pride and respect of ownership and sense of belonging to a lovely area has gone. You cannot blame it on the recession although BFD MET Councils ability to budget well and wisely could be questioned. Once you have a lot of transient rentals and drinking and takeaways and anti social behaviour then you wonder if the trend can be reversed. It will need very strong community minded local people to even try to reverse the decline they will need to fight a council who seem determined to ruin Silsden through filling it with huge wagons, waste plants, over building, irresponsible use of budget. A lot more old fashioned valued such as pride, dignity, respect and the ability to budget well instead of greed, cheap commerce and a total indifference to Silsden. Do not kill Silsden allow rebirth.
- 746 Due to Silsden not having its own police station the response times are dependent on activity in the Keighley and Ilkley area. people allowing their dogs to foul on other peoples gardens/paths.

- 751 My main concern is the obvious dog fouling on the streets and pavements in Silsden. We moved from Ripon where there was a dog warden and waste bins and here there is nothing. Only lazy dog owners who leave a mess on the pavements where people walk.
- 755 I have not spent an hour considering my replies, not sure how this could be don't in ten minutes and some questions require analysis and knowledge of transport planning. Silsden has always resisted the potential to become a tourist destination, breaking ties with Keighley would help. Lessons could be learned from Howarth and Hebden Bridge, support for arts and community, e.g. concert venue, gallery would help as well as focussed canal bases tourism. the town needs a small festival.
- 756 Think if we had more of a community pride in our town it would be an even better place to live than it is already. Seems to me we are always looked at as a poor relation to Skipton and we could do an awful lot more.
- 758 Can anything be done about selfish people who burn fires regularly sometimes the smoke is unbearable. You can see it from top of hills in Silsden usually the same culprits.
- Too many fast food/takeaways in Silsden. How many do you need? High street parking should be banned, car park available for free 30 min stay is enough, should be encouraged if taxis don't take up all the spaces. Why do people park on the high street? To pick up a takeaway? In my opinion the high street doesn't justify parking. People should be encouraged to walk or use public transport to access Silsden facilities/shops.
- To make it easier for cars to get out of Howden Road and to stop parking in High Street every day you have to wait to get pass with the cars parked. The traffic could run ok if this parking would stop it's a nightmare and its every day. Silsden does need a bypass.
- 765 I am very concerned about the proposed new build scheme especially after reading previous documents and research. Developers would not finance the infrastructure and services required to support the number of new build houses. It would put the health, education of current residents at risk. Insufficient policing to minimise crime and anti social behaviour. There would be an impact on roads. It would destroy the unique feel of Silsden and have a negative impact on the local area. There would be a lack of essential amenities and services for an increased population. I am not prepared to accept plans that will put resident at risk and have a negative impact.
- 1700 new houses without what I would think is a massive increase in infrastructure this must be a no, no. More roads, drainage, sewers, power, education, employment. Local authorities don't have the resources and private builders wouldn't be interested apart from the houses. Traffic I am annoyed by the traffic flow in Silsden narrow main road with parking, but it works. However the junction at Clog Bridge/Elliott Street with Keighley Road/Kirkgate could do with traffic light possibly. And if major building works take place the problem will get worse. Dog fouling CCTV with a dog warden. All dogs to be kept on leads on footpaths. All dog owners to carry bags to clean up mess. All dog owners to clean up dog mess. More bins to receive dog mess. On the spot fines for noncompliance with any of the above.

- I haven't answered many questioned as they don't apply to myself, being elderly I would use more facilities if I could walk and feel safe on the pavements. All the passengers who use Jackson's Bus to shop and get into Keighley, all say the same thing what would we do without it, a bus service later in the day would help the elderly get around more, mostly in the summer period. The men who drive us around are very good, mostly all of them.
- 770 Time Silsden went back to what it really is, a small rural village where everyone knew each other and was a friendly caring community not a dog eat dog, cut throat, not in my back yard ruthless townie community. Get back to basics and reality and if you are stuck pay people to get it sorted as soon as possible before it goes too far out of control.
- 771 Dog excrement in the streets is a huge problem, when trying to push prams around the pavements, is impossible with the amount and have to revert to using the road which is not safe. Hainsworth Road always has horse riders with horses that foul the pavements/roads. It is only fair that this problem should be dealt with along with the dog fouling. Silsden Football Club on a Saturday/Sunday. The parking in Belton Road is unacceptable, parking provision should be elsewhere. Double yellow lines with regular patrols should be implemented. Accessing Hainsworth Road is almost impossible.
- 772 Form incomplete as recent removed to this area.
- 1 feel that the most important thing needed in Silsden is a leisure centre and swimming pool also a bypass, having lived in Silsden all my life I feel that through the week the traffic congestion with wagons is getting worse, soon there will be an accident. Kids and myself need leisure facilities and also a major swimming pool.
- Town hall interior run down needs refurbishment. Needs to be used more upstairs, music, comedy, party letting etc. As it was in the 60's, 70's and 80's.
- 775 Community development an absolute priority, together with more allotment and encouragement to use and care for our local countryside. Encourage use of our local main street instead of emphasis on just supermarkets. Silsden will become joys another commuter belt if we don't have a vibrant Kirkgate/Briggate and a central community centre.
- 778 Thanks for sending the questionnaire. Its great to be asked. We love Silsden and want it to stay a great place.
- I must emphasis that there is no bus stop or letter box near enough for me to reach, being disabled and extremely lame. I object to cars being parked with 2 wheels on the pavement, when there is a drive or garage available. If parking was disallowed on Kirkgate, traffic would move more freely and traffic calming measures in the road could stop speeding. Policemen spaced out along Kirkgate after closing time (as in Bingley) could deter drunken vandalism and bad behaviour by drunks. Our road, although we are on high community charge, is rarely swept or gritted. policemen on the beat are barely seen in Silsden. An old peoples centre would be a good idea.
- 781 Silsden is a wonderful community. However, where we live on Haythorns Avenue dog fouling is a big issue. There needs to be more signs present. What has happened to the street cleaner is this another victim of council cuts to services. No more building there are enough houses in Silsden. Support teenagers and young people with access to jobs.

- Policing there is very little visible point presence in the village. More police on the beat, although old fashioned, it would be a deterrent to those with criminals tendencies and also would have the knock on effect of making people, especially the elderly feel much more secure. It would also give the police a better profile and most people would welcome it and be more inclined to help the police.
- My general opinion is that Silsden always looks untidy and a little dilapidated. Before I could support more leisure activities e.g. time should be spent on improving the image of Silsden i.e. bad behaviour, generally through alcohol. A big improvement in the becks i.e. below the post office, it looks disgusting where as it could be an attraction.
- 1 am sick of folk ignorantly parking and hindering access in and out of our garage. I am fed up of telling folk to move. Put me some yellow lines where needed, it will cure our problem and force folk to park correctly. Near sorts ground, blue balls on roadside are tacky and don't give a good impression to visitors. More parking facilities are required to help relieve Main street (no parking zone surely) and also old Skipton Road is getting worse with more and more vehicles using both sides to park especially near the vets and bear Bradley Road also taxi's seem to park there.
- Once again parking on main street very dangerous as big wagons come to deliver goods to the shops and then of course all the traffic stops and causes congestion. Why not try putting yellow lines to stop parking and see if there is an improvement and to see how people cope.
- There is no transport for elderly or disabled to go shopping. We need to use a taxi and that costs money all the time. In our little street the lighting is very poor. If you live over the bridge we are the forgotten ones.
- As you realise I am an 85-year-old widow living in the Craven Drive area. Having to use a walking aid I am very limited at getting around. I enjoy living in Silsden, as I have commented finding it difficult getting around through shortage of transport in a morning and very uneven footpaths between Craven Drive and the post office in the town which is essential to someone of my age. I do not want to be house bound.
- 799 Proposed mini roundabout at Belton Road/Keighley Road has never been implemented and there is a great deal of congestion. Too much roadside parking on main road through Silsden town centre causing gridlock. There are wagons occasionally parked on Belton Road overnight turning it into a trailer park. The football academy causes extra stationary traffic on Belton Road causing unnecessary congestion at weekends. Too many driving schools use Belton Road for there point turns/emergency stops etc. restricting flow of traffic.
- Silsden is a beautiful place to lice and we are very lucky. There is very little to improve apart from public transport, dog poo in park and litter by the beck. The real issues are for older kids as there is very little for them to do a community sports/activity programme would be good.
- I really love living in Silsden but there is very little to do with your family. I believe that an adventure playground in a park or a section could bring tourists to Silsden. We regularly visit St Ives at Harden for the wonderful adventure playground which my son loves and another one of our favourite family days out is the Hare and Hounds at Guiseley where there is a fantastic children fun Wacky Warehouse.

- I would like to see communal and convenient recycling facilities like in France.

  Dog mess litter bins or make enforcement of fines for not clearing up after dogs.
- 812 I work voluntary at a charity shop 1 1/2 days a week.
- 816 Dog fouling. I have several relatives buried in cemetery at the top of Howden Road. On occasions, too often, cars pull in through main gates and occupants let their dogs out, sometimes on leads but not always who then proceed to run over graved leaving dog dirt. Several times dog dirt has been left on my grandparent's grave. This is not acceptable. The fault is with the dog handler not the dog. Some have such long leads they are practically running amok. I have only once seen a warden there despite very regular visit by myself. The streets are not much cleaner.
- I love Silsden. It's a lovely place to live (expect for its proximity to Keighley which cannot be changed of course). I am passionate about my town/village and do not want to see it spoiled by the greed of developers who build and then move on. There should be protocol/rules/laws etc. that prevent the likes of Skipton Properties from developing the town/village spoiling it and moving on. We need to protect that which we have, before it is lost forever.
- We go to the cemetery often as we have just recently lost our daughter. The cemetery is Howden Road on every occasion we go there is always someone there with a dog. They walk round the graveyard and let them walk all over the grounds my husband stood in some poo one morning by his car. I hope there is some way of stopping this as it is our loved ones that are there and they cant speak for them selves, it's called respect.
- Something more needs to be done to slow the traffic down approaching the entrance to Cringles Park on Bolton Road. It is impossible for elderly people to get across the road safely. It is an accident waiting to happen. The present measure that have been put in place by the council do not do anything to slow the traffic down.
- 831 It would be nice to have a good greengrocers.
- On the whole Silsden is a good place to live, but over the past 10 years or so parking on pavements and the lack of sweeping is making it an awful place. Pavements are not wide enough to park cars. People should be made to pick their dog mess up. Bus service very good. Also why do sweeper pass though Silsden but never sweep?
- Silsden has no community centre. Steeton has one; Addingham has one; Ilkley has one; Keighley has one. Other small communities also have their own centres, meeting the needs and aspirations of the people. The Town Hall has the potential to fill this role but there are serious access problems inherent in the building. Local churches have their own community facilities over which they have financial and usage control. The people of Silsden need something that the community can have ownership of and develop to meet the needs of their own community. And these needs are manifold. A place for disabled people and their carers to meet is needed. A place for the elderly to come together, combating social isolation. A place for Silsden people to enjoy leisure activities such as visual and performing arts. A place for Silsden people to learn new skills. A place for Silsden people to celebrate family occasions. A place where Silsden groups can have social and fund raising events. A place where Silsden people could access alternative therapies. A place where Silsden groups can meet and debate issue that affect them. A place where commercial firms could showcase their goods and services. A community centre would out heart into community;

bring the people together with a common purpose; support those who are most vulnerable in the community and at the same time provide something that could be developed as an income generating opportunity. I think the provision of a community centre and all that would bring to this community is now essential if Silsden is ever to develop its own unique identity and cease to be just that place with a Bradford postal code and in between Addingham and Steeton.

- 845 Could you please look at a plan of action to address the road situation on Spencer Avenue. The council will not get involved but we require some help and support as this is a health and safety issue for houses that need access to this road daily.
- 846 Prolonged dog barking from house/houses in Easy/North Dene.
- Upgrade the canal towpath for Silsden area up to Kildwick. Consider building a combined primary school on the old Weavestyle area and convert existing schools into housing. This will make use of already developed land and produce more green space for the pupils of Silsden. Could also incorporate more indoor sports facilities that whole community could use. Weight restrictions on bridges preventing HGV's from using Silsden narrow main street. Constant approach to tackling dog fouling. Café area in park to attract families. Improve facilities for teenagers.
- 854 Id like to heard of a roaming CCTV being positioned overlooking hot spots for irresponsible dog owners and the prosecutions could be more likely to stick just a thought. A farmers markets once a months in the main car park. People would have to park further away and then walk through town helping local business get noticed.
- Please upgrade canal towpath from hard core area at end of low Howden Road (under culvert) to Skipton. Push for this to help people in wheelchairs, pushchairs, cyclists, walkers. Address dog fouling CCTV. 20 mph speed limit in restricted areas. a must.
- 857 Keep Silsden rural.
- I have answered the questions to improve Silsden. I think you must stop dog fouling and rubbish, Silsden is getting dirty. It used to be a lovely village a few years ago it's a shame. To have any chance of tourism and leisure this must be done. A few more corner shops would help instead of takeaways. It would be nice to be on the maps as a quaint little village.
- 865 Vehicles park on grass verges causing tread marks on grass.
- 866 I have lived in Silsden 24 years now enjoyed every minute of it. Please don't spoil it, all it needs is a bit of consideration from people in general and a bit of tweaking. It is a beautiful place I count my blessings everyday.
- 870 Not enough PSCO presence, cannot remember last time I saw one. To stop cold calling at door steps. More recycling points in village.

- A clamp down on dog walkers who don't clean up after their pets would improve living in Silsden. Perhaps employing someone, part of whose job it is to patrol the residential areas to hand out sanctions to these people, might help matters particularly in the evening when most people seem to walk their dogs around the streets.
- The biggest problems in Silsden is dog mess of which there are various hotspots. Parking should be stopped on the main road to ease congestion. The road at the side of the CO-OP and Spacer Avenue should be improved, although I know it is un-adopted. Someone is going to have a serious accident soon, either on the road or the pavement.
- 879 Silsden needs free car parks to stop cars etc. Parking on the side of the roads. I was almost knocked down by a car who decided to pull onto the pavement outside my house without slowing down enough at the same time as I stepped out of my door, when my grandchildren visit, my door is always locked so they do not stop out of the door, in case it happens to them. There are two entrances to the part on Bolton Road, but no crossing on the very busy road for children and adults to use.
- Maybe we could ban lorries from Silsden except for access. The main street is always clogged up. Plus we get the fumes. Footpath from Craven Drive to Mitchell Lane needs resurfacing, the weeks taking away, nothing has been done since the houses were built, nearly disappeared.
- The new health centre was to going to be built over two years ago. We need a new on as it is rundown and if you are in a wheelchair you cannot get in without help.
- Youngsters do not have much to do what interests them here and they are bored. They are not that bad. Older people are much worse and I feel ashamed to belong to this age bracket. I have experienced very bad behaviour from older people here and I feel I don't want to mix with the,. I prefer to communication with younger generations. There is quite a few nice people, but there is always one or two bad apples in a basket. Library would be nice to use it, it would be quiet in it and computer keys well maintained, clean.
- I hope you publish the results of the survey. More grit bins we live in Cobbydale and have requested a grit bin every year for 14 years.
- 887 I thought we were getting a warning sign to discourage high speeders in Skipton Road. The speed limit should be lowered on all main roads through Silsden, as in Cross Hills, 20mph.
- Dog fouling in Howden Road cemetery. Dogs should not be allowed. The sign says only on leads but the length of these leads, they may as well roam free. We have found dog poo on our graves quite a number of times. We have two, which we do take care of. I have reported the matter many times over the years, but it is still happening. I find complaining a waste of time. It is not the dogs at fault, it is their owners. No respect at all. I feel I am wasting my time writing this, because I have filled a survey in before, also, probably no one will ever read this just a waste of paper.
- 890 Push to get Spencer Avenue taken over to resurface and paths done, most people with wheelchairs and pushchairs walk on the roads as it is so bad on the pavements, urgent priority.`
- Another supermarket would provide competition and lower cost to the consumer. Pharmacy at the health centre instead of two in Kirkgate when one is enough.

- I was disgusted to hear recently that places at Silsden schools were being given to Keighley children and Silsden children and to go elsewhere. Where is the logic? This is so wrong and I am terrified that my son won't get in as I do not drive and couldn't possibly afford to go on the bus with him to school every day as our household only has one income. I know this is a huge worry for new mothers in Silsden.
- I spent ten minutes completing this survey online and I have just had to write it all out by hand because of an internal server error hence the terrible handwriting.
- 901 Keep up the good work, it is a good town that needs a little touching up, it is very pleasant to live here, thank you.
- 903 Could the Town Council encourage more floral displays, hanging basket etc. Along Kirkgate? A completion? Regular spring clean days, Kirkgate, The Park, The Beck etc might encourage more participation in and responsibility for the cleanliness and appearance of Silsden. Please support current initiative to create a community centre. Thank you for undertaking this Silsden Survey 2012 which I think is to be applauded. Please ensure that the results are made easily available.
- I would like to ask if it is allowed to remove a footpath make of Yorkshire stone flags which is un-adopted, then extend a yard over this footpath. I used to walk this path but for quite a few years now have been unable to do so because of these changes. These changes have taken place at Beckside, 53 Brownfield Terrace, Silsden. It would be nice to see the old footpath back again and people being able to use it again.
- 906 No more takeaways in Silsden.
- 909 If new houses are to be built then Brown Field sites should take priority i.e. Sykes Lane area. The green field site are already being encroached upon by industrial units and these need protecting. The road system is already badly congested and the number of houses planned for the area could see up to 3000 more cars on the roads. This would become a nightmare and gridlock. The cemetery at the top of Howden Road is used as a dog walking area. People let their dogs roam loose, would it be possible to put no dog's signs to stop this.
- 912 I am disgusted with the condition of Mitchell Lane which I use every day. Since the last road sweeper left, it is a disgrace. The Snicket is clogged with leaves and the part going down to the Beck is like a patch work quilt, holes all over. In slippery weather you take your life in your hands, walking down. As an elderly person it frightens me to walk down Howden Road is as bad in those conditions.
- 914 Development of regular or annual musical or sport events such as the Sewer Rats weekend or a series of road, cross country meeting events could bring substantial trade into all local retail businesses. Although not greatly concerned by drunkenness in Silsden I would like to see drinking in the street and open places stamped out.
- 918 Regards the history of Silsden and the many and varied groups that there are here in Silsden. It is imperative that we should have a large community centre, if possible we then the Silsden Town Hall should be that building it is in the centre of the village, near a parking place, I do understand that the building would have to be brought up to today's standards. Many here in Silsden would like to have a place that we could use for our local history project along with family history, arts, our local bands and many more. Please do consider this seriously, it is a very subject to many here in Silsden.

- 922 Speed restriction should be applied by regular use of hand held speed guns. The parking on Silsden High Street should remain as it slows down drives in a potentially dangerous area.
- 926 I find it difficult to use the pavements because of cars, vans parked on there and many times I notice that the drive to the house is empty, I have to walk in the road because of this selfish pavement parking. Works vans are often brought home at night and weekends, when there isn't even enough space for their own vehicles, therefore the works vehicles are also parked on the pavement. Parking permits should be issued for any vehicles parked on the road, street etc, at a cost to the owners, obviously houses with no drives i.e. terraces wouldn't be included. Works vehicles should not be allowed unless there is off road parking for them. I understand there is a fixed penalty of £70 for vehicles parked with two wheels or move on pavement, thousands of pounds could be earned as revenue for the council.
- 931 The flashing solar panels that we fought so hard for on Bolton Road hardly ever work. They are placed under trees, why? Come summer no sun can reach them. Coming from Addingham this panel is on the wrong side of the road, the trees are very dense where it is now. It needs to be on the other side further down where there are no treed. You don't need a brain to see they are in the wrong place. Bolton Road speed limit 60 needs to be 40. Cringles Park has tried to get the speed limit changed along Bolton Road this road is a racetrack. We were told this is not possible, but the bypass to Ilkley was down graded to 50, there are no houses along there, so why can't we have the speed limit changed? If are homes went all down Bolton Road all 68 of them, the speed limit by law would be 30 but because we can not be seen we don't exist this can not be right, could someone come to Cringles and try and cross the road 4pm to 6:30 in the dark aged 70 to 95 or the school rum am.
- 934 Silsden has a terrible problem with dog mess. I have two dogs myself but always carry bags and clean up after them. Sadly many owners don't take responsibility for their animals. The problem is always worse in winter, dark nights mean people think if they are not seen it wont matter. If Silsden was to attract tourists dog fouling and litter would have a negative effect. People must be made responsible for the effect they have o the town. Employing litter wardens and street sweepers would help however re-education for children and adults into caring for the environment is a must.
- 935 Two priorities for Silsden litter picking, fight housing plans.
- 936 There is a challenge Kirkgate is busy and the limited parking creates bottle necks but removing the parking affects local traders but the parking is at the narrowest point of the road. Could the parking spaces be moved to a wider point of the road. Could Briggate be pedestrianised except for access/deliveries and parking bays provided at the Kirkgate end? Pedestrian crossing lights to halt traffic? Dog fouling spoils the town it is particularly bad at the bottom of Skipton Road, New Road and Aire Road. Speeding is a problem for Skipton Road. Speed indicators may help, not speed bumps with buses but maybe some other restrictions to encourage people to slow down as entering the town maybe a narrowing of the road. Consideration of the environment report which talks about the effects of shop fronts on Kirkgate and how they detract from the town. More promotion of the canal side as that end of town feel a little bereft. Would a market on a Saturday attract people?

- 937 As previously said, am very concerned by the activities of Asian businesses people in the village. I see primary school children on their way home from school being accosted and taken into pizza delivery shop, spending time in there these are prime candidates for grooming. With drugs being offered over the counter to me a fifty-year-old women, there is no doubt the kids will be targeted. Please do something about it before we lose Silsden altogether.
- We do need a supermarket in Silsden as at the moment we have to go to Keighley to do are supermarket shopping as the Co-op is too dear to go shopping.
- 947 Its not use the park warden riding through on their motor cycles at 10am when mums and toddlers are using the park. They need to revisit after dark when it become a no go area due to drink, drugs and vandalism. The signs are clearly visible next day, beer cans, vodka bottle, syringes, damage and litter.
- 953 More outdoor activities for the youth of Silsden and opportunities to encourage tourism. Jobs for young local people.
- 958 Silsden is a nice place to live. Historically it has a high level of drunkenness (husband ex police officer). Does not appear to have improved. Pubs closing soulless places to drink. Silsden is becoming more cosmopolitan as people from more affluent areas (Ilkley) are moving here because the housing is heaper, worries me because local people may not be able to stay in Silsden as house prices begin to rise. Traffic congestion a problem, Silsden main route to Ilkley, Leeds, Burley etc. parking should be stopped on main street. Small car park opposite church for locals to use when shopping. Free for 30 minute which should ease some congestion particularly at peak times. Encouragement of small businesses should help the place (village) thrive. Small industrial units that are discrete could increase local employment. Some unsightly places need attention on the approach into Silsden from AVTR. Namely the 'slippers for sale' been an eyesore for as long as I can remember. Encourage B&B's for holiday makers. Silsden central to big cities, Leeds and the Dales.
- 960 The high incidence of teenage drinking and antisocial behaviour in Silsden certainly has been reduced in the past two years. Thank you to all concerned.
- 972 It would be nice to have a sign at the ford by the post office to ask that the ducks are fed on the side of the beck away from the main road, as the ducks wander into the road after food and get hit by cars.
- As a resident of Silsden for almost 74 years, I would like the powers that be to think again before relinquishing our lovely small town, to massive development that can hardly be beneficial if it means swallowing up great pieces of green belt land. I have seen this village where one knew almost everybody here and now, been turned into a dormitory town of large proportions to Bradford. Please keep our beloved Silsden from becoming this, thank you.
- 978 Silsden is a wonderful place with many great facilities for all ages. We should be proud of it and look after it. Preserve the positive. Keep the green spaces. Maintain the village feel. Encourage community action groups. Keep traffic slow especially around schools. Fine dog foulers.

- A weekend market once a month would be nice. Litter is not helped by the takeaways open too late. Pubs open too late contribute to noise. The wall by beck needs repair. Mega Moda window still looks a mess plus the pavement outside the row of shops next to and including Mega Moda need repairing. The stream/beck has a workman's cone in it. We had one put on a car outside our hose and we had to remove it to a work site. Dog fouling is still a problem. Permit parking outside our house is nearly impossible to police as people who don't live but work in the area are allowed permits, Elliott Street.
- 982 Keep Silsden small and don't expand any more. Silsden should be treasured as it is.
- I think the dog dirt in Silsden on the footpaths needs sorting out. Its disgusting and its everywhere you go. The parking up Craven Drive doesn't get any better. The Toyota garage takes up a lot of the road and Snugpak and they have somewhere to park over at the mill but a lot of them are on the drive. The traffic wardens don't come to Craven Drive much. So they all park where they want and how they want. Putting yellow lines down Howden Road doesn't solve anything you're just pushing more cars up Craven Drive and moving the problem further up.
- 987 The closure of Barclays Bank last year has been a serious inconvenience. Why relatively small places such as Ingleton, Bentham can justify a branch, whilst the large population of Silsden cannot is a mystery. We need another bank in Silsden. The only real solution to traffic congestion would be a bypass of Kirkgate but where? A competitor to the Co-op might encourage more local shopping. Safe access to station for non-drivers and the less mobile must decrease train use. The loss of police station and relatively low presence of PC's is of concern to o. At present the area on left coming in to Silsden near telephone exchange is an eyesore.
- 988 Duplication of current questionnaires seems wasteful. Suggest open meeting/events as method of gathering opinions. Much untapped potential in Silsden. Town hall should be improved to provide performance space/more accessible facilities. Need to improve presentation to visitors and communicate what activities there are. High quality specialist retail should be encouraged.
- 993 A bridge to the train station would be useful. Would a secondary school in Silsden be viable? A bypass round Silsden would be great.
- 997 I think a regular farmers market would be a great boon to Silsden, and bring in tourists. Or, a farm shop in the village, selling the produce of several local food producers.
- 998 Silsden town council members should take a good walk around their town with their eyes open and take notice of the state of its roads, paths and facilities. Shame on you all. You have been doing the job for many years. The town is in a shocking state.
- 999 It would also be great if cafes would be open on Sundays, there would be safer cycle paths for youngsters, a second supermarket, so we don't have to pay high Co-op prices. Definitely a decent public toilet, a park ranger, more before and after school clubs for working parents at both Aire View and Hothfield, higher penalty for dog fouling, speed cameras on Bolton Road.

- 1001 I would like to see the reservoir area more open to the wider public. This would require a walkway around the reservoir, a linking footpath through the woods down towards the town. I think there is a lot that could be done to make Silsden a more attractive destination for both day tourists and the local people. This would be beneficial in making Silsden an attractive place to live (which would be good for property value). The above would also encourage small industries to locate to the areas. Encourage leisure business in the town e.g. restaurants etc.
- 1006 Silsden is a friendly place. People help each other but it is big enough. We do not want large housing projects, it would spoil the atmosphere.
- 1007 Grave concerns regarding parking at Toyota garage for customers and workers restricting residents getting in and out of their own driveways. Drivers completely ignore double yellow line and white lines. This is causing a lot of anger for residents.
- 1015 Sorry for shaky handwriting.
- 1030 Parking on Skipton Road (both sides) is terrible, bus has a struggle to get through sometimes and Bell Square car park is either empty or full of taxis. Dog fouling is also a problem in Silsden especially Skipton Road, Bradshaw Road, Elliot Street.
- 1038 We are basically very happy with the situation in Silsden.
- 1041 It would be nice if we had a village hall with a stage and dressing rooms. Similar to the one at Embassy.
- 1064 As council gritting is only on Silsden centre roads it would be useful if those of use living on very steep surrounding estates could have a grit bin so that we can have easier access in icy weather. Where are the six new grit bins reportedly placed in Silsden this year? Repeated requests to Bradford Council over the past 15 years have fallen on deaf ears. Many residents here have to leave their cars at the bottom of the hill to be sure of getting out. Not sure what emergency vehicles would do, as the refuse collectors don't attempt it!
- Since living here, we have found Silsden to be an extremely friendly and pleasant place to lice and would not wish to live anywhere else. But when we first came here there was a road sweeper (who kept the pavements clean and free from dog mess (he did a very good job) and the village was much quieter and the traffic (through traffic) is now horrendous. It is a good thing there are pedestrian crossing in Kirkgate which were not here when we first came because we would never be able to cross the road on certain days, and at certain times! We could certainly use a bypass. It would be a shame, in my opinion, if Silsden grew and grew until it was no longer a village. Most people I have talked to, came to live here to escape the crowded streets, masses of buildings and endless traffic and with the treat of endless building we now face exactly what we thought to escape. And we have no desire to be joined to Keighley. Thank goodness for the flood plains, and we hope they never find a way to build on it without the danger of flooding!
- 1067 Re Q2: Music disturbances lat at night, these have, in the past, been traced to the Robin Hood pub, which has been prosecuted after investigations re timing hours and decibels measuring but the management still seem to be persisting in its allowance. Q38 I would like to see more space easily accessible for mobility scooters.
- 1068 Dog fouling happens late at night and early morning.

- 1069 Snugpak should be asked to tidy up their land adjacent to the canal, it is becoming a tip and is not a good advert for slide as you enter along the canal.
- 1070 Silsden should retain its picturesque face so that people come to visit to see the canals, beck and walk along the river. A market could be held to encourage shoppers, like in Otley. There are too many fast food shops. To buy things people have to go to Keighley therefore local shops miss out. The canal could be utilised with a proper path so that walking/cycling is easier for families. The boat yards may then start to offer trips to Bingley or Skipton. Scouts, Guides, local groups could be used to keep the village tidy. There could be planters with flowers etc.
- 1071 Suggestions of building more houses no practical as the town does not provide extra facilities to accommodate the needs of vulnerable groups, elderly/children etc. Day centres, sports centres etc.
- 1079 We hope our voice counts as this was delivered 10/3/12 and closing date states 7/3/12. We need a proper police presence in Silsden who, acting on local knowledge and info given by several members of the public, should act on drug dealing and anti-social behaviour. Sadly our experience was that from the local SCO right up to District Commander police colluded with the drug dealers living in our community. Need a cycle path. Keep green space green. Need more allotments.
- Something should be done about road and causeways on Spencer Avenue and Sackville Street and Co-op area. As most homes (small bungalows) the residents are mainly elderly and not too steady on their feet. Stands to reason the pavements should be in good order. A few accidents have occurred in this area and there will be more to follow if not attended to.
- 1091 Silsden needs to expand to make local shops viable and we need a decent local.
- 1093 Silsden is a very nice place to live not too big but has all the things you need close by. Doctors surgery should be encouraged to offer appointments into the evening or on a Saturday to help those who work full time and long hours.
- 1098 I hope you can follow the reservoir development up. It is ideal for development. Jack Pollard.
- 1099 Please could we have more dog poo bins round Silsden, our village is getting such a mess, more and more people are getting dogs. Thank you. Poo bins on the top of Skipton Road.
- 1101 Take a look over the wall at the main road end of Bolton Road. People who put up bill board should be made responsible fro removing them as soon as they no longer apply and remove them altogether instead of just dumping them, also causing a hazard to sheep, nails etc. It's nothing short of tipping.
- 1102 We should have a decent towpath on the canal.
